1. INTRODUCTION

The Browin 507001 Two-Arm Metal Wine Corker is an essential device designed for efficient and reliable corking of homemade wine bottles. This corker is engineered to require less force compared to traditional hammer-style corks, providing a comfortable user experience even when bottling large quantities of wine.

2. SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

- Always handle the corks with care.
- Ensure the bottle is stable on a flat, sturdy surface before attempting to cork.
- Keep fingers clear of moving parts during operation to prevent injury.
- Do not use excessive force beyond what is necessary for corks.
- Store the corks in a dry, safe place away from children.
- Inspect the corks for any damage before each use. Do not use if damaged.

3. PACKAGE CONTENTS

Your Browin 507001 package should contain the following item:

- 1 x Browin 507001 Two-Arm Metal Wine Corker

4. SETUP

1. Unpack the Browin 507001 corks from its packaging.
2. Ensure all components are present and undamaged.
3. Place the corks on a stable, flat work surface.
4. Prepare your wine bottles and corks. Ensure corks are of appropriate size for wine bottles.

5. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Follow these steps to effectively cork your wine bottles:

1. **Prepare the Bottle:** Place the wine bottle on a stable, flat surface. Ensure the bottle neck is clean and dry.
2. **Position the Corker:** Place the Browin 507001 corks directly onto the neck of the bottle. The base of the corks should rest securely on the bottle rim.
3. **Lift the Arms:** Fold the two metal arms of the corks upwards. This raises the plunger mechanism.
4. **Insert the Cork:** Place a cork directly under the plunger, positioning it over the bottle opening within the corks's neck.
5. **Lower the Arms:** With both hands, firmly and steadily push the two metal arms downwards. This action will push the plunger, inserting the cork into the bottle. The design ensures the cork and bottle remain stable during this process.
6. **Remove the Corker:** Once the cork is fully inserted, release the arms and carefully lift the corks off the bottle.
7. **Inspect:** Check the cork for proper seating and a secure seal.

6. MAINTENANCE

Proper maintenance will ensure the longevity and optimal performance of your Browin 507001 corker.

- **Cleaning:** After each use, wipe down the corker with a damp cloth to remove any wine residue or cork particles. Dry thoroughly.
- **Lubrication:** Periodically apply a small amount of food-grade lubricant to the moving joints and the plunger mechanism to ensure smooth operation.
- **Storage:** Store the corker in a clean, dry environment to prevent rust or damage.
- **Dishwasher Safety:** This item is **NOT** dishwasher safe. Clean by hand only.

7. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues during operation, consider the following:

- **Cork not inserting smoothly:**
 - Ensure corks are adequately softened (if required for your cork type).
 - Check for any obstructions in the corks mechanism.
 - Apply a small amount of food-grade lubricant to the plunger.
- **Bottle instability:**
 - Ensure the bottle is placed on a completely flat and stable surface.
 - Hold the bottle firmly with one hand while operating the arms with the other, if necessary, for added stability.
- **Cork damage during insertion:**
 - Verify that the corks are the correct size for your bottles and the corks.
 - Ensure the cork is centered under the plunger before pressing down.
 - Apply steady, even pressure when lowering the arms, avoiding sudden jerks.
