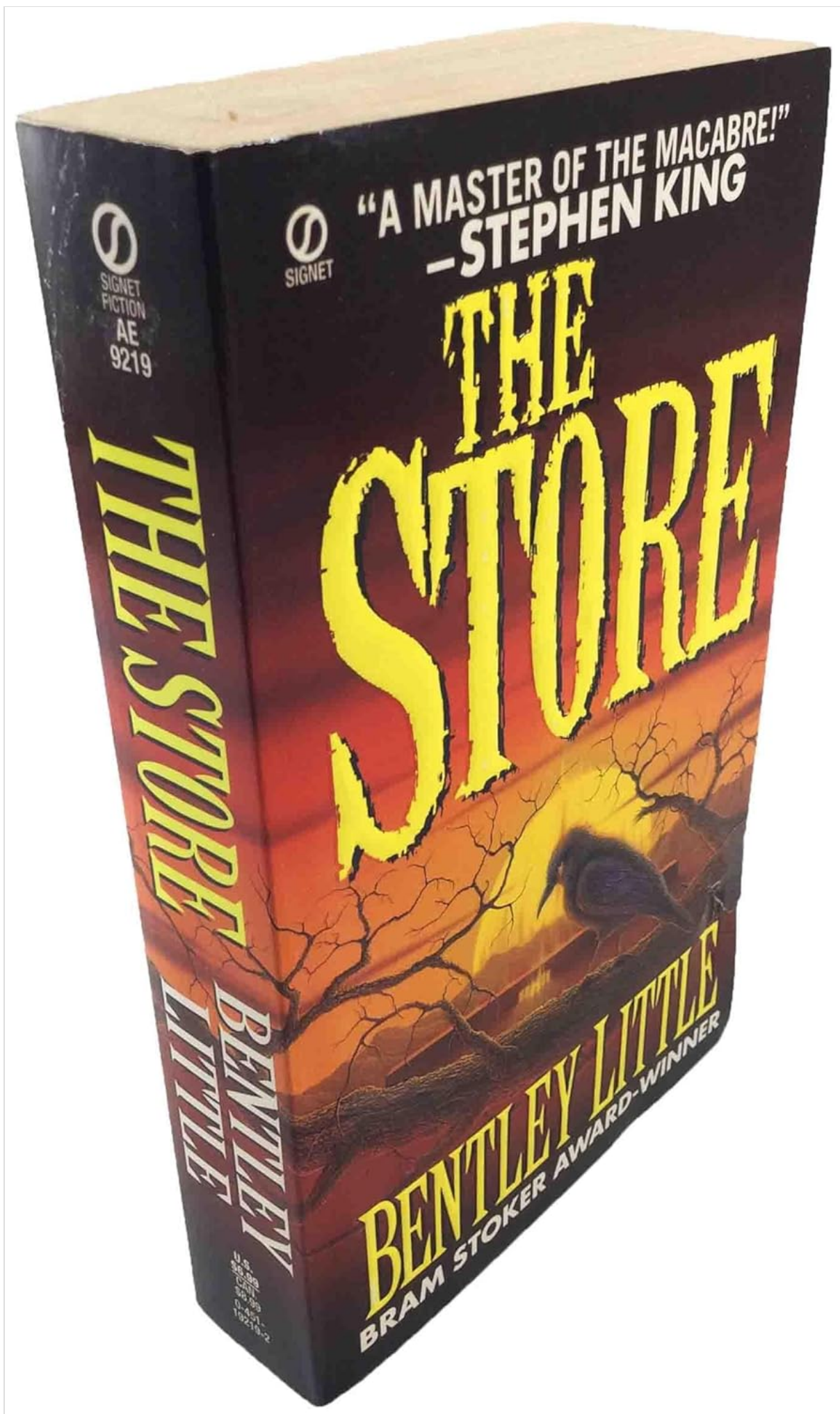


Figure 3: Alternate angled view of the book, providing a different perspective of the cover.
