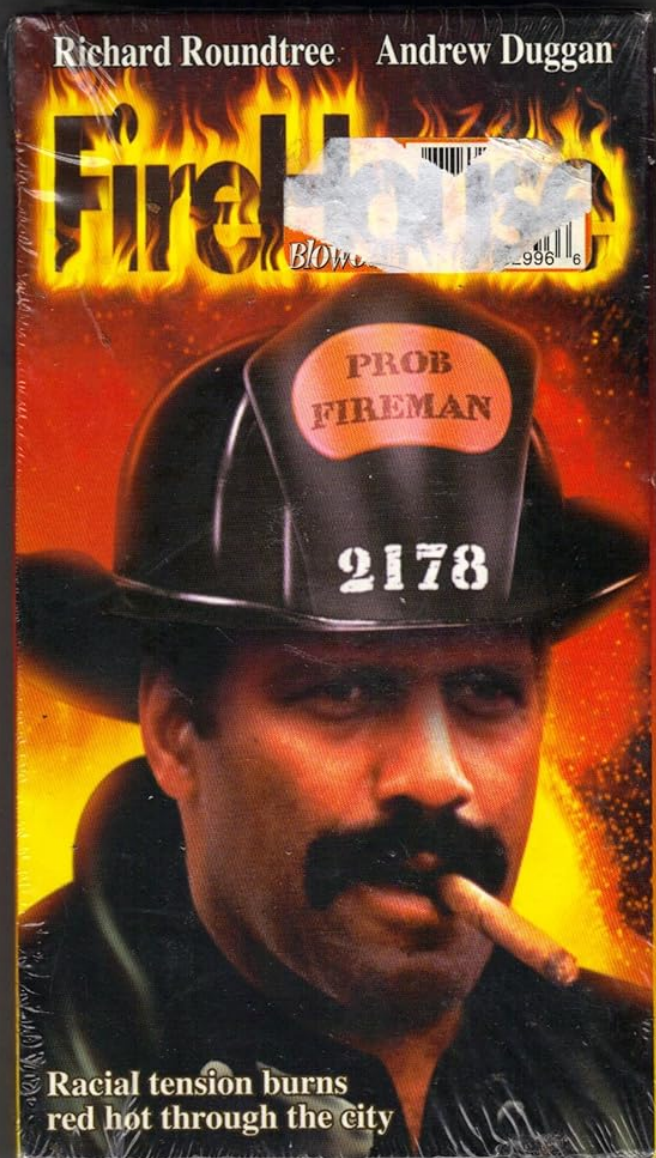


Figure 1: Front cover of the Firehouse VHS tape. This image displays the primary artwork and title of the film.

- **Cleaning:** If playback issues arise due to dirt, consider using a specialized VHS head cleaner tape. Do not attempt to manually clean the tape or player heads without proper knowledge.
- **Avoid Magnetic Fields:** Keep the tape away from strong magnetic fields, which can damage the recorded content.

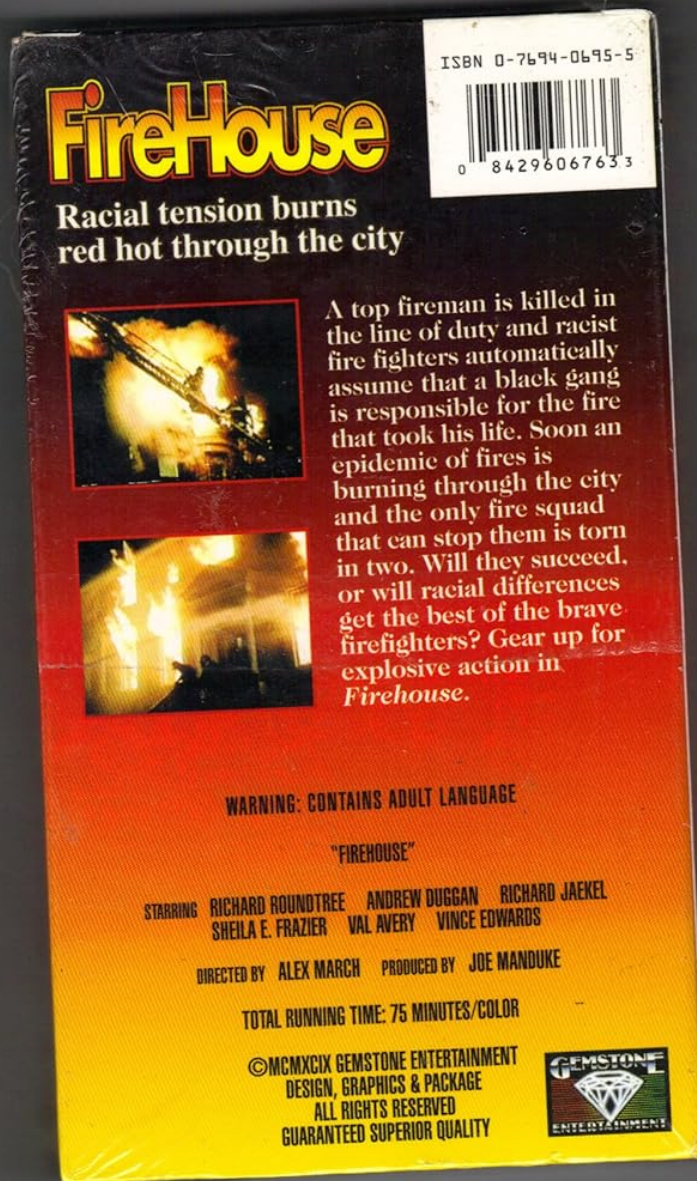


Figure 2: Back cover of the Firehouse VHS tape. This image provides a summary of the film's plot and production credits.

4. TROUBLESHOOTING COMMON ISSUES

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
No picture or sound	Incorrect TV input, loose cables, tape not inserted correctly.	Verify TV input, check all cable connections, re-insert tape.
Fuzzy or distorted picture	Dirty VHS player heads, damaged tape, tracking issues.	Use a VHS head cleaner tape. Adjust tracking on your VHS player. Inspect tape for visible damage.
Tape gets stuck or chewed	Damaged tape, faulty VHS player mechanism.	Do not force the tape. If the player is chewing tapes, it may require professional repair.
No audio, but picture is present	Audio cables disconnected, TV volume muted, tape audio track damage.	Check audio cable connections. Ensure TV volume is up and not muted.
