

SETUP

Tuning Your Ukulele

Your ukulele will not be tuned before shipping to prevent damage during transport. Upon arrival, attach the digital clip-on tuner to the headstock. Tune to C standard (G-C-E-A from top to bottom string when holding the ukulele). New nylon strings will stretch and require frequent re-tuning for the first few days. Temperature and humidity can also affect tuning stability.

String Replacement

Your kit includes 4 extra Aquila nylon strings. Refer to online resources or a qualified technician for detailed instructions on how to properly replace ukulele strings. Ensure correct string tension and placement for optimal sound.

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning

Use the provided cleaning cloth to gently wipe down your ukulele after each use. This helps remove oils and dirt, preserving the mahogany finish and string life. Avoid abrasive cleaners or harsh chemicals.

General Care

Store your ukulele in its gig bag when not in use to protect it from dust, scratches, and environmental changes. Avoid exposing the instrument to extreme temperatures or humidity, as this can affect the wood and tuning stability.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Tuning Instability

If your ukulele frequently goes out of tune, especially when new, this is normal due to string stretching. Continue to re-tune regularly. Ensure the tuning pegs are tightened appropriately. Environmental factors like temperature and humidity can also cause minor tuning shifts.

Muffled Sound

Check that your strings are properly seated on the bridge and nut. Ensure no foreign objects are inside the soundhole. Old or worn strings can also produce a muffled sound; consider replacing them with the extra set provided.

Tuning the ukulele:

To avoid damage during transport, the ukulele won't be tuned before shipping.

When it arrives, grab the clip on tuner and attach it to the headstock. To tune to C (standard for a ukulele), as you're holding the ukulele ready to play, the string at the top should be G, followed by C, E, and the bottom string should be A.

New instruments will take a few days to adapt to the tension of the strings pulling at the body, this can also be affected by temperature and humidity. During this time you'll need to adjust the tuning as and when required.
