Essential information for the proper use and care of your Ingersoll The Herald automatic watch.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

To ensure the longevity and proper functioning of your Ingersoll The Herald watch, please observe the following guidelines:

- Avoid exposing the watch to extreme temperatures (hot or cold) or sudden temperature changes.
- Keep the watch away from strong magnetic fields, as these can affect the accuracy of the automatic movement.
- Protect the watch from severe impacts or drops.
- Ensure the crown is fully pushed in before exposing the watch to water to maintain its water resistance.

PRODUCT OVERVIEW

The Ingersoll The Herald is an automatic mechanical watch featuring a skeleton dial that showcases its intricate movement. It is designed for durability and precision.

Key Components:

- **Crown:** Used for winding the watch and setting the time.
- **Skeleton Dial:** An open dial design revealing the internal automatic movement.
- **Hands:** Hour, minute, and small seconds hands for time indication.
- **Case:** 40mm stainless steel case protecting the movement.
- **Bracelet:** Stainless steel bracelet with a butterfly clasp.

SETUP

Initial Winding

Your Ingersoll The Herald watch is an automatic mechanical timepiece. It is powered by the motion of your wrist. If the watch has stopped or has not been worn for an extended period, it may require manual winding to initiate the movement and build up its power reserve.

1. Ensure the crown is in its fully pushed-in position (Position 1).
2. Turn the crown clockwise approximately 20-30 times. This will provide sufficient power to start the watch and allow the automatic winding mechanism to take over once worn.

Setting the Time

1. Gently pull the crown out to Position 2.
2. Turn the crown clockwise or counter-clockwise to adjust the hour and minute hands to the correct time.
3. Once the time is set, push the crown back into Position 1 to engage the movement and ensure water resistance.

Adjusting the Bracelet

The stainless steel bracelet is equipped with a butterfly clasp. For proper fit, the bracelet may need to be adjusted by removing or adding links. It is recommended to have this adjustment performed by a professional jeweler or watchmaker to prevent damage to the bracelet or clasp.

OPERATING YOUR WATCH

Automatic Movement

The automatic movement in your Ingersoll The Herald watch is self-winding. It harnesses energy from the natural motion of your wrist throughout the day. When worn regularly, the watch will maintain its power reserve without manual winding. If the watch is not worn for approximately 36-40 hours, the power reserve will deplete, and the watch will stop. In this case, follow the initial winding instructions in the Setup section.

Small Seconds Sub-dial

The watch features a small sub-dial, typically located at the 6 o'clock position, which displays the running seconds. This is a common feature in many mechanical watches and provides a continuous indication that the watch is operating.

Water Resistance

Your watch is water resistant up to 5 ATM (50 meters). This means it is suitable for everyday use and can withstand splashes, rain, and brief immersion in water, such as showering or swimming in shallow water. It is **not** suitable for diving, snorkeling, or high-impact water sports. Always ensure the crown is fully pushed in before any contact with water.

MAINTENANCE

Cleaning

To keep your watch in optimal condition:

- Wipe the case and crystal with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth regularly.
- For the stainless steel bracelet, you can use a slightly damp cloth with mild soap and water, then dry thoroughly. Avoid harsh chemicals or abrasive materials.

Storage

When not wearing your watch, store it in its original presentation box or a watch winder to protect it from dust, moisture, and

accidental damage. A watch winder can also keep the automatic movement running, eliminating the need for manual winding when you next wear it.

Professional Servicing

Automatic mechanical watches benefit from periodic professional servicing, typically every 3-5 years. This involves cleaning, lubricating, and regulating the movement to ensure continued accuracy and performance. Contact an authorized Ingersoll service center or a reputable watchmaker for servicing.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Watch has stopped	Insufficient power reserve (not worn or wound enough).	Manually wind the watch by turning the crown clockwise 20-30 times. Wear the watch regularly.
Time is inaccurate	Exposure to strong magnetic fields; needs regulation; low power reserve.	Demagnetize the watch (professional service recommended). Ensure sufficient power reserve. If problem persists, seek professional servicing.
Moisture inside the watch	Crown not fully pushed in; seal compromise.	Immediately contact an authorized service center. Do not attempt to open the watch yourself.
