Mediacom ME-HDTV Multimedia Player and Audio Recorder User Manual

INTRODUCTION

This manual provides essential information for the proper installation, operation, and maintenance of your Mediacom ME-HDTV Multimedia Player and Audio Recorder. Please read this manual thoroughly before using the device to ensure optimal performance and longevity. Keep this manual for future reference.

1. SETUP

1.1 Unpacking

Carefully remove all components from the packaging. Verify that all items listed in the product contents are present and undamaged. Retain the packaging for potential future transport or service.

1.2 Hard Drive Installation (Optional)

The Mediacom ME-HDTV supports a 3.5-inch internal hard drive (SATA or ATA parallel). To install a hard drive:

1. Ensure the device is powered off and disconnected from the power outlet.
2. Locate the hard drive bay on the device (refer to the diagram in the full manual if available).

3. Carefully slide the 3.5-inch hard drive into the bay, ensuring it connects securely to the internal connectors.
4. Secure the hard drive with the provided screws, if applicable.
5. Close the hard drive bay cover.

1.3 Connecting to a Display

Connect the ME-HDTV to your television or display using an appropriate cable. Common connection types include HDMI for high-definition video and audio, or composite video/audio cables for standard definition.

- **HDMI Connection:** Connect one end of an HDMI cable to the HDMI output port on the ME-HDTV and the other end to an HDMI input port on your television.
- **Analog A/V Connection:** Connect the yellow, white, and red RCA cables from the ME-HDTV's A/V output to the corresponding input ports on your television.

1.4 Power Connection

Connect the power adapter to the DC input port on the ME-HDTV, then plug the adapter into a standard AC power outlet (220-240V).

1.5 Connecting USB Devices

You can connect external USB storage devices (e.g., USB flash drives, external hard drives) to the USB 2.0 port on the ME-HDTV to access additional media files.

2. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

2.1 Powering On/Off

Press the power button on the front panel of the device or on the remote control to turn the ME-HDTV on or off. The 3.5" LCD screen will illuminate upon startup.

2.2 Navigating the Interface

Use the remote control to navigate through the on-screen menus. The directional buttons (up, down, left, right) are used to select options, and the 'OK' or 'Enter' button confirms selections. The 'Back' or 'Return' button typically navigates to the previous menu.

2.3 Media Playback

The ME-HDTV supports a wide range of media formats. Navigate to the desired media type (Video, Music, Photo) from the main menu. Select the storage location (internal HDD, USB device, or network share if configured) and browse for your files.

- **Supported Video Formats:** DIVX, MPEG1, MPEG2, MPEG4, VOB, XVID.
- **Supported Audio Formats:** AIFF, ALAC, FLAC, WAV, MP3, DSD.
- **Supported Image Formats:** JPG.

2.4 Audio Recording

The ME-HDTV functions as an audio recorder. Connect an audio source to the appropriate input ports (if available, refer to device ports) and select the recording function from the main menu. Follow the on-screen prompts to configure recording settings and start recording.

3. MAINTENANCE

3.1 Cleaning

To clean the device, disconnect it from the power source. Use a soft, dry cloth to wipe the exterior. Do not use liquid cleaners or abrasive materials, as these can damage the finish or internal components.

3.2 Firmware Updates

Periodically check the manufacturer's website for available firmware updates. Firmware updates can improve performance, add new features, or resolve known issues. Follow the instructions provided with the update package carefully.

3.3 Hard Drive Management

If an internal hard drive is installed, regularly back up important data to prevent loss. The device may offer options for formatting the hard drive; exercise caution when using such features as they will erase all data.

4. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues with your Mediacom ME-HDTV, refer to the following common problems and solutions:

- No Power:**
Ensure the power adapter is securely connected to both the device and a working power outlet. Verify the power outlet is active.
- No Picture/Sound on TV:**
Check all video and audio cable connections between the ME-HDTV and your television. Ensure your television is set to the correct input source (e.g., HDMI 1, AV).
- Remote Control Not Responding:**
Check the batteries in the remote control and replace them if necessary. Ensure there are no obstructions between the remote and the device's IR receiver.
- Media Files Not Playing:**
Verify that the media files are in a supported format (refer to Section 2.3). Ensure the storage device (internal HDD, USB) is properly connected and recognized by the ME-HDTV.
- Device Freezes or Crashes:**
Try restarting the device by disconnecting and reconnecting the power. If the issue persists, consider performing a factory reset (consult the full manual for instructions, as this will erase settings).

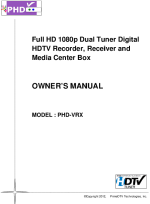

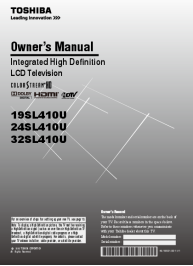
