Introduction

IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION

To reduce the risk of burns, electric shock, fire, or injury, this product must be used in accordance with the following instructions:

- Do not use with infants, children, incapacitated persons, or anyone insensitive to heat.
- Never use the blanket if it is wet.
- Ensure the control unit is not covered or placed under the blanket during operation to prevent overheating.
- Do not use pins or other metallic objects with this blanket as they may damage the wiring.
- Always unplug the blanket from the power outlet when not in use.
- Regularly inspect the blanket for any signs of wear or damage. If damaged, discontinue use immediately.
- This blanket is equipped with an overheat protection system and an auto shut-off feature for safety.



SETUP

- 1. **Unpack the Blanket:** Carefully remove the electric blanket from its packaging. Ensure all components, including the blanket and controller, are present and undamaged.
- 2. **Position the Blanket:** Lay the electric blanket flat on your bed, ensuring it is spread evenly without any folds or creases. The connector for the control unit should be positioned at the foot end of the bed for optimal use.
- 3. **Connect the Controller:** Locate the connector on the blanket and firmly plug in the control unit. Ensure a secure connection.
- 4. Plug into Power: Plug the power cord of the control unit into a standard 120V AC electrical outlet.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Maintenance and Care

Proper care ensures the longevity and performance of your electric blanket. Always follow these instructions:

- 1. **Disconnect Controller:** Before cleaning, always ensure the blanket is turned off and unplugged from the wall outlet. Detach the control unit from the blanket by gently pulling the connector.
- 2. Machine Wash: The blanket is machine washable. Use a gentle cycle with cold water. Do not bleach.
- 3. **Drying:** Tumble dry on low heat or line dry. Ensure the blanket is completely dry before reattaching the controller and using it. Do not iron or dry-clean.
- 4. **Storage:** When not in use, store the blanket in a cool, dry place. Avoid folding it tightly or placing heavy objects on it, which could damage the internal wiring.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Blanket not heating	Power cord not plugged in, controller not connected securely, or auto shut-off activated.	Ensure power cord is firmly plugged into a working outlet. Check that the controller is securely attached to the blanket. If the auto shut-off timer has expired, restart the blanket.
Controller display not working	No power or controller malfunction.	Verify the blanket is plugged into a live outlet. Try unplugging and replugging the controller. If the issue persists, contact customer support.
Blanket feels too hot/cold	Incorrect heat setting.	Adjust the heat setting using the '+' or '-' buttons on the controller to your preferred comfort level.
