5. SETUP GUIDE

5.1 Connecting Your Drive

- 1. Locate the appropriate USB port on your Mac (USB-C or USB-A).
- 2. If your Mac has a USB-C port, use the provided USB-A to USB-C adapter with the SuperSpeed USB-A cable.
- 3. Connect the smaller end of the USB cable to the WD My Passport drive.
- 4. Connect the other end of the USB cable (or the adapter if using USB-C) to your Mac's USB port.

The drive should be automatically recognized by your Mac. It comes pre-formatted for macOS, so it is ready for use immediately after connection.

5.2 Initial Drive Recognition

Upon first connection, your Mac's operating system should detect the new drive. It may appear on your desktop or in the Finder sidebar. If it does not appear, try connecting to a different USB port or restarting your Mac.

To transfer files, simply drag and drop them to and from the My Passport drive icon on your desktop or within Finder. You can also copy and paste files as you would with any other storage device.

6.3 Setting Up Password Protection

For enhanced security, the drive supports 256-bit AES hardware encryption and password protection. The included software will guide you through the process of setting up a password to secure your data. It is crucial to remember your password, as WD cannot recover lost passwords.

7. MAINTENANCE AND CARE

- Safe Ejection: Always eject the drive from your Mac before disconnecting it to prevent data corruption.

 Drag the drive icon to the Trash or use the 'Eject' option in Finder.
- Physical Care: Keep the drive in a clean, dry environment. Avoid extreme temperatures, direct sunlight,

and strong magnetic fields. Do not drop or expose the drive to excessive shock.

• Cleaning: Use a soft, dry cloth to clean the exterior of the drive. Do not use liquid cleaners or solvents.

8. TROUBLESHOOTING

8.1 Drive Not Recognized

- Ensure the USB cable is securely connected to both the drive and your Mac.
- Try connecting the drive to a different USB port on your Mac.
- If using a USB hub, try connecting the drive directly to your Mac.
- · Restart your Mac.
- Check Disk Utility (Applications > Utilities > Disk Utility) to see if the drive is listed. If it is, you may need to mount it manually or repair it.

8.2 Slow Performance

- Ensure you are using a SuperSpeed USB 3.0 or 3.1 port for optimal transfer speeds. USB 2.0 ports will result in slower performance.
- Close any unnecessary applications running on your Mac that might be consuming system resources.
- Ensure your drive has sufficient free space. Performance can degrade when a drive is nearly full.
