2. SETUP

2.1 Unpacking

- 1. Carefully remove the remote from its packaging.
- 2. Untwist any securing clips or ties that hold the product in place.
- 3. Retain the packaging for future reference or disposal.

2.2 Battery Installation

The remote includes 3 AAA batteries for demonstration purposes. For optimal performance and extended use, it is recommended to replace these batteries upon initial setup.

1. Locate the battery compartment on the back of the remote.

- 2. Using a Phillips head screwdriver, loosen the screw on the battery compartment cover.
- 3. Remove the cover.
- 4. Insert 3 new AAA batteries, ensuring correct polarity (+/-) as indicated inside the compartment.
- 5. Replace the cover and tighten the screw securely.

3. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

3.1 Power On/Off and Volume Control

- Locate the power slider on the side of the remote. Slide it to the 'On' position to activate the toy.
- The same slider controls the volume. Move the slider to adjust the sound level to your preference.

3.2 Interactive Play Modes

The remote offers various interactive modes accessible through its buttons:

- **Number Buttons (1-10):** Press any of the numbered buttons to hear the number and engage in a counting activity. The screen will light up with bright-colored shapes corresponding to the number.
- **Shapes Button:** Press the button featuring various shapes to play a shapes game with Scout. The remote will prompt you to identify shapes as they light up on the screen.
- Weather Button: Press the button with weather icons to hear about different weather conditions and how Scout enjoys them.
- **Music Button:** Press the music note button to enjoy a variety of tunes, including a Counting Song and Numbers Song.
- **Directional Pad (Up, Down, Left, Right):** Use the directional pad to navigate and hear additional counting and numbers songs.

4. MAINTENANCE

4.1 Cleaning

- To clean the remote, wipe it with a soft, slightly damp cloth.
- Do not immerse the remote in water or use harsh cleaning agents.
- Ensure the remote is completely dry before storing or allowing children to play with it.

4.2 Battery Care

- Remove batteries if the remote will not be used for an extended period to prevent leakage.
- Dispose of used batteries responsibly according to local regulations.
- Do not mix old and new batteries, or different types of batteries.

5. TROUBLESHOOTING

5.1 No Sound or Lights

- Check if the power switch is in the 'On' position.
- Ensure the batteries are correctly installed with the proper polarity.
- · Replace the batteries with fresh ones.
- Adjust the volume slider to ensure it is not set to the lowest setting.

5.2 Incorrect Responses

- If the remote is not responding as expected, try turning it off and then on again to reset it.
- Ensure buttons are pressed firmly and individually.
