INTRODUCTION

This manual provides essential instructions for the BoxWave DirectSync Cable. This cable is designed to facilitate both charging and high-speed data synchronization for compatible devices, such as the E&L D58. Please read this manual thoroughly to ensure proper use and optimal performance of your cable.

PRODUCT FEATURES

- **High-Speed Data Transfer:** Supports USB 2.0 data transfers, enabling speeds of up to 480 Mbps for efficient file synchronization.
- **Dual Functionality:** Engineered to simultaneously charge your device and transfer data, offering convenience and efficiency.
- **Durable Construction:** Features a shielded cable design for enhanced protection against interference and increased longevity.
- **Reinforced Strain Relief:** Equipped with strong rubberized grommet strain reliefs at the connector points to prevent kinking and splitting, extending the cable's lifespan.
- **Optimal Length:** Provides a generous 3-foot (approximately 0.9 meters) length, offering flexibility and ease of use in various environments.

SETUP

1. **Identify Ports:** Locate the Micro USB port on your compatible device (e.g., E&L D58) and an available USB-A port on your charging adapter or computer.
2. **Connect to Device:** Gently insert the Micro USB end of the DirectSync cable into your device's Micro USB port. Ensure it is fully seated and secure.
3. **Connect to Power/Data Source:** Insert the standard USB-A end of the DirectSync cable into a compatible USB power source (such as a wall charger, power bank, or car charger) for charging, or into a computer's USB-A port for data transfer.

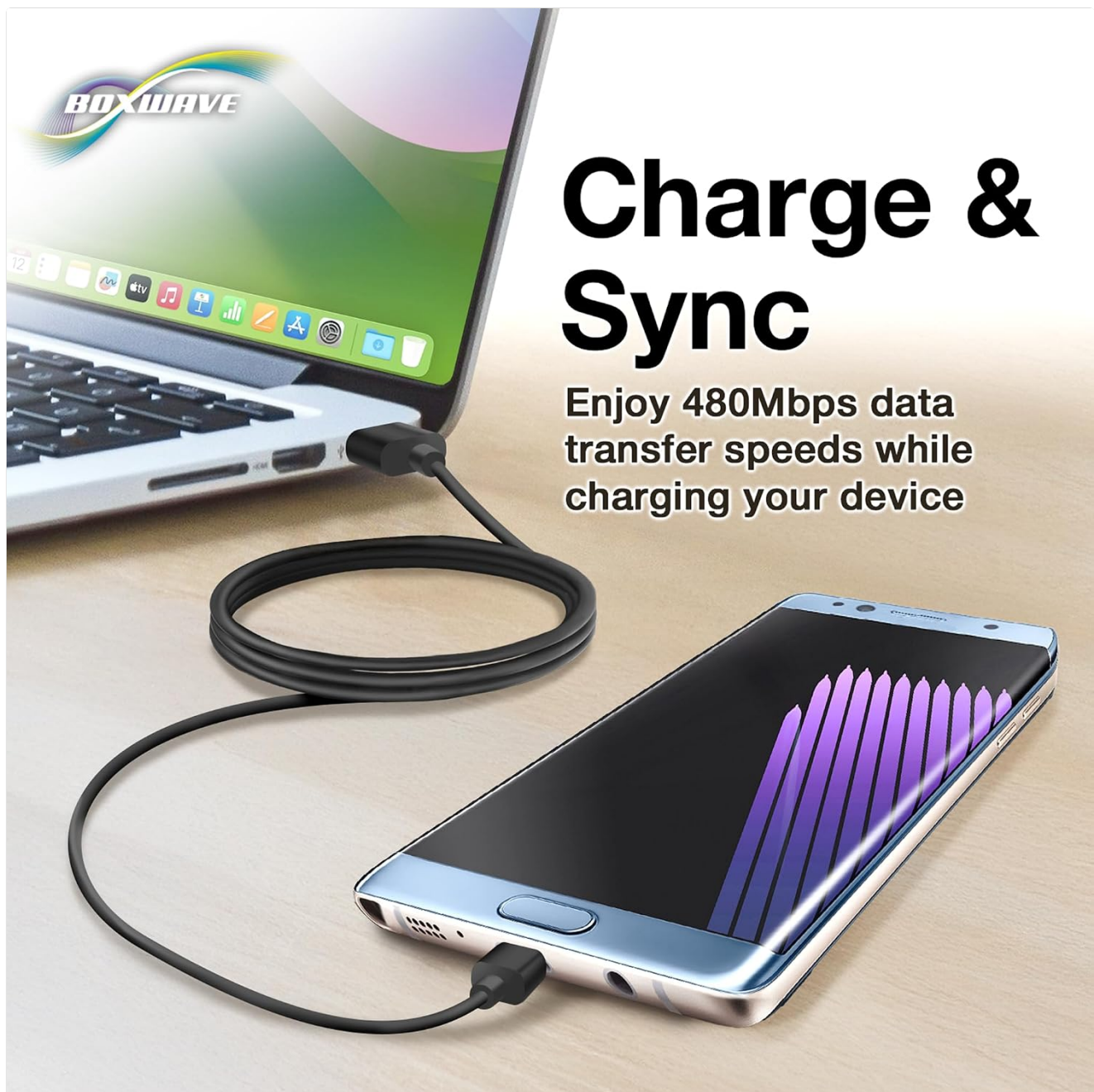


Image: The DirectSync cable connected between a laptop and a smartphone, illustrating its dual functionality for charging and data synchronization.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Charging Your Device

- After connecting the cable to a power source and your device as described in the Setup section, your device should automatically begin charging.
- Monitor your device's screen for the charging indicator to confirm that power is being received.

Data Synchronization

- When the cable is connected between your device and a computer, your device should be recognized by the computer's operating system.
- Depending on your device's settings, you may need to select a data transfer mode (e.g., File Transfer, MTP, PTP) on your device's screen.
- Follow the on-screen prompts on your computer or device to initiate and manage file transfers.

- Ensure the cable remains securely connected throughout the data transfer process to prevent corruption or interruption.

MAINTENANCE

- **Storage:** Store the cable in a clean, dry place away from direct sunlight and extreme temperatures when not in use.
- **Handling:** Avoid sharp bends, kinks, or excessive pulling on the cable, especially near the connectors. This helps preserve the integrity of the internal wiring and the reinforced strain reliefs.
- **Cleaning:** If dust or debris accumulates on the connectors, gently wipe them with a dry, lint-free cloth. Do not use liquid cleaners directly on the connectors.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Device Not Charging

- **Check Connections:** Ensure both the Micro USB end and the USB-A end of the cable are fully and securely inserted into their respective ports.
- **Verify Power Source:** Try connecting the USB-A end to a different power source (e.g., another wall adapter, a different USB port on your computer, or a different power bank) to rule out an issue with the power supply.
- **Inspect Ports:** Visually inspect your device's charging port for any debris, lint, or damage that might obstruct the connection.
- **Test Cable:** If possible, test the DirectSync cable with another compatible device to determine if the issue lies with the cable or your original device.

Data Transfer Issues

- **Secure Connections:** Confirm that the cable is firmly connected to both your device and the computer.
- **Restart Devices:** Restart both your device and the computer, then attempt the data transfer again.
- **Device Settings:** Check your device's settings to ensure that data transfer mode is enabled and that it is not set to 'Charging only'.
- **Alternate USB Port:** Try connecting the USB-A end to a different USB port on your computer.
