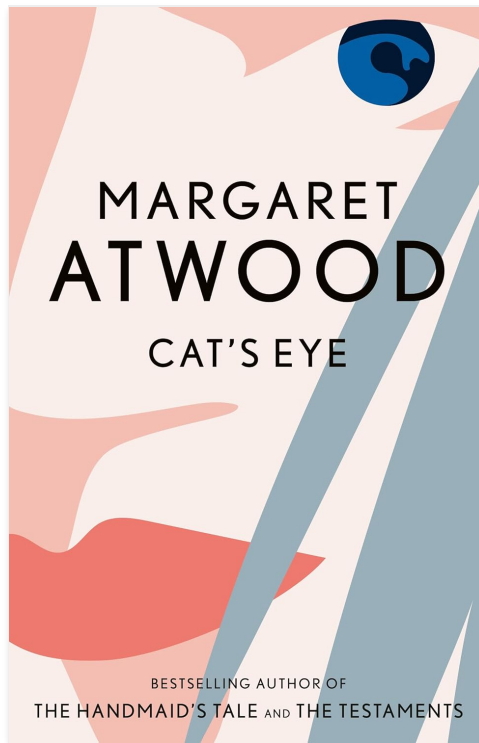


Image 2.1: Front cover of the Cat's Eye paperback edition.



