



# 1997 GMC Safari Owner's Manual

## GETTING STARTED

## OPERATING YOUR VEHICLE

### Starting the Engine

1. Ensure the parking brake is engaged.
2. Place the transmission in PARK (P) or NEUTRAL (N).
3. Insert the key into the ignition and turn it to the START position. Release the key once the engine starts.
4. Allow the engine to idle briefly before driving, especially in cold weather.

### Driving Procedures

- **Automatic Transmission:** Shift into DRIVE (D) for normal forward motion. Use LOW (L) or 2 for increased engine braking or specific driving conditions.
- **Braking:** Apply steady pressure to the brake pedal to slow down or stop. Avoid sudden braking unless necessary.
- **Steering:** Maintain a firm grip on the steering wheel.
- **Fueling:** Always turn off the engine before refueling. Refer to the fuel cap for recommended fuel type.

## MAINTENANCE

Regular maintenance is crucial for the longevity and performance of your GMC Safari.

### Scheduled Maintenance

Refer to the maintenance schedule provided in the full owner's manual for specific intervals for inspections and replacements. Key items include:

- **Oil and Filter Change:** Typically every 3,000-5,000 miles or as recommended.
- **Tire Rotation:** Every 5,000-7,500 miles to ensure even wear.
- **Fluid Checks:** Regularly inspect engine oil, coolant, brake fluid, power steering fluid, and

transmission fluid levels.

- **Air Filter Replacement:** As needed, based on driving conditions.

## Tire Care

- **Tire Pressure:** Check tire pressure monthly, including the spare, when tires are cold. Refer to the placard on the driver's side door jamb for correct pressures.
- **Tread Depth:** Inspect tire tread for wear indicators. Replace tires when tread depth is insufficient.

## Battery Maintenance

Ensure battery terminals are clean and tight. If the battery requires replacement, use a battery with equivalent specifications.

## TROUBLESHOOTING

This section provides guidance for common issues you might encounter.

### Engine Will Not Start

- **Battery:** Check for a dead or weak battery. Look for corrosion on terminals.
- **Fuel:** Ensure there is sufficient fuel in the tank.
- **Ignition:** Confirm the ignition key is fully turned to the START position.
- **Transmission:** Verify the transmission is in PARK (P) or NEUTRAL (N).

### Warning Lights Illuminated

If a warning light illuminates on your dashboard, consult the full owner's manual immediately for specific instructions. Common lights include:

- **Check Engine Light:** Indicates an issue with the engine or emissions system.
- **Oil Pressure Light:** Indicates low engine oil pressure. Stop the vehicle safely and check oil level.
- **Battery Light:** Indicates a problem with the charging system.

### Flat Tire

Refer to the full manual for detailed instructions on how to safely change a flat tire using the spare tire and tools provided with your vehicle.
