

1. GETTING TO KNOW YOUR PHONE

1.1. Handset Overview

18 Related Posts



- In idle mode: Press to access the main menu.
 In sub-menu mode: Press to confirm the selection. During a call: Press to access Intercom/Phonebook/Redial List/Call List.
- 2. * In main menu mode: Press to go to Call Block Setting menu In ringing mode: Press to block incoming call* if Block Set. is set to ON
- 3. In idle mode: Press to access the phonebook. In menu mode: Press to scroll up the menu items. In Phonebook list / Redial list / Call List: Press to scroll up the list. During a call: Press to increase the volume. In ringing: Press to increase the ringer volume.
- 4. ▼ In menu mode: Press to scroll down the menu items. In Phonebook list / Redial list / Call List: Press to scroll down the list. During a call: Press to decrease the volume. In ringing: Press to decrease the ringer volume.
- 5. C During a call: Press to end a call and go back to idle screen. In menu / editing mode: Press to go back to previous menu. In menu / editing mode: Press and hold to go back to idle screen. In editing / predilating mode: Press to clear a character / digit.

In idle mode: Press and hold to access the call list.

9. ALPHANUMERIC KEYPAD

Press to insert a digit / character /* / #

0 key in predilating / number editing mode:

Press and hold to insert a flash 1, 2, 3 key in idle/off hook mode, press and hold to dial the stored direct memory number. 0 key during a call: Press and hold to start conference call (in intercom mode).

10. In idle / predilating mode: Press to make a call. In Redial list / Call List / Phonebook entry: Press to make a call to the selected entry in the list. During ringing: Press to answer a call. During a call: Press to switch to speaker mode.


11. HANDSET LED

During charging: On steadily. In ringing mode / Paging mode: Flashing quickly. When new voice mail: Flash slowly

12. AUDIO BOOST

During a call: Press to audio boost on/off(inactive in speakerphone mode).

1.2. Base Station Overview



- 1. Press the Page on the base station to page your handset. It will ring for approximately 60 seconds. Press and hold on the base station for about five seconds, the base station will enter into registration mode and is ready for handset registration.
- 2. VOLUME UP Increase (+) speaker volume during message playback.
- 3. 7-SEG LED DISPLAY

- 0F-> -- When answering machine is OFF
- -- When answering machine is OFF and no new TAM messages received
- On->XX When answering machine is ON where XX is number of messages in TAM memory
- 00 Steadily ON: No voice messages in TAM
- XX Flash: There are XX new voice messages received where XX is from 01 to 59
- ZZ Steadily ON: There are ZZ old voice messages kept in the TAM memory (no new voice messages)
- XX/FF Flash XX alternatively with FF: There are XX new voice messages received where XX is from 01 to 59 and the TAM memory is full
- FF Flash FF: TAM memory is full and there are no new messages, only old messages are kept in TAM memory
- -/XX Flash XX alternatively with -: Time is not set and there are XX new voice messages received where XX is from 01 to 59
- - Flash -: Time is not set and there are old voice messages kept in the TAM memory only (no new voice messages)
- XX Steadily ON: Playing the current XX incoming old message
- A1/A2 Steadily ON: Playing the current outgoing message (OGM) where A1 is the Answer & Record OGM and A2 is the Answer Only OGM
- XX/An Flash XX alternatively with An: XX new incoming message is now recording. An denotes that the incoming message recording is in progress
- rA Flash: Remote access is in progress
- LX Steadily ON: Indicate the current volume level where X is from 1 to 8 (non-cyclic)
- CA Steadily ON: when the base unit is in conversation mode

4. TAM ON/OFF ()

Press to turn on the answering machine.

Press again to turn off the answering machine.

5. PLAY/STOP ▶■

Press to play the message.

Press again to stop the message playback.

6. SKIP FORWARD ▶

Press to skip the current message and play the next message.

7. DELETE

Press once to delete the message during playback.

Press and hold to delete all the messages.

Note: New voice messages will not be deleted.

SKIP BACKWARD ◀

Press to repeat playing the current message from the beginning.

Press twice to skip backward to the previous message.

VOLUME DOWN ▼

Decrease (+) speaker volume during message playback.

10. IN USE LED-BLUE 🥋

Steadily on while the handset is in use, or base is in conversation mode. Flashes when receiving an incoming call, or handset is off cradle during registration.

11. M1, M2, M3

In idle mode: Press M1, or M2, or M3 key to dial out the stored number.

12. TALK KEY

During ringing: Press to answer a call.

1.3. Display Icons and Symbols





Steadily on when the handset is in range of the base.

Flashes when out of range of the base or not registered to the base.

Steadily on indicates a call is in progress. Flashes when there is an incoming call.

Indicates that handsfree is being used.

Indicate when the telephone answering machine (TAM) is turned on. Flash when new TAM messages are received. Steadily on when an alarm is set. Flashes when the alarm time set before reaches. Indicates when there are received new Voice Message Waiting (VMWI) not yet read. Indicates that the ringer is switched off. Indicates when the battery is fully charged. Whole icon flashes when the battery performs initial charging. Internal block icon flashes when the battery is in final charging stage. Flashes when low battery power level is detected. On indicates it's a new call which has not been read in call log and * will be shown in the end of call number or name. After read, * will disappear. Flashes when the call list is being accessed. On indicates audio boost is on (earpiece of handset will be louder). Flashes when phonebook is being accessed.

Hearing Aid Compatibility:

 Special feature which helps to eliminate background noise and interference when you use this telephone with a hearing aid.

2. PRECAUTIONS

The signal quality will depend on the location and environment of the base and handset.

Flashes when redial list is being accessed.

Position your Big Tel 1580 / 1582 / 1583 away from sources of excessive heat (radiators, direct sunlight, etc.) and protect it from vibrations and dust. Never allow your telephone to come into contact with water or other liquids, or with aerosols. To reduce the risk of interference and optimize reception, take particular care not to install the base in the immediate vicinity of windows, large metal objects, reinforced concrete, televisions, music centres, halogen lamps or heating devices, fluorescent lighting, burglar alarms, microwave ovens, computers, etc.


This telephone requires an electrical power supply in order to function. To clean your Big Tel 1580 / 1582 / 1583 use an antistatic cloth lightly moistened with water.

3. INSTALLING YOUR PHONE

3.1. Connecting the Base Station

- 1. Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the telephone jack on base bottom.
- 2. Plug the small end of power adapter into a power jack on base bottom.
- 3. Plug the large end of power adapter into a wall power outlet.
- 4. Plug the other end of the telephone line cord in to the telephone jack or micro-filter.

5. Always use the cables provided in the box.




If you have broadband service, a micro-filter(not included) is required.

3.2. Installing and Charging the Batteries

- 1. Slide down to open the battery compartment cover.
- 2. Place the 2 batteries as indicated. Pay extra attention to direction of Respect polarity.
- 3. Slide the battery compartment cover back.
- 4. Put the handset on the base and charge for 8 hours before using the handset for the first time. The handset will give a beep when it is properly placed on the base or charger.

Notes:


- 1. Use only NiMH rechargeable batteries.
- 2. If the handset will not be used for a long time, disconnect and remove the batteries to prevent possible leakage.



3.3. Connecting the Charger(s) (for Duo/Trio models)

Plug the power adapter into a 230Vac, 50Hz mains socket.

After first time power up (base unit is connected to AC mains), welcome mode (country) will appear on the screen:



Note: For Duo or Trio versions, all you have to do is configure a single handset, the other handset (s) will be automatically set identically.

Change language (Handset)

- 1. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ on the handset in idle mode.
- 2. Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ or \triangledown to select "HS Settings"(1), then press $\stackrel{\square K}{\bowtie}$.




3. Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ or \triangledown to the menu "Language"(2), then press $\stackrel{OK}{\bowtie}$.

4. USING YOUR PHONE

4.1. Make a Call

4.1.1. Preparatory Dialing

Enter the phone number and press to dial the number. Press to clear the entry.

4.1.2. Direct Dialing

Press of to take the line and enter the phone number.

4.1.3. Dial from Direct Memory Keys

In idle or off hook mode, Press M1, M2 or M3 to dial the stored number.

Press and hold to dial the direct memory number. You have to store number to the related key first. See section 8.3 for reference.

4.1.4. Call from the Redial List

Press and * hold to access the redial list and press

✓ to select the desired redial number.

Press to dial out to the selected redial number.

4.1.5. Adjust Earpiece and Handsfree Volume

There are 5 levels (Volume 1 to Volume 5) to choose from for each of earpiece and handsfree volume.

During a call: Press

✓ to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level. The current volume is displayed on the screen. When you end the call, the new volume setting sound remains valid for subsequent calls.

For the sound level of the handset, if this is not loud enough, press, the audio boost will be activated (+15dB). To turn off audio boost, press again the key.

5. PRIVATE PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 100 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 24 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

5.1. Add a New Phonebook Entry

In idle:

- 2. Press MENU to select **Add New**.
- 3. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ to enter the name.
- 4. Press MENU to enter the number.
- 5. Press $\frac{\text{OK}}{\text{MENU}}$ and $\frac{\Delta}{\text{DI}}$ / ∇ to select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.
- 6. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ to confirm the melody.
- 7. Press $^{\triangle}_{\square}$ / \triangledown to select VIP X or VIP \checkmark .
- 8. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ to confirm to save it as normal contact list (VIP X) or save it in VIP list (VIP $\sqrt{\ }$).

Note: ! appears in the end of name of VIP entry.

5.2. Call from the Phonebook

In idle:

In idle:

- Press to access the phonebook. OR
 Press MENU and ↑ / ▼ to select **Phonebook** main menu item and then press MENU to access the phonebook.
- 2. Press (to dial out to the selected phonebook entry. Phonebook is stored in base unit which is shared with duo, trio handsets.

6. CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)*

This feature* is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with your telephone service provider. Your phone can store up to 50 received calls with date/time information in the Call List. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, "Withheld" will display. If the caller number is not provided, "Out of Area" will display. In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, "3 New Calls" will be displayed.

6.1. View the Call List

All received calls are saved in Call List with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with ...

- Press and hold # key. OR
 Press MENU and ♠ / ▼ to select Call list, press .
- Press [♠] / ▼ to select the desired entry.

6.2. Call from the Call List

In idle:

- Press and hold # key. OR
 Press and A / ▼ to select Call list, press OK MENU.
- 2. Press (to dial out to the selected phonebook entry.

7. REDIAL THE LAST NUMBER

You can redial up to 10 of the last numbers called. In idle mode, press and hold ★ key to access the redial list.

- Press ♠ / ▼ to browse the redial list.
- Press to dial the selected redial number.

8. PHONE SETTING

8.1. Set the Ringer Melody for Internal/External Calls

- Press OK and A / ▼ to select HS Settings.
- 2. Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{DK}}$ and $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ / \checkmark to select **Ring Setup**.
- 3. Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ and $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ / ∇ to select **Int Ring** or **Ext Ring**.
- 4. Press $\frac{\text{OK}}{\text{MENU}}$ and $\frac{\Delta}{\text{DI}}$ / ∇ to select the desired ringer melody from the melody list.

Note: The respective ringer melody will be played while browsing the melody list.

Press OK to confirm.

8.2. Set the Ringer Volume

- Press $\stackrel{\text{OK}}{\underset{\text{MENU}}{\text{MENU}}}$ and $\stackrel{\triangle}{\underset{\text{MENU}}{\text{MENU}}}$ / \forall to select **HS Settings**. 1.
- Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ and $_{\text{CI}}^{\text{A}}$ / ∇ to select **Ring Setup**. 2.
- Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ and $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ / \triangledown to select **Ring Volume**. 3.
- Press $^{\square K}_{MENU}$ and $^{\bigstar}$ / \blacktriangledown to select the desired ringer volume (a total of 6 4. ringer volume levels including OFF).

Note: The respective ringer volume will be played during your selection.

If OFF is selected, icon will display.

Press OK to confirm. 5.

8.3. Set the Speed Dial

- 1.
- Press $^{OK}_{MENU}$ and $^{A}_{D}$ or \forall to select **Direct Mem**. Press , and then press the memory key M1 / M2 / M3 / \sim 1 / $^{\circ}_{2}$ 2 / $^{\circ}_{3}$ 3 . 2.

For M1/M2/M3:

- Press DK to input name.
- Press MENU to enter number. 2.
- Press MENU to browse the melody list, and then press to confirm the melody, 3.
- Press $\stackrel{\triangle}{\square}$ or ∇ to select **VIP X** or **VIP** $\sqrt{}$.
- Press $_{MENU}^{\square K}$ to confirm to save it as normal contact list (VIP X) or save it in VIP list (VIP $\sqrt{\ }$).

For -1/2/3:

Press $_{MENU}^{OK}$ to input number, and then press to confirm. 1.

8.4. Set handset Settings

- 1. In standby mode, press the menu key.
- 2. Select HS Settings and press.
- Display: Select Contrast and set the desired contrast or
- select Rename HS and change the name for the handset if necessary.
- Date & Time: Select Date & Time and set Date Format, Time Format and Set Time/Date.
- Tone Setup: Select Tone Setup and set on or off in Key Tone, Battery Tone or Out of Range.
- Language: Select the setting for the on-screen language.
- Automatic answer: If this function is activated, an incoming call is accepted directly when removing the handset from the base station, you do not need to press any button.
- Reset phone: Select Default, you can reset the system to its factory default state. Enter the PIN (default "0000") and confirm the security question with.
- Equalizer: This function allows you to modify the sound quality of the handset. During the call, press the menu key
- · Select Normal, Bass or Treble and press to save the setting.

8.5. Set Base

- 1. In standby mode, press the menu key .
- 2. Select BS Settings and press.
- Dial mode: Select Tone or Pulse. The normal dialing procedure for analog connections is "Tone" (tone dialing).
 When operating with certain older telephone systems the dialing procedure should be changed to "Pulse" (decadic pulse dialing).
- Delete HS: Enter the PIN of the base station and select the handset you want to delete. Confirm the security question with .
- Flash duration: Choose 100 ms, 270 ms or 600 ms. In order to use the network performance characteristics, a certain flash signal with a certain length is required.
- Change PIN: Select Change PIN?, and enter Old PIN, press, and then enter New PIN, press to confirm.
- · Eco Mode: Select On or Off and press .

9. ANSWERING MACHINE

Your phone includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The LED message counter (two digits seven segment display) on the base will show the number of the messages when the answering machine is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 30 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone. If the answering machine memory is full, the Handset will display Memory Full and the handset name alternatively in standby, or display Memory Full and the date/time information in standby.

9.1. Turn On/Off the Answering Machine

You can turn on or off the answering machine through the base or handset. When the answering machine is set to On, calls will be answered after the set answer delay and the caller can then leave you a message. When the answering machine is set to Off, calls will be answered after 12 rings and the answer only message will be played to your callers. They will not be able to leave you a message. Through the Base:

- 1. Press \bullet on the base station.
- If answering machine is set to On, is displays on the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display the number of incoming messages.
- If answering machine is set to Off, will disappear from the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display - -.

Through the Handset:

- 1. Press $\stackrel{OK}{\underset{MENU}{MENU}}$ and $\stackrel{\triangle}{\underset{M}{\square}}$ / \blacktriangledown to select **Ans. Machine**.
- 2. Press $\stackrel{\text{OK}}{\underset{\text{MENU}}{\text{MENU}}}$ and $\stackrel{\triangle}{\underset{\text{MENU}}{\text{MENU}}}$ / \blacktriangledown to select **Tam On/Off**.
- 3. Press $\stackrel{\text{OK}}{\text{\tiny{MENU}}}$ and $\stackrel{\triangle}{\text{\tiny{MI}}}$ / \blacktriangledown to select **On** or **Off**.
- 4. Press MENU to confirm.
- If answering machine is set to On, is displays on the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display the number of incoming messages.
- If answering machine is set to **Off**, will disappear from the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display -.

9.2. Listen to the Messages in the Answering Machine

When new messages are recorded on the answering machine, flashes on the handset display and the message counter on base flashes with the number of new messages in the answering machine until all the new messages are played. Old messages will be played after all new messages are played completely.

Listen new messages through the Base:

- 1. Press ▶■ on the base station.
- 2. The new messages are played from the loudspeaker on the base station in the sequence they are recorded.
- 3. Press or v on the base station to increase or decrease the volume during message playback respectively.

Note: If there are no new messages, "00" will display steadily in the message counter on the base. Press ▶■ will have no effect and an alert tone is emitted.

Listen new messages through the Handset:

- 3. Press OK to start message playback and the screen displays the date and time information of the message received.

For 1580 / 1582 / 1583, listen messages through the handset earpiece. For 1580 / 1582 / 1583, listen messages through the handset speaker by default or earpiece by pressing of to toggle between handset speakerphone and earpiece for listening the messages.

Note: *\forall is placed at the centre of the bottom of the LCD to indicate that it is a new message.

If this message has been read or listened, the * will disappear and will be reflected next time when you listen to this message again.

Note: If there are no new & old messages, "00" will display steadily in the message counter on the base.

Press $_{\text{MENU}}^{\text{OK}}$ to display "00--00 00--00" and return back to **Ans. Machine** menu.

 During message playback, press ♠ or ▼ to increase or decrease the message playback volume respectively.

Note: After new message is played, the new message will be saved as an old message automatically unless it is deleted.

Press ^{OK}_{MENU} to select **Stop**, **Forward**, **Previous**, **Delete** to perform the following functions during message playback.

Stop: Stop the current message playback and return to the Ans. Machine menu.

Forward: Skip to play the next message. The date and time information of the next message ill display if there is next message.

Previous: Skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. The date and time information of the current message will display.

Delete: Delete the current message and the next message will be played.

Note: Alternatively, you can use the following shortcut keys to control different operation during message playback.

Press 5 to stop message playback.

Press 4 to skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning.

Press 4 to twice to skip backward to the previous message.

Press 6 to skip to play next message.

Press 2 to delete the current message playback.

6. Press MENU to confirm.

9.3. Delete All Messages in the Answering Machine Delete all messages through the Base:

In idle:

- 1. Press and hold on the base station.
- 2. All the old messages will be deleted.

Note: New messages will not be deleted. If there are no more messages in the answering machine, "00" will display on the base station.

Delete all messages through the Handset:

- 2. Press and □/▼ to select Delete All.
- 3. Press to confirm.
- 4. Press to delete all old messages.

Note: If there are no more messages in the answering machine, Empty will display and return back to Ans. Machine menu.

9.4. Record Memo

You can record your memo message for another user. When you record a memo, the message counter will increase by one and the message can be played back in the same way as answering machine messages. Memo recording can still function even when the answering machine is turned off.

- Press ok/menu and to select Ans. Machine.
- 3. Press ok/menu to start memo recording and Recording is displayed.
- Press to stop memo recording and save the memo.
- 5. Press to stop memo recording without saving and return back to Ans. Machine menu.

9.5. Answering Machine Settings

You can use the Tam Settings menu through the handset to change the settings of your answering machine.

- 5. Press OK to confirm.

You can record your own OGM for **Ans & Rec** mode or **Answer Only** mode. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalized OGM is deleted, the pre-set OGM will be restored automatically.




