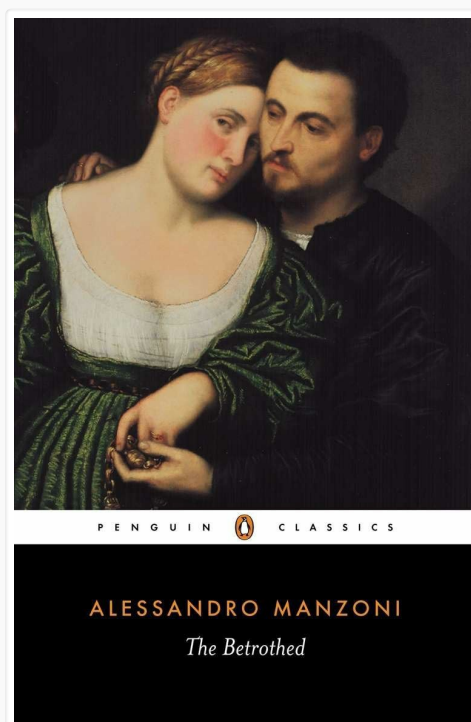


Image: Cover of the Penguin Classics edition of *The Betrothed*. The cover features a classical painting of a man and a woman, with the title and author's name below.
