1. INTRODUCTION

- Examine the motor shaft and bearings for any signs of wear or damage.
- Listen for unusual noises and feel for excessive vibration during operation.

7.3 Lubrication

Many modern motors, including some Emerson models, feature sealed bearings that do not require lubrication. Consult the motor's nameplate or specific documentation to determine if your 1542C motor requires periodic lubrication. If lubrication is required, use the specified type and amount of lubricant.

8. TROUBLESHOOTING

Before attempting any troubleshooting, ensure the power supply to the motor is disconnected.

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Motor does not start	No power supply Incorrect wiring Overload protection tripped	Check power source and circuit breaker Verify wiring against diagram Reset overload protector; investigate cause of overload
Motor runs hot	Overload Insufficient ventilation Incorrect voltage	Reduce load on motor Clear obstructions around motor; ensure proper airflow Verify supply voltage matches motor rating
Excessive noise or vibration	Loose mounting Misalignment Worn bearings	Tighten mounting bolts Check and correct shaft alignment Contact qualified service personnel for bearing inspection/replacement

If troubleshooting steps do not resolve the issue, or if you are unsure about any procedure, contact qualified service personnel or Emerson customer support.
