INTRODUCTION

This manual provides essential information for setting up, operating, maintaining, and troubleshooting your Xbox 360 4GB Console. Please read this guide thoroughly to ensure proper use and longevity of your device.

1. SETUP GUIDE

Follow these steps to set up your Xbox 360 4GB Console for the first time.

1.1 Unpacking the Console

1. Carefully open the packaging.
2. Remove the console and all accessories.
3. Ensure all components are present: Xbox 360 4GB Console, wireless controller, power supply, and AV cable.

1.2 Connecting the Console

1. **Power Connection:** Connect the power supply to the console's power port, then plug the power cord into an electrical outlet.
2. **Video/Audio Connection:** Connect the AV cable from the console to your television or display. Ensure the correct input source is selected on your display.
3. **Controller Setup:** Insert batteries into the wireless controller. Press and hold the Xbox Guide button on the controller until it turns on. Press the sync button on the console and then on the controller to establish a connection.

1.3 Initial Power On

Press the power button on the front of the console. The console will boot up, and you will be guided through the initial setup process on your screen, including language selection and network configuration.

2. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Turning On/Off

- **To Turn On:** Press the power button on the console or the Xbox Guide button on a connected controller.
- **To Turn Off:** Press and hold the Xbox Guide button on the controller, then select "Turn Off Console" from the menu. Alternatively, press the power button on the console.

2.2 Connecting to Wi-Fi

The Xbox 360 4GB Console features built-in Wi-Fi (N band) for wireless internet connectivity.

1. From the Xbox Dashboard, navigate to **Settings > System Settings**.
2. Select **Network Settings**.
3. Choose your wireless network from the list and enter the password if prompted.
4. The console will test the connection.

2.3 Using the Controller

The wireless controller allows you to navigate the dashboard and play games.

- **Xbox Guide Button:** Access the Xbox Guide, turn the console on/off, or return to the dashboard.
- **Directional Pad (D-Pad):** Navigate menus.
- **Analog Sticks:** Control movement and camera in games.
- **A, B, X, Y Buttons:** Perform actions in games and navigate menus.
- **Left/Right Bumpers and Triggers:** Perform specific actions in games.

3. MAINTENANCE

3.1 Cleaning the Console

- Ensure the console is powered off and unplugged before cleaning.
- Use a soft, dry cloth to wipe down the exterior of the console.
- Avoid using liquid cleaners or abrasive materials, as these can damage the finish.
- Keep vents clear of dust and obstructions to ensure proper airflow.

3.2 Storage

Store the console in a cool, dry place away from direct sunlight and extreme temperatures. Ensure adequate ventilation around the console during operation.

4. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues with your Xbox 360 4GB Console, refer to the following common solutions.

4.1 Console Not Powering On

- Verify that the power supply is securely connected to both the console and a working electrical outlet.
- Check if the power outlet is functional by plugging in another device.
- Ensure the power supply unit's indicator light is on.

4.2 No Video or Audio Output

- Confirm that the AV cable is correctly connected to both the console and your television.
- Ensure your television is set to the correct input source (e.g., HDMI 1, AV).
- Try a different AV cable or display if available.

4.3 Controller Not Connecting

- Ensure the controller has fresh batteries.
- Press and hold the Xbox Guide button on the controller to turn it on.
- Press the sync button on the console (small button near the memory unit slots) and then the sync button on the controller (small button near the battery compartment) to re-establish connection.

4.4 Network Connection Issues

- Restart your wireless router and modem.
- Verify your Wi-Fi password is correct in the console's network settings.
- Ensure the console is within range of your wireless router.
- If issues persist, try connecting the console directly to your router with an Ethernet cable to rule out wireless interference.

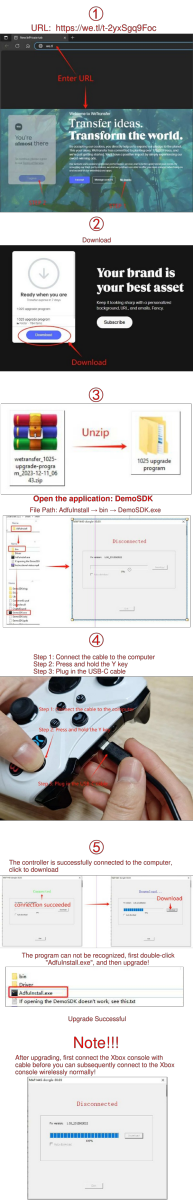
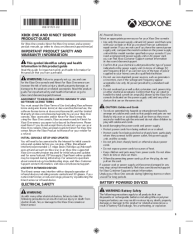
