INTRODUCTION

The Logitech M570 Wireless Trackball Mouse offers an ergonomic design with a sculpted right-hand shape, providing comfortable control for extended periods. This trackball mouse eliminates the need to move your arm to control the cursor, as control is placed conveniently under your thumb. It is compatible with both Apple Mac and Microsoft systems, utilizing a USB Unifying Receiver for seamless wireless connectivity.

SETUP

1. Install Battery

The Logitech M570 requires one AA battery. The battery compartment is located on the underside of the mouse. Open the compartment, insert the AA battery, and close the cover. The mouse is designed for long battery life, up to 18 months, with a convenient battery indicator to alert you when replacement is needed.

2. Connect USB Unifying Receiver

Locate the tiny Logitech Unifying Receiver. This receiver is designed to stay in your laptop's USB port. Plug the receiver into an available USB port on your computer. The mouse should automatically connect. If not, ensure the mouse's power switch (located on the underside) is in the "ON" position.

3. Compatibility

The Logitech M570 is compatible with a wide range of operating systems, including Apple Mac and Microsoft Windows. No additional drivers are typically required for basic functionality, but Logitech's software can be downloaded for advanced customization of buttons.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

1. Trackball Control

Unlike traditional mice, the M570's cursor movement is controlled by the blue trackball located on the left side, operated by your thumb. Simply roll your thumb across the trackball to move the cursor on the screen. This allows your hand to remain stationary, reducing arm and wrist movement.

2. Button Functions

- **Left-Click Button:** Standard primary click function.
- **Right-Click Button:** Standard secondary click function.
- **Scroll Wheel:** Located between the left and right-click buttons, used for vertical scrolling through documents and web pages.
- **Back/Forward Buttons:** Two easy-to-reach buttons located near the trackball, typically used for navigating back and forward in web browsers or file explorers. These can often be customized via Logitech software.

3. Ergonomic Benefits

The sculpted shape of the M570 supports your hand in a natural, relaxed position, minimizing strain on your wrist and forearm. This design is particularly beneficial for users who experience discomfort with traditional mice or spend long hours at the computer.

MAINTENANCE

1. Battery Replacement

When the battery indicator light (usually located near the scroll wheel) signals low power, it's time to replace the AA battery. Open the battery compartment on the underside, remove the old battery, insert a new AA battery, and close the cover. Ensure the mouse is switched off before replacing the battery to conserve power.

2. Cleaning the Trackball

Over time, dust and debris can accumulate around the trackball, affecting its smoothness and precision. To clean, gently push the trackball out from the underside of the mouse. Use a soft, lint-free cloth or a cotton swab to clean the trackball itself and the three small sensor points inside the trackball cavity. Reinsert the trackball until it clicks securely into place.

TROUBLESHOOTING

- **No Cursor Movement:**

- Ensure the mouse is powered on (switch on underside).
- Check battery level; replace if necessary.
- Verify the USB Unifying Receiver is securely plugged into a working USB port.
- Try plugging the receiver into a different USB port.
- Clean the trackball and sensor points as described in the Maintenance section.

- **Intermittent Connection:**

- Ensure the mouse is within range of the receiver (typically up to 10 meters).
- Avoid placing the mouse or receiver near large metal objects or other wireless devices that might cause interference.
- Re-pair the mouse with the Unifying Receiver using Logitech's Unifying Software (available for download from Logitech's website).

- **Buttons Not Responding:**

- Check battery level.
- Ensure the mouse is connected.
- If using custom settings, check Logitech Options software for configuration issues.

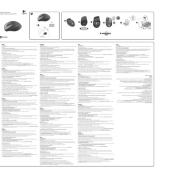
