1. INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the Bigzzia Aquajack 600 Cordless Robotic Pool Cleaner manual. This document provides essential information for the safe and efficient operation, maintenance, and troubleshooting of your new pool cleaner. Please read thoroughly before first use to ensure proper functionality and longevity of the product.

2. IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

To prevent injury or damage, always observe the following safety precautions:

- Do not operate the cleaner out of water.
- Ensure the power button is in the OFF position before handling the cleaner outside of the pool.
- The cleaner is not designed for climbing walls or stairs.
- This device is not intended for cleaning algae.
- Use the cleaner exclusively on flat-bottomed pools. It is not suitable for very large in-ground pools.
- The filter capacity is 180µm. It may not collect ultra-fine dust (nanoscale: 1 to 100 µm).
- Keep the cleaner and its accessories out of reach of children.
- Do not handle the charger or cleaner with wet hands.
- Only use the charging adapter provided by the manufacturer.
- If the power cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent, or similarly qualified persons to avoid a hazard.

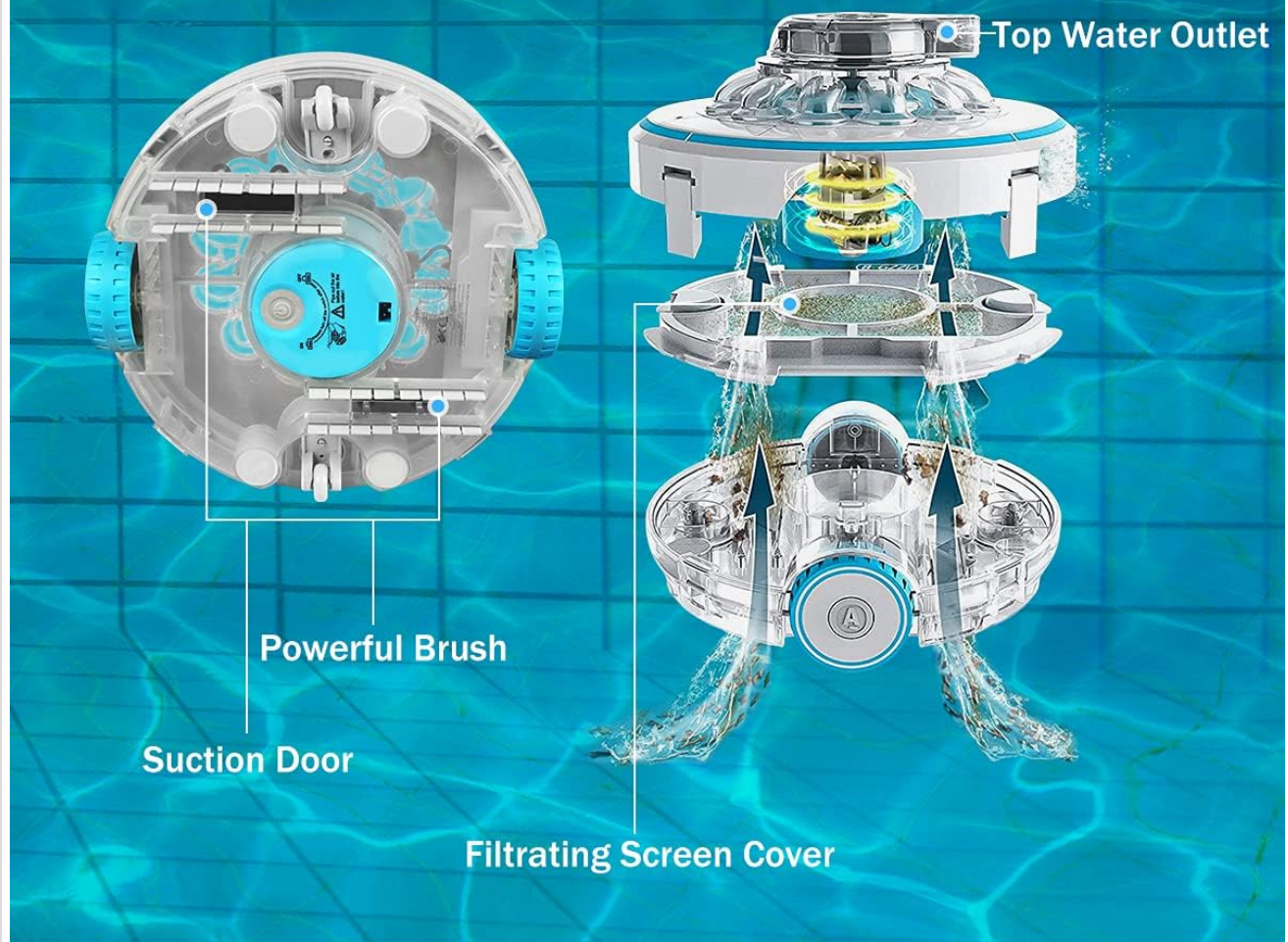

3. Allow the unit to charge completely. The charging indicator light will change to signify a full charge.

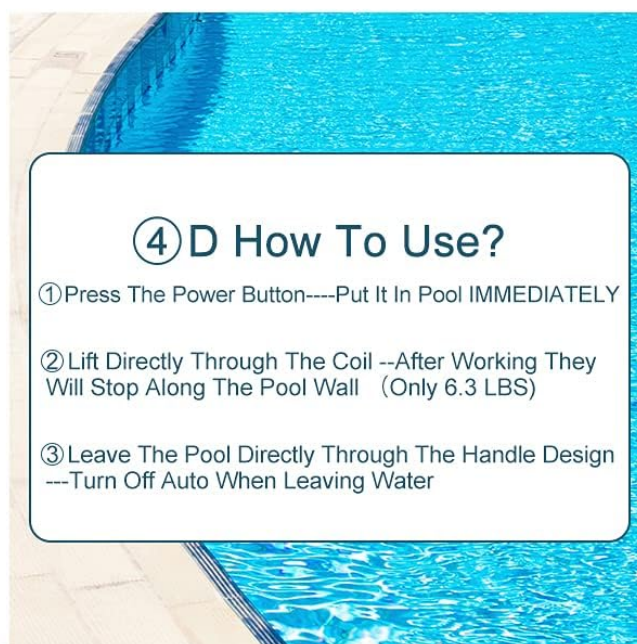

6.3. Retrieving the Cleaner

Once the cleaning cycle is complete or the battery is low, the cleaner will stop. Use the pull string to retrieve it from the pool.

1. Gently pull the cleaner towards the edge of the pool using the pull string.
2. Lift the cleaner out of the water using its integrated handle.
3. Turn off the power switch once the cleaner is out of the water.

7. MAINTENANCE AND CARE

7.1. Cleaning the Filter Tray

Regular cleaning of the filter tray is crucial for optimal performance and to prevent debris buildup.

1. Remove the top cover of the cleaner by unlatching the clips.
2. Lift out the filter tray/debris compartment.
3. Empty any collected debris into a waste bin.
4. Rinse the filter tray thoroughly with clean water to remove any remaining particles.
5. Reassemble the cleaner, ensuring all parts are securely in place before next use.

7.2. Storage

8. TROUBLESHOOTING

Refer to the table below for common issues and their solutions:

Problem	Solution
Cleaner does not start when placed in water.	Ensure the power button is pressed ON. The cleaner activates only when submerged in water. Check the battery charge level.
Cleaner stops prematurely.	The battery may be low; recharge the unit. Check for large debris obstructing movement or the suction inlet.
Poor cleaning performance.	Clean the filter tray thoroughly. Ensure the pool water chemistry is balanced. Check for any obstructions in the suction area.
Cleaner gets stuck.	Remove any large obstacles from the pool. The cleaner is designed for flat-bottomed pools and may struggle with uneven surfaces or stairs.
