INTRODUCTION

SETUP AND INSTALLATION

Replacing the door seal requires careful attention. Follow these steps for proper installation:

1. Preparation:

- Unplug the washing machine from the power outlet.

- Reconnect the power and water supply. Run a short rinse cycle without laundry to check for leaks.

OPERATING CONSIDERATIONS

While the door seal itself does not have operational controls, its proper function is vital for the washing machine's operation. Ensure the following:

- Do not overload the washing machine, as this can put undue stress on the door seal.
- Ensure no foreign objects (e.g., coins, small clothing items) are caught between the door and the seal before starting a cycle.
- Always close the door firmly until it latches securely.

MAINTENANCE

Regular maintenance of the door seal can extend its lifespan and prevent issues:

- **After Each Wash:** Wipe down the inside of the door seal with a clean cloth to remove any moisture, lint, or detergent residue. This helps prevent mold and mildew growth.
- **Monthly Cleaning:** For a deeper clean, use a mixture of white vinegar and water (1:1 ratio) or a mild bleach solution to wipe the seal. Pay attention to the folds and crevices where residue can accumulate.
- **Air Drying:** Leave the washing machine door ajar after use to allow the drum and seal to air dry, preventing moisture buildup.
- **Inspection:** Periodically inspect the seal for any signs of wear, cracks, tears, or excessive mold. Early detection can prevent leaks and further damage.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Common issues related to the washing machine door seal and their solutions:

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Water Leakage from Door	Damaged or worn seal; improper installation; foreign object caught in seal.	Inspect seal for damage; ensure proper installation (refer to Setup section); remove any obstructions. Replace seal if damaged.
Mold or Mildew on Seal	Moisture buildup; lack of ventilation.	Clean seal regularly (refer to Maintenance section); leave door ajar after use.
Unpleasant Odor from Machine	Mold/mildew in seal or drum; detergent residue.	Clean seal thoroughly; run a hot wash cycle with a washing machine cleaner or vinegar.

If troubleshooting steps do not resolve the issue, it may indicate a need for professional service or replacement of the component.
