SETUP

Connecting the Drive

- 1. Locate an available USB port on your computer (USB 3.0 or USB 3.1/3.2 Gen 1 recommended for optimal performance).
- 2. Connect the small end of the SuperSpeed USB-A cable to the USB port on your My Passport drive.

- 3. Connect the larger end of the SuperSpeed USB-A cable to a USB port on your computer.
- 4. The drive will be automatically detected by your operating system.

Initial Software Installation (Optional but Recommended)

Your My Passport drive comes with software for device management, backup, and password protection. While the drive is plug-and-play for basic storage, installing the software enhances its capabilities.

- 1. Open the My Passport drive from "My Computer" (Windows) or "Finder" (macOS).
- 2. Locate and run the installer application (e.g., "WD Discovery.exe" for Windows or "WD Discovery.dmg" for macOS).
- 3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the software installation. This software includes tools for backup and security.

OPERATING THE DRIVE

Transferring Files

Once connected, your My Passport drive functions like any other external storage device. You can drag and drop files, copy and paste, or use your operating system's file management tools to transfer data.

- **Copying Files:** Select the files or folders you wish to transfer from your computer, right-click (or Ctrl-click on Mac) and select "Copy". Then, navigate to the My Passport drive, right-click in an empty area, and select "Paste".
- **Dragging and Dropping:** Open both the source folder on your computer and the My Passport drive folder. Drag the desired files or folders from the source to the My Passport drive.

Using Backup Software

The included software allows you to set up automatic backups of your important data. Refer to the software's help

documentation for detailed instructions on configuring backup schedules and selecting specific files or folders.

Password Protection and Hardware Encryption

For enhanced security, the My Passport drive supports 256-bit AES hardware encryption and password protection. This feature is managed through the installed WD software.

- 1. Open the WD software application.
- 2. Navigate to the security or password protection section.
- 3. Follow the prompts to set a password for your drive. Remember this password, as it is crucial for accessing your encrypted data.

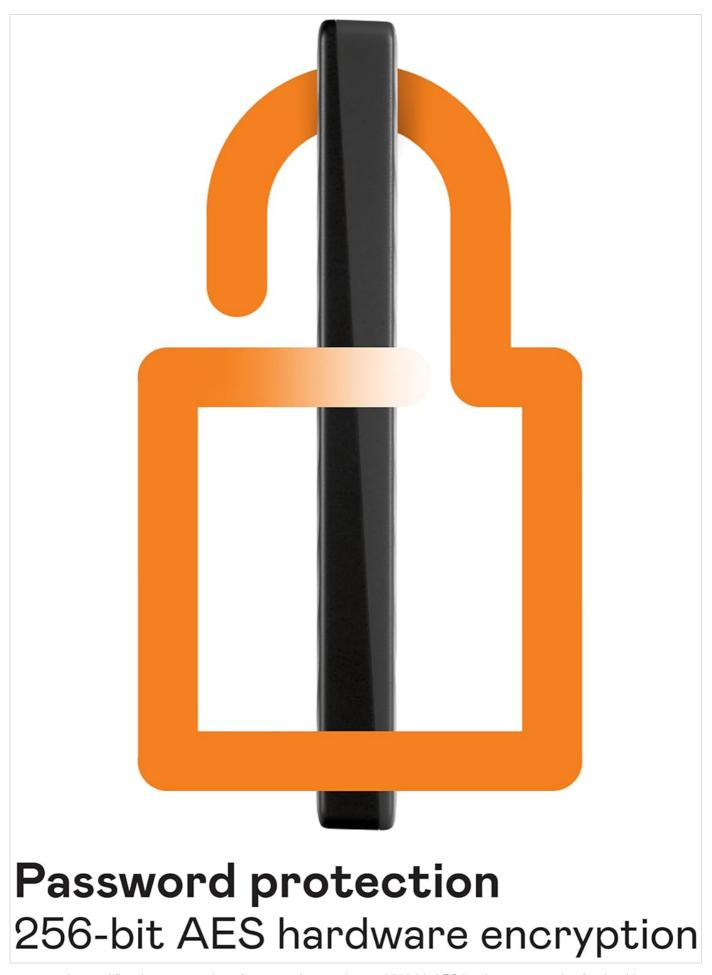


Image: Visual representation of password protection and 256-bit AES hardware encryption for the drive.

MAINTENANCE

Safe Removal

Always safely eject the My Passport drive before disconnecting it from your computer to prevent data corruption.

- **Windows:** Click the "Safely Remove Hardware and Eject Media" icon in the system tray, then select your My Passport drive.
- macOS: Drag the My Passport drive icon from the desktop or Finder sidebar to the Trash icon, or right-click (or Ctrlclick) the drive icon and select "Eject".

Physical Care

- Keep the drive in a clean, dry environment.
- · Avoid exposing the drive to extreme temperatures or direct sunlight.
- Do not drop or subject the drive to strong impacts, as this can damage the internal components.
- Clean the exterior with a soft, dry cloth. Do not use liquid cleaners.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Drive Not Detected

- Ensure the USB cable is securely connected to both the drive and the computer.
- Try a different USB port on your computer.
- Try a different USB cable (if available).
- · Restart your computer.

• Check your computer's Disk Management (Windows) or Disk Utility (macOS) to see if the drive is recognized but not assigned a drive letter or mounted.

Slow Transfer Speeds

- Ensure you are connected to a USB 3.0 (or higher) port on your computer. USB 2.0 ports will result in significantly slower speeds.
- Avoid running multiple demanding applications during large file transfers.
- Ensure your computer's drivers are up to date.

Forgotten Password

If you forget your password for an encrypted drive, you may lose access to your data. WD software typically provides a password hint or recovery option during setup. If no recovery option was configured, data recovery may not be possible without the correct password.
