3. SETUP

Follow these steps to set up your Polycom Poly Trio 8300 IP Conference Station:

1. **Unpack the Device:** Carefully remove all components from the packaging.

- 2. **Power over Ethernet (PoE) Connection:** Connect an Ethernet cable from your network's PoE-enabled switch or injector to the LAN port on the Trio 8300. This single connection provides both power and network access.
- Alternative Power (if no PoE): If PoE is not available, connect a compatible power adapter (sold separately) to the power port and then to an electrical outlet. Connect an Ethernet cable from your network to the LAN port.
- 4. Initial Boot-up: The device will power on automatically. Allow it to complete its boot sequence.
- Network Configuration: The device will attempt to obtain network settings via DHCP. If static IP
 configuration is required, access the device's administrative interface (refer to your network administrator
 for details).
- 6. **Platform Integration:** Follow the on-screen prompts or consult your IT administrator to integrate the Trio 8300 with your chosen conferencing platform (e.g., Microsoft Teams, Zoom, etc.).

4. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

The Polycom Poly Trio 8300 is designed for intuitive operation. Here are basic instructions for common tasks:

- **Joining a Meeting:** For scheduled meetings, a "Join" button may appear on the display. Pressing this button will connect you to the meeting instantly.
- Making an Audio Call: Use the on-screen dial pad or the physical keypad to enter a phone number, then press the green call button.
- Adjusting Volume: Use the + and buttons on the device to adjust the speaker volume during a call or meeting.
- **Muting Microphones:** Press the microphone icon button to mute or unmute the device's microphones. The LED indicators will change color to show the mute status.
- **Content Sharing:** Depending on your platform integration, content sharing options will be available on the display. This may include wired or wireless sharing.
- **Bluetooth Connectivity:** To connect a mobile device via Bluetooth, navigate to the Bluetooth settings on the Trio 8300's display and pair with your device.




Figure 4.1: Individuals interacting with the Polycom Poly Trio 8300 during a conference, demonstrating its use in a collaborative setting.

5. CONNECTIVITY

- · Check the Ethernet cable connection.
- Verify that your network switch or router is functioning correctly.
- If using Wi-Fi, ensure the device is connected to the correct network and has a strong signal.

• No Audio During Calls:

- Check the volume level using the + button.
- Ensure the microphones are not muted.
- Verify that the device is properly connected to the conferencing platform.

• Unable to Configure Device (Admin Password Issue):

 If you are unable to access the administrative settings due to an unknown password, contact your IT administrator or Polycom support. Default passwords may vary or be changed by your organization.


