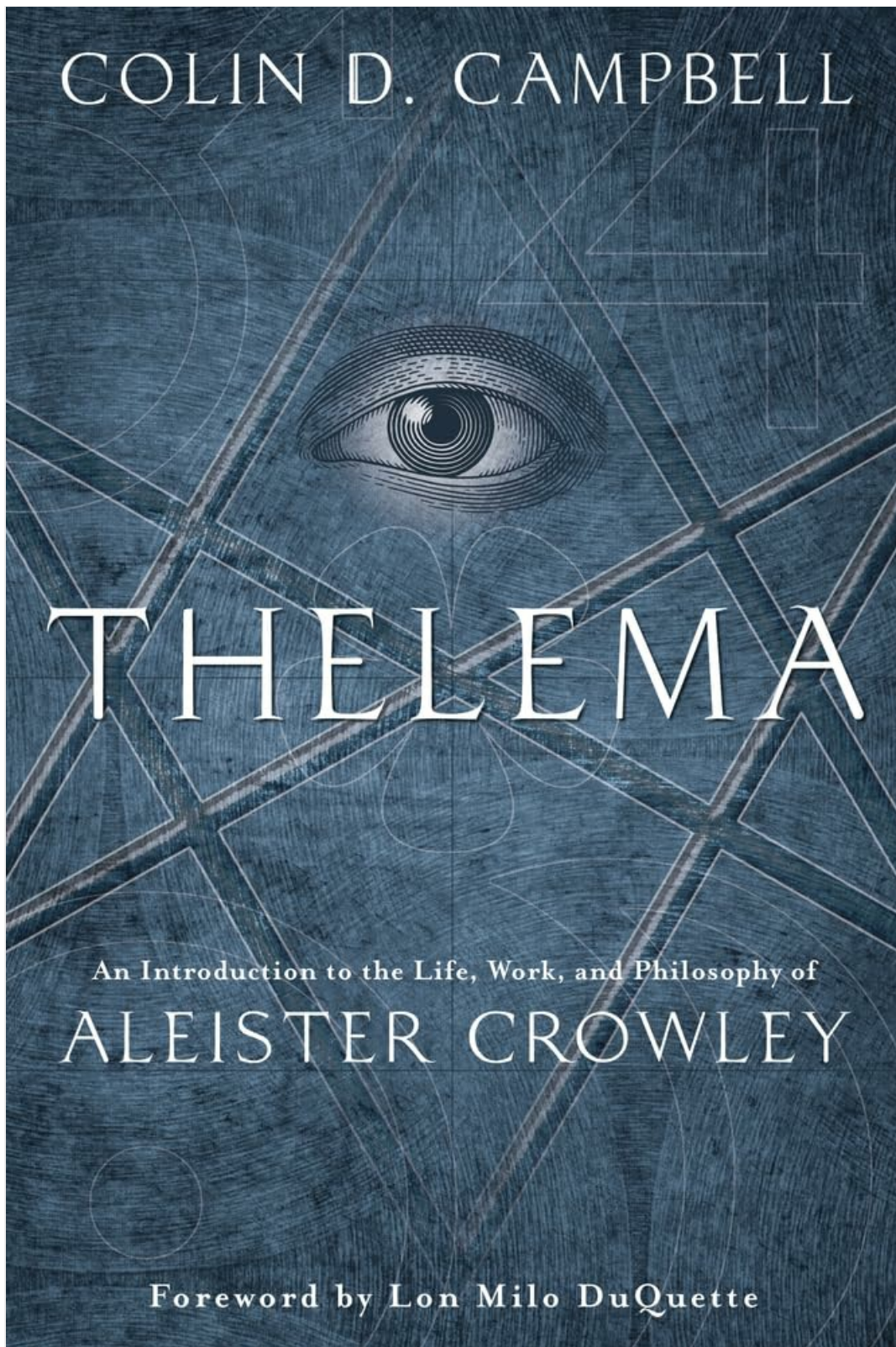


Image 1.1: The cover of the book, featuring the title "Thelema" and the author's name, Colin D. Campbell, against a mystical background with an eye symbol.
