SETUP AND ASSEMBLY

The KADAX K687 Hand Lawn Aerator is supplied as a head unit without a handle. A compatible wooden handle (not included) is required for operation. Ensure the handle you choose is sturdy and appropriate for garden tool use.

- Select a Compatible Handle:** Choose a wooden handle that fits securely into the aerator's socket. The handle should be long enough to allow comfortable operation without excessive bending.
- Attach the Handle:** Insert the chosen handle firmly into the red metal socket of the aerator head.
- Secure the Handle (if applicable):** If your handle or aerator head includes provisions for screws or pins to secure the handle, ensure these are properly installed to prevent the handle from detaching during use.
- Check Stability:** Before use, firmly pull and twist the handle to ensure it is securely attached and does not wobble.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

The KADAX K687 Hand Lawn Aerator is designed to improve the health and appearance of your lawn by creating channels in the soil.

When to Aerate:

- The best times for aeration are typically in spring and late summer when the grass is actively growing.
- For frequently used or compacted soils, aeration can be performed several times per season.
- Ensure the soil is moist but not waterlogged. Aerating dry, hard soil is difficult and less effective.

How to Use:

1. **Prepare the Area:** Clear the lawn of any debris, stones, or obstacles that could damage the aerator.
2. **Position the Aerator:** Place the aerator head on the lawn.

3. **Apply Pressure:** Using the attached handle, push the aerator's long teeth into the soil. Apply downward pressure with your foot on the top bar of the aerator head if needed, for deeper penetration.
4. **Repeat:** Lift the aerator and move it to the next section of the lawn, repeating the process. Aim for even coverage across the desired area.

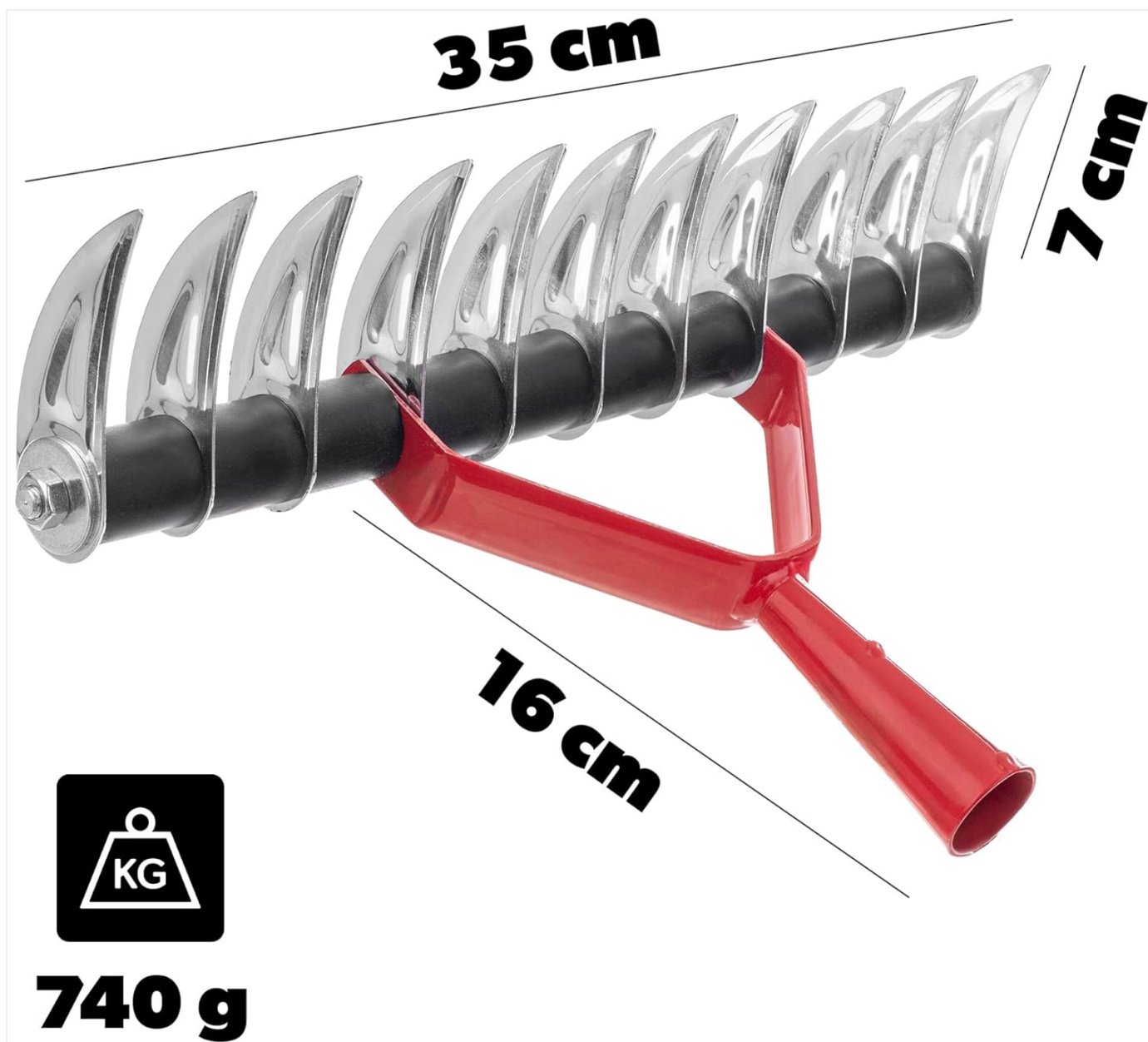


Image: The hand aerator positioned in the soil, ready for use.

Benefits of Aeration:

- Improves soil ventilation, allowing air to reach deeper root zones.
- Enhances water and nutrient penetration into the soil.
- Promotes stronger, healthier grass root development.
- Helps combat moss and weeds by improving turf density.
- Reduces surface evaporation, helping the lawn retain moisture.
- Makes the soil more permeable and elastic.

MAINTENANCE AND CARE

Proper maintenance will extend the lifespan of your KADAX K687 Hand Lawn Aerator.

- **Cleaning:** After each use, remove any soil, grass, or debris from the aerator head and teeth. A stiff brush or hose can be used.
- **Drying:** Ensure the metal parts are thoroughly dried after cleaning to prevent rust.
- **Lubrication:** Periodically apply a light coat of rust-preventative oil to the metal teeth and joints, especially before long-term storage.
- **Handle Inspection:** Regularly check the handle for any signs of damage, cracks, or looseness. Replace or repair the handle if necessary to ensure safe operation.
- **Storage:** The aerator's metal construction is resistant to adverse weather conditions. It can be stored outdoors, in a garage, or a barn. Store in a dry place when possible to further prolong its life.

This section addresses common issues you might encounter with your hand lawn aerator.

- **Difficulty Penetrating Soil:**

- Ensure the soil is adequately moist. Dry, compacted soil is very difficult to aerate manually. Water the lawn a day or two before aeration.
- Check if the aerator teeth are clean and free of debris.
- Apply more downward pressure, potentially using your foot on the aerator's top bar.

- **Handle Wobbles or Detaches:**

- Re-secure the handle firmly into the aerator head.
- If applicable, ensure any securing screws or pins are properly installed and tightened.
- If the handle is damaged or the fit is loose, replace the handle with a new, compatible one.

- **Ineffective Aeration:**

- Ensure you are aerating at the correct time of year (spring or late summer).
- Verify that the soil moisture is optimal.
- Ensure sufficient depth of penetration.
- Consider the frequency of aeration for your specific lawn conditions.
