## INTRODUCTION

## OPERATING AND DISPLAY

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Once assembled, your miniature candy shop is ready for display. This kit is primarily a static display model. Some kits may include small LED lights or movable parts. If your kit includes lighting, ensure batteries are correctly installed according to the specific instructions provided with the lighting components (batteries typically not included).

- Place the assembled model on a stable, flat surface away from direct sunlight and excessive humidity.
- Avoid placing heavy objects on top of the model.
- If equipped with lights, switch them on to illuminate the interior details.

## MAINTENANCE

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To ensure the longevity and appearance of your miniature dollhouse, follow these maintenance guidelines:

- **Dusting:** Regularly dust the model using a soft, dry brush or a can of compressed air. Avoid using wet cloths, which can damage paper or wooden components.
- **Cleaning:** For stubborn dirt, gently wipe with a slightly damp cloth, then immediately dry with a soft, lint-free cloth. Do not use harsh chemicals or abrasive cleaners.
- **Storage:** If storing the model, place it in a sturdy box to protect it from dust and physical damage. Keep it in a cool, dry place.
- **Repairs:** Small detached parts can usually be re-glued with appropriate craft adhesive.

## TROUBLESHOOTING

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Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Parts do not fit together	Incorrect orientation; excess material; warped piece.	Double-check instructions for correct orientation. Gently sand or trim excess material. If warped, try to gently bend back into shape or apply pressure while gluing.
Glue not holding	Insufficient glue; incorrect glue type; not enough drying time.	Apply a sufficient amount of appropriate wood or craft glue. Ensure surfaces are clean. Allow adequate drying time, possibly using clamps or tape to hold pieces in place.
Lights not working (if applicable)	Incorrect battery installation; dead batteries; loose connection.	Verify battery polarity and ensure fresh batteries are used. Check all wiring connections for tightness.
Paper elements peeling	Insufficient adhesive; environmental factors (humidity).	Reapply a thin layer of craft glue to the edges and press firmly. Store the model in a stable environment.
