INTRODUCTION

SAFETY INFORMATION

PACKAGE CONTENTS

Upon opening the package, verify that all components are present and undamaged.

- One (1) Scag Steering Lever, Part # 483160

Note: Additional hardware for installation (e.g., bolts, nuts, washers) is typically reused from the original assembly or purchased separately, as it is not usually included with this replacement part.

SETUP AND INSTALLATION

This section outlines the general procedure for installing the steering lever. Specific steps may vary depending on your Scag mower model. Always refer to your mower's service manual for precise instructions.

1. **Prepare Equipment:** Park the mower on a level surface, engage the parking brake, turn off the engine, and disconnect the spark plug wire. Allow any hot components to cool.
2. **Locate Existing Lever:** Identify the steering lever assembly that requires replacement.
3. **Remove Old Lever:** Carefully remove any retaining pins, bolts, or clips securing the old steering lever. Note the orientation and position of all components during removal.
4. **Inspect Components:** Before installing the new lever, inspect surrounding components (e.g., bushings, linkages) for wear or damage. Replace any worn parts as necessary.
5. **Install New Lever:** Position the new Scag Steering Lever Part 483160 in the correct orientation. Secure it using the original or new retaining hardware. Ensure all connections are tight but do not overtighten.
6. **Verify Movement:** Test the movement of the steering lever to ensure it operates smoothly and without binding.
7. **Reconnect Power:** Reconnect the spark plug wire.
8. **Functional Check:** Start the mower and perform a low-speed functional check in a safe, open area to confirm proper steering response before full operation.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

The steering lever is an integral part of your Scag mower's control system. Its operation is directly tied to

the overall steering mechanism.

- **Function:** The lever transmits input from the operator to the steering linkage, allowing for directional control of the mower.
- **Smooth Operation:** Ensure the lever moves freely and without excessive play. Any stiffness or looseness may indicate an issue with the steering system that requires inspection.
- **Responsive Control:** A properly functioning steering lever provides precise and immediate response to operator input, crucial for safe and efficient mowing.

MAINTENANCE

Regular maintenance helps extend the life of your steering lever and ensures reliable operation.

- **Regular Inspection:** Periodically inspect the lever and its connection points for signs of wear, corrosion, or damage. Check for loose bolts or pins.
- **Cleaning:** Keep the lever and surrounding area free from dirt, debris, and grass clippings.
- **Lubrication:** If your mower's manual specifies lubrication points for the steering linkage, ensure these are greased according to the recommended schedule. The lever itself typically does not require lubrication, but its pivot points might.
- **Tighten Fasteners:** Check and tighten any loose fasteners associated with the steering lever assembly.

TROUBLESHOOTING

If you experience issues with your steering lever, consider the following common problems and solutions:

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Steering lever feels loose or has excessive play.	Worn bushings, loose fasteners, or damaged linkage components.	Inspect and tighten all fasteners. Replace worn bushings or damaged linkage parts.
Steering is stiff or difficult to move.	Lack of lubrication, bent linkage, or binding components.	Lubricate pivot points as per mower manual. Inspect linkage for bends or obstructions.
Lever is visibly bent or broken.	Impact damage or material fatigue.	Replace the steering lever with a genuine Scag Part # 483160.

If troubleshooting steps do not resolve the issue, contact a certified Scag service dealer for further assistance.
