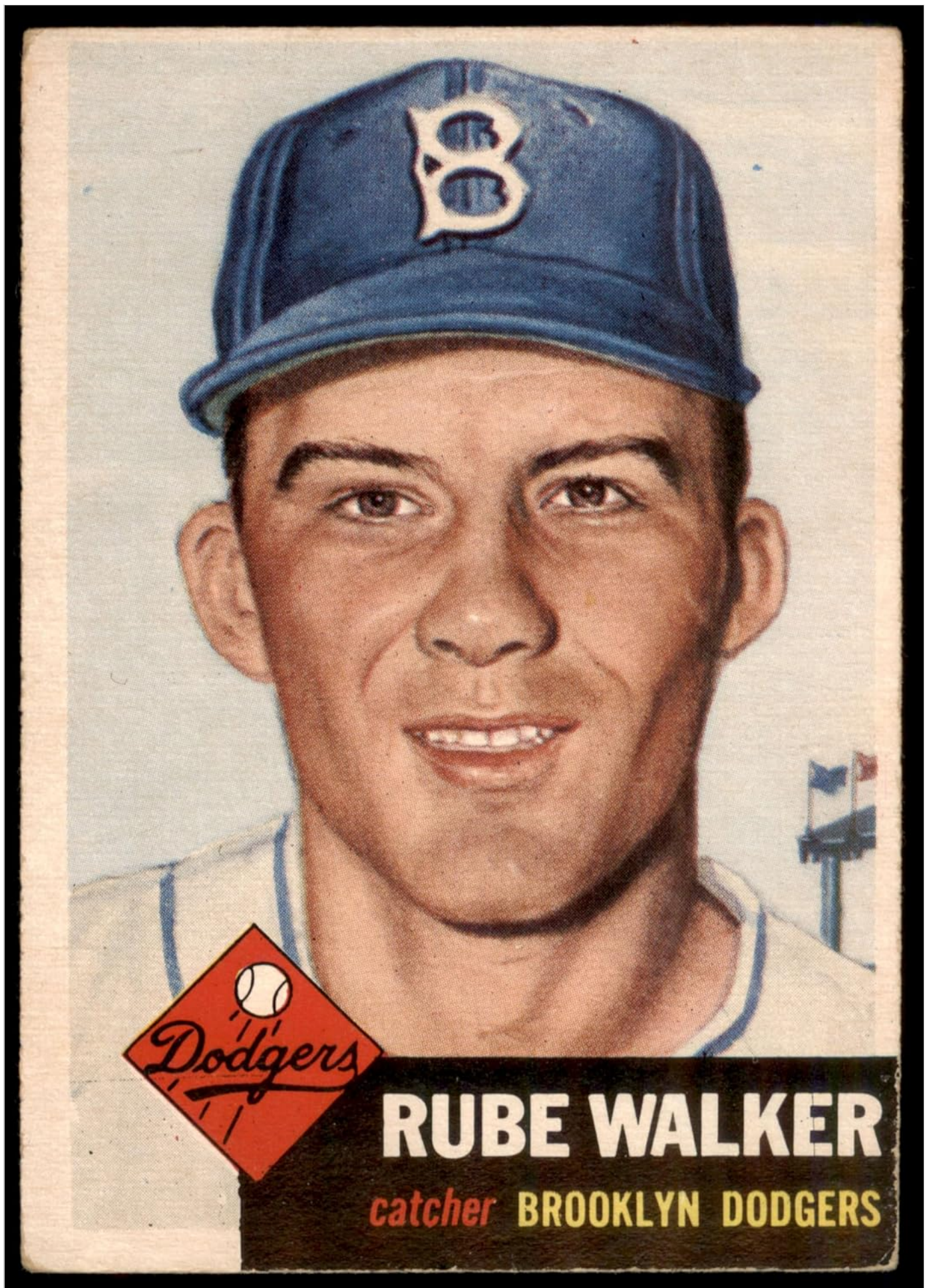

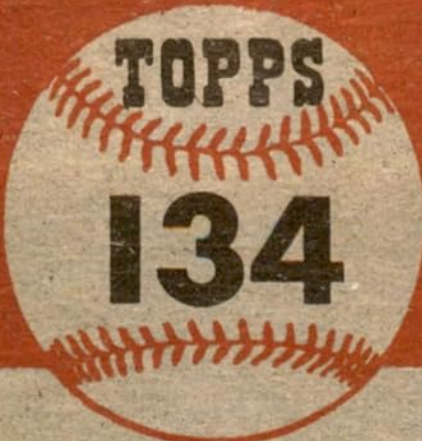

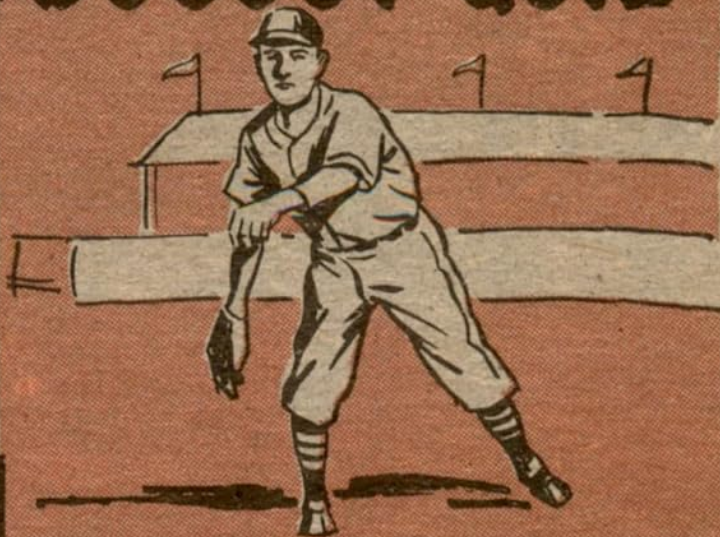
Called one of the finest catching prospects in the game by Frankie Frisch, "Rube" was with the Cubs from '48 till '51 when the Dodgers got him. He played his first pro game with Erwin in '44, went to Portsmouth in '45 and for Davenport in '46, led the Three-I League in Hitting with a .354 average. The Cubs called him up after Rube posted a .331 Batting Average and had 105 RBI's for Nashville of the Southern Association in '47.
