1. INTRODUCTION

The UNIWA E1801 is a user-friendly mobile phone designed with large buttons and a clear display, making it ideal for seniors. It features essential functions such as calling, messaging, FM radio, MP3/MP4 playback, and a built-in flashlight. This manual provides comprehensive instructions for setting up, operating, and maintaining your device.

- Do not disassemble or modify the device.
- Use only original or approved batteries and chargers.
- Avoid exposing the phone to extreme temperatures, direct sunlight, or moisture.

4. PRODUCT OVERVIEW

- **Display:** 1.77-inch QQVGA screen (160 x 128 pixels) for clear visibility.
- **Keypad:** Large, ergonomic buttons with clear numbering for easy dialing and navigation.

- **Navigation Keys:** Plated navigation keys for intuitive menu control.
- **Rear Camera:** 0.08 MP camera for basic photo capture.
- **Speaker:** Integrated 2030 box speaker for loud and clear audio.

- **Non-slip Frame:** Textured frame design for a secure grip.

5. SETUP

5.1. Installing SIM Cards

The UNIWA E1801 supports dual SIM cards, allowing you to use two different numbers simultaneously.

1. Remove the back cover of the phone.
2. Locate the SIM card slots.
3. Carefully insert your SIM cards into the designated slots with the gold contacts facing down.
4. Ensure the SIM cards are securely seated.

5.2. Installing the Battery

1. After inserting the SIM cards, place the BL-5C 800mAh battery into the battery compartment, aligning the gold contacts.
2. Gently press down until the battery is securely in place.
3. Replace the back cover, ensuring it clicks into position.

5.3. Charging the Phone

Before first use, fully charge the phone's battery.

1. Connect the charger to the charging port on the phone.
2. Plug the charger into a power outlet.
3. The battery indicator on the screen will show the charging status.
4. Once fully charged, disconnect the charger.

6. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

6.1. Power On/Off

- **To Power On:** Press and hold the Power/End Call button until the screen lights up.
- **To Power Off:** Press and hold the Power/End Call button until the power off options appear, then select "Power off".

6.2. Making Calls

1. From the idle screen, enter the phone number using the keypad.
2. Press the Green Call button to initiate the call.
3. To end a call, press the Red End Call button.

6.3. Sending Messages

1. Go to "Menu" > "Messages" > "Write message".
2. Enter your message using the keypad.
3. Enter the recipient's phone number or select from contacts.
4. Press "Send".

6.4. Using the FM Radio

The phone features a wireless FM radio.

1. Go to "Menu" > "FM Radio".
2. Select "Auto search" to find available stations.
3. Use the navigation keys to switch between stations.

6.5. Using the Flashlight

The built-in flashlight can be easily activated.

- Typically, a dedicated button or a long press on a specific key (refer to your phone's quick guide) activates the flashlight.
- Alternatively, access it via "Menu" > "Tools" > "Flashlight".

6.6. Other Features

- **MP3/MP4 Playback:** Supports multimedia playback. Transfer files to a TF card (up to 16GB, not included) and access them via the "Multimedia" menu.
- **Phonebook:** Store up to 300 contacts.
- **Tools:** Includes games, calendar, alarm clock, calculator, world clock, and recorder.

7. MAINTENANCE

- **Cleaning:** Use a soft, dry cloth to clean the phone's surface. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosols.
- **Storage:** Store the phone in a cool, dry place away from direct sunlight and extreme temperatures.
- **Battery Care:** Avoid fully discharging the battery frequently. Charge it regularly to prolong its lifespan.

8. TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Phone does not power on.	Battery is low or not installed correctly.	Charge the battery. Ensure the battery is correctly inserted.
Cannot make or receive calls.	No SIM card, SIM card not inserted correctly, or no network signal.	Ensure SIM card is inserted. Check network signal strength. Contact your service provider.
Poor audio quality.	Low volume, poor network signal, or speaker/microphone obstruction.	Adjust volume. Move to an area with better signal. Clean speaker/microphone openings.
Battery drains quickly.	Frequent use, background applications, or old battery.	Reduce screen brightness. Close unused applications. Consider replacing the battery if it's old.

Install SIM card

Open the back cover from the bottom right corner of the phone (see figure 1) and insert your SIM card (see figure 2).

Install the battery

Before starting up, please tear off the insulating sticker on the battery contacts, then install the battery and cover the back cover, please see the figure below:

Turn on/off the phone

Long press [Power] for 5 seconds, the phone

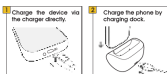
will turn on/off.

Unlock keypad

Unlock button is on the right side of the phone, you can slide it up to unlock keypad. If the unlock button is already at unlocked state, you can slide it again to unlock.

Charging

When the battery is low, please charge the phone in time. There are 2 ways for charging:

When charging, the indicator on the dock will get red, if the phone is not placed properly with the dock, the indicator will display green. Please reposition the phone until it is well placed.

Save contact

For frequent contacts, you can save their phone number in the contact list by step:



Make call

Enter the phone number on keypad, and then press **Call** to dial.

You can press **Call** to turn on "handfree" mode. See figure on the right:

Answer call

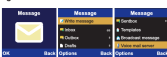
When coming call, press **Call** key to answer or press **Call** to hang up.

If there is a missed call or unread text message, the indicator on the phone will light up, you can see call history through "Call logs" menu.



Send and receive SMS

You can press **Message** button to write SMS under "Message" menu. When you receive SMS, please view it in the "Inbox". Under "Message" menu, you can set "Broadcast message" and "Voice mail server". See figure below:



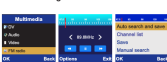

Multimedia Settings

In "Multimedia" menu, you can see sub-menu "Camera, DV, Audio, Video, FM radio", see figure on the right:

You can use **Left** key to move the cursor and press **Call** key to enter photo mode. And then press **Call** key to take photo. Using the same steps, you can use DV, Video, Audio functions.

Regarding FM radio, when you enter the menu, need use "auto search and save" in the Options menu to find out nearby radio stations. See figure below:

Bluetooth/Application

Under "Application" menu, you can see sub-menu "Calendar, Calculator, Recorder, Clock, STK, Unit conversion, Bluetooth, Internet, My list".

Regarding "Bluetooth" function, you can press **Call** key to activate it and then select "Paired device" to search for nearby Bluetooth device. See figure below:



Settings

In "Settings" menu, you can see sub-menu "Phone settings, Call settings, Profiles, Display, Security, Connections".

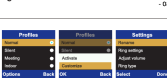
► Phone settings
Time& date, language settings, shortcut settings, auto power on/off, restore factory settings.

In "Phone settings" menu, you can restore the phone to factory settings. Please backup your data before restore factory setting, the data will be lost after restore factory. The default restore factory password is "0000".

► Call settings
Call divert, Call waiting, Call barred, Hide ID, others. See figure on the right:



► Profiles
Normal, Silent, Meeting, Indoor, Outdoor. If you want to change "Profiles" setting, press **Call** key to enter "Options" menu, and then press **Call** key to select "Customize". You will see "Rename, Ring settings, Adjust volume, Ring type, Other alert ring". See figure below:

You can also press the volume +/- keys on the left side of the phone to adjust volume.

► Display
Animation effect, Wallpaper settings, Screen saver settings, Contrast, Keypad backlight time, Auto keypad lock.

► Security
PIN Modify PIN2, Phone locked, Modify the cellphone password, Privacy, Fixed Dialing number, blacklist.
In order to avoid forgetting password and lock the phone forever, we do not recommend user to set password. Please set and keep password carefully if you use this function.

► Connections
Network account, Data service, Data Roaming, Network selection, Network type, VoLTE.
