# Audio-Technica AT-LP60XHP Turntable & Headphone Bundle

## INSTRUCTION MANUAL

### Introduction

The Audio-Technica AT-LP60XHP is a fully automatic belt-drive turntable and headphone combination designed for enjoying 33-1/3 and 45 RPM vinyl records. This bundle includes an integrated headphone amplifier with a 3.5 mm (1/8") headphone jack and volume control, allowing for direct listening with the included ATH-250AV over-ear headphones or other compatible headphones. The turntable can also be connected to external audio systems via its detachable RCA output cable and built-in switchable phono preamp.

Key features include:

- High-fidelity audio reproduction from vinyl records.
- Fully automatic belt-drive operation with two selectable speeds: 33-1/3 and 45 RPM.
- Integrated headphone amplifier with front-panel 3.5 mm (1/8") headphone jack and volume control.
- Included ATH-250AV over-ear headphones with 40 mm drivers and a 3.5 m (11.5') cable.
- Anti-resonance die-cast aluminum platter for stable playback.
- Redesigned tonearm base and headshell for improved tracking and reduced resonance.
- External AC adapter to minimize noise interference in the signal chain.

## Product Overview

Familiarize yourself with the components and controls of your AT-LP60XHP turntable.

The turntable features a sleek design with clearly labeled controls for ease of use. The main unit houses the platter, tonearm, and control buttons, while the included headphones provide a direct listening experience.

#### Controls:

- **Speed Selector:** Switch between 33-1/3 RPM and 45 RPM.
- **Start Button:** Initiates automatic playback, moving the tonearm to the record and lowering the stylus.
- **Stop Button:** Halts playback, lifts the stylus, and returns the tonearm to its rest position.
- **Tonearm Lift/Lower Button:** Manually raises or lowers the tonearm.
- **Headphone Jack (3.5 mm):** Connect your headphones for private listening.
- **Headphone Volume Control:** Adjusts the volume for connected headphones.

## Setup

1. **Unpack:** Carefully remove all components from the packaging. Retain packaging for future transport or storage.
2. **Place Turntable:** Position the turntable on a stable, level surface away from direct sunlight, heat sources, and excessive vibration.
3. **Install Platter:** Place the die-cast aluminum platter onto the turntable spindle. Ensure it sits correctly.
4. **Install Drive Belt:** Carefully attach the drive belt to the motor pulley and the inner rim of the platter according to the diagram in the quick start guide (not provided here).

5. **Install Dust Cover:** Attach the hinged dust cover to the rear hinges of the turntable.
6. **Connect Power:** Connect the AC adapter to the DC IN 12V port on the rear of the turntable, then plug the adapter into a wall outlet.
7. **Connect Headphones:** Plug the ATH-250AV headphones (or your preferred headphones) into the 3.5 mm headphone jack on the front panel.
8. **External Audio Connection (Optional):** If connecting to an external amplifier or powered speakers, use the detachable RCA output cable. Ensure the PHONO/LINE switch on the rear is set appropriately (PHONO for phono input, LINE for line input).

## Operating Instructions

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Follow these steps to play your vinyl records:

1. **Place Record:** Carefully place a vinyl record on the platter. If playing a 7-inch record, place the 45 RPM adapter on the center spindle.
2. **Select Speed:** Set the speed selector switch to either 33-1/3 RPM or 45 RPM, matching the speed of your record.
3. **Start Playback:** Press the **START** button. The tonearm will automatically move to the lead-in groove of the record and gently lower the stylus.
4. **Adjust Volume:** If using headphones, adjust the headphone volume control to your desired listening level. If connected to an external system, adjust the volume on that system.
5. **Stop Playback:** To stop playback, press the **STOP** button. The tonearm will automatically lift, return to its rest, and the platter will stop spinning.
6. **Manual Tonearm Operation (for 10-inch records or specific track selection):** For 10-inch records, you may need to manually position the tonearm. Use the tonearm lift/lower button to raise the tonearm, manually move it over the desired track, then lower it.

## Connections

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The AT-LP60XHP offers flexible connection options:

- **RCA Output:** Use the included detachable 3.5 mm male to dual RCA male cable to connect the turntable to an amplifier, receiver, or powered speakers.
- **Phono/Line Switch:** Located on the rear panel, this switch allows you to select between PHONO output (for connecting to an amplifier with a dedicated phono input) or LINE output (for connecting to a line-level input on an amplifier or powered speakers without a phono input).
- **Headphone Output:** The integrated 3.5 mm (1/8") headphone jack on the front panel provides direct audio output for headphones.

## Maintenance

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Proper maintenance ensures the longevity and optimal performance of your turntable:

- **Dust Cover:** Always keep the hinged dust cover closed when the turntable is not in use to protect it from dust and debris.
- **Cleaning:** Use a soft, dry cloth to clean the turntable chassis and dust cover. Avoid harsh chemicals or

abrasive cleaners.

- **Stylus Care:** Gently clean the stylus regularly using a soft brush designed for stylus cleaning, brushing from back to front.
- **Stylus Replacement:** The Dual Magnet cartridge features a replaceable stylus. Replace the stylus when you notice a decrease in sound quality or after approximately 300-500 hours of playback. Refer to the Audio-Technica website or your local dealer for replacement stylus.

## Troubleshooting

If you encounter issues with your turntable, consult the following common troubleshooting tips:

- **No Power:** Ensure the AC adapter is securely connected to the turntable and a working power outlet.
- **No Sound:** Check all audio cable connections. Verify the PHONO/LINE switch is set correctly for your amplifier/speaker input. Ensure headphone volume is turned up if using headphones.
- **Skipping/Distorted Sound:** Ensure the record is clean and free of dust. Verify the turntable is on a stable, level surface. Check the stylus for damage or wear; replace if necessary.
- **Platter Not Spinning:** Check the drive belt to ensure it is correctly seated on the motor pulley and platter rim.
