SETUP AND CONTROLS

Seating and Mirrors

Engine Oil and Filter Change	3,000 miles / 3 months
Tire Rotation	6,000 miles / 6 months
Air Filter Inspection/Replacement	12,000 miles / 12 months
Brake System Inspection	12,000 miles / 12 months
Spark Plug Replacement	30,000 miles / 30 months
