## 1. INTRODUCTION

This manual provides essential instructions for the proper use, setup, and maintenance of your Tissot Couturier Powermatic 80 Automatic Ladies Watch, model T035.207.16.031.01. This timepiece features a sophisticated automatic movement, a silver dial, a silver-tone stainless steel case, and a red leather band. It is designed for reliability and precision, offering 100 meters (330 feet) of water resistance.

## 2. SETUP

### 2.1 Initial Winding

Your Tissot Powermatic 80 watch is equipped with an automatic mechanical movement. It is powered by the motion of your wrist. If the watch has stopped or has not been worn for an extended period, it requires initial winding to build up its power reserve.

1. **Unscrew the Crown (if applicable):** Some models feature a screw-down crown for enhanced water resistance. If your crown is screw-down, gently turn it counter-clockwise until it releases.
2. **Wind the Movement:** With the crown in position 1 (normal operating position, not pulled out), turn the crown clockwise approximately 30-40 times. This will provide sufficient power for the watch to start

running.

3. **Secure the Crown:** If you have a screw-down crown, push it back in and turn it clockwise while applying slight pressure until it is fully secured against the case.

## 2.2 Setting the Time and Date

1. **Unscrew the Crown (if applicable):** As described above, if your crown is screw-down, unscrew it first.
2. **Pull Crown to Position 2 (Date Setting):** Gently pull the crown out to the first click. Turn the crown

either clockwise or counter-clockwise to adjust the date. Avoid setting the date between 9 PM and 3 AM, as this can damage the movement. If the current time falls within this window, first set the time outside this range, then set the date, and finally set the correct time.

3. **Pull Crown to Position 3 (Time Setting):** Pull the crown out to the second click. The second hand will stop, allowing for precise time setting. Turn the crown to set the hour and minute hands. To ensure correct AM/PM indication for the date change, advance the hands past 12 o'clock. If the date changes, you are in the AM hours. Continue to advance the hands to the desired time.
4. **Push and Secure Crown:** Once the time and date are set, push the crown back into position 1. If it's a screw-down crown, gently push and turn clockwise until it is fully secured.

## 3. OPERATION

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### 3.1 Automatic Movement

The Powermatic 80 movement is an automatic mechanical caliber. This means it is powered by the natural motion of your wrist. As you wear the watch, an oscillating weight (rotor) inside the movement rotates, winding the mainspring and storing energy. This energy allows the watch to run without a battery.

### 3.2 Power Reserve

The Powermatic 80 movement boasts an impressive power reserve of approximately 80 hours when fully wound. This means that if fully wound, the watch can be left unworn for up to 80 hours (over three days) and still keep accurate time. If the watch stops, refer to the "Initial Winding" section to restart it.

### 3.3 Water Resistance

Your Tissot watch is water resistant to 100 meters (330 feet). This rating makes it suitable for swimming and showering. However, it is not designed for diving. Always ensure the crown is fully pushed in and, if applicable, screwed down, before exposing the watch to water. Avoid operating the crown or pushers while the watch is wet or submerged.

## 4. MAINTENANCE

## 4.1 Cleaning

To maintain the appearance of your watch, regularly clean the case and metal bracelet (if applicable) with a soft, dry cloth. For the leather strap, avoid excessive moisture and harsh chemicals. If the watch is water resistant, you may use a slightly damp cloth for the case and crystal, then dry thoroughly.

## 4.2 Leather Strap Care

The red leather strap is a natural material and can be affected by moisture, sweat, cosmetics, and prolonged exposure to direct sunlight. To prolong its life:

- Avoid prolonged contact with water.
- Clean with a soft, dry cloth.
- Allow it to air dry naturally if it gets wet.
- Avoid contact with solvents, detergents, perfumes, and cosmetic products.

## 4.3 Regular Servicing

Like any precision mechanical instrument, your Tissot watch requires periodic servicing to ensure optimal performance and longevity. It is recommended to have your watch serviced by an authorized Tissot service center every 3-5 years. This service typically includes cleaning, lubrication, and adjustment of the movement, as well as replacement of seals to maintain water resistance.

# 5. TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Watch has stopped or is running slow.	Insufficient power reserve.	Manually wind the watch by turning the crown clockwise 30-40 times. Wear the watch regularly to keep it wound.
Date changes at noon instead of midnight.	AM/PM setting is incorrect.	Pull the crown to position 3 and advance the time by 12 hours.
Water condensation under the crystal.	Loss of water resistance due to impact, aging seals, or open crown.	Immediately take the watch to an authorized service center. Do not attempt to dry it yourself.
Watch is running too fast or too slow consistently.	Movement requires regulation or servicing.	Contact an authorized Tissot service center for adjustment or repair.






Figure 4: The Tissot Couturier Powermatic 80 watch packaging, including the branded watch box and accompanying instruction manuals/warranty information.
