1. INTRODUCTION

Thank you for choosing the Bianchi Aspid 47 Mountain Bike. This manual provides essential information for the safe assembly, operation, and maintenance of your bicycle. Designed for diverse conditions, the Aspid 47 offers a robust and ergonomic riding experience. Please read this manual thoroughly before your first ride and keep it for future reference.

2. SAFETY INFORMATION

Your safety is paramount. Always adhere to the following guidelines:

- **Wear a Helmet:** Always wear a properly fitted and approved cycling helmet.
- **Pre-Ride Check:** Before each ride, inspect brakes, tires, gears, and all quick-release levers to ensure they are secure and functioning correctly.
- **Road Rules:** Obey all local traffic laws, signals, and signs. Ride predictably and signal your turns.
- **Visibility:** Use front and rear lights when riding in low light conditions. Wear bright clothing.
- **Braking:** Practice braking to understand the stopping power of your hydraulic disc brakes. Apply both brakes smoothly and simultaneously.
- **Weather Conditions:** Exercise caution in wet or slippery conditions, as braking distance will increase.
- **Weight Limit:** Do not exceed the recommended weight limit for the bicycle.

3. SETUP AND ASSEMBLY

While professional assembly is recommended, this section provides general guidance for initial setup. If you are unsure about any step, consult a qualified bicycle mechanic.

3.1 Unpacking

Carefully remove the bicycle and all components from the packaging. Retain packaging materials until assembly is complete and satisfactory.

3.2 Handlebar Installation

Attach the handlebar to the stem, ensuring it is centered and the brake levers and shifters are positioned comfortably. Tighten the stem bolts securely according to manufacturer specifications.

3.3 Pedal Installation

Identify the left (L) and right (R) pedals. The left pedal has a left-hand thread (tightens counter-clockwise), and the right pedal has a right-hand thread (tightens clockwise). Apply a small amount of grease to the threads and tighten them firmly into the crank arms using a pedal wrench.

3.4 Seat Post Adjustment

Insert the seat post into the frame. Adjust the saddle height so that your leg has a slight bend at the knee when the pedal is at its lowest point. Ensure the minimum insertion mark on the seat post is not visible above the frame. Secure the quick-release or bolt firmly.

3.5 Wheel Installation and Brake Adjustment

Ensure wheels are properly seated in the dropouts and quick-release skewers or thru-axles are tightened securely. Verify that the hydraulic disc brakes are aligned and functioning correctly, with no rubbing or excessive lever travel.

4. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

4.1 Riding Posture

Maintain a comfortable and balanced riding posture. Keep your elbows slightly bent and your grip firm but relaxed on the handlebars.

4.2 Gear Shifting (21 Speeds)

Your Bianchi Aspid 47 features a 21-speed drivetrain. Shift gears smoothly by pedaling lightly while operating the shifters. Avoid shifting under heavy load to prevent damage to the drivetrain components. Use lower gears for climbing and higher gears for flat terrain or descents.

4.3 Braking

The hydraulic disc brakes provide powerful and consistent stopping. Apply both front and rear brakes simultaneously for optimal control. In emergency stops, shift your weight slightly backward to prevent going over the handlebars.

4.4 Terrain Suitability

This mountain bike is designed for mountain use, including trails and off-road paths. It is also suitable for urban commuting and general recreational riding. Always ride within your skill level and the bike's capabilities.

5. MAINTENANCE

Regular maintenance ensures the longevity and safe operation of your bicycle.

- **Cleaning:** Regularly clean your bike with mild soap and water. Avoid high-pressure washers directly on bearings.
- **Chain Lubrication:** Keep the chain clean and lubricated. Apply bicycle-specific chain lubricant every 100-200 km or after riding in wet conditions.
- **Tire Pressure:** Check tire pressure before each ride. Maintain pressure within the range indicated on the tire sidewall (for 27.5-inch wheels).
- **Brake Inspection:** Periodically check brake pads for wear and hydraulic fluid levels. Replace worn pads promptly.
- **Gear System:** Ensure smooth gear changes. If shifting becomes rough or inconsistent, adjust the derailleur cables or consult a mechanic.
- **Bolt Tightening:** Regularly check and tighten all bolts and fasteners, especially on the stem, handlebars, seat post, and wheels.
- **Professional Servicing:** Have your bicycle professionally serviced at least once a year, or more frequently if you ride often or in harsh conditions.

6. TROUBLESHOOTING

Here are solutions to common issues you might encounter:

- **Flat Tire:** Inspect the tire for punctures. Remove the wheel, replace or patch the inner tube, and reinflate to the correct pressure.
- **Noisy Brakes:** Clean brake rotors and pads. If noise persists, check for pad contamination or misalignment. Professional adjustment may be required.
- **Gear Skipping:** This often indicates misaligned derailleurs or stretched cables. Minor adjustments can be made with barrel adjusters; for persistent issues, consult a mechanic.
- **Loose Components:** Stop riding immediately if you notice any loose components. Tighten all bolts and fasteners to their specified torque.







