UNIWA F100 4G LTE PoC Radio Smartphone User Manual

1. INTRODUCTION

Thank you for choosing the UNIWA F100 4G LTE PoC Radio Smartphone. This device combines the functionality of a modern smartphone with the robust features of a Push-to-Talk over Cellular (PoC) radio, designed for reliable communication in various environments. It features a durable IP54 waterproof rating, a powerful 3800mAh battery, and runs on Android 10.0, offering a versatile and resilient communication tool. Please read this manual carefully to ensure proper use and maintenance of your device.

2. PACKAGE CONTENTS

3. DEVICE LAYOUT

Familiarize yourself with the physical components of your UNIWA F100 device.

- **Front:** 4-inch IPS WVGA Touchscreen, Front Camera, Earpiece.
- **Left Side:** Volume Up/Down Buttons, Push-to-Talk (PTT) Button.
- **Right Side:** Power/Lock Button.
- **Top:** Antenna, SOS Button.
- **Bottom:** USB Charging Port, Microphone.
- **Rear:** Rear Camera, LED Flash, Loudspeaker, NFC Area.

4. SETUP

4.1. SIM Card and MicroSD Card Installation

The UNIWA F100 supports dual SIM cards and one MicroSD card for expanded storage (up to 128GB).

1. Power off the device completely.
2. Remove the battery cover on the back of the device.
3. Carefully insert the SIM card(s) into the designated SIM slots. Ensure the gold contacts face downwards.
4. If using a MicroSD card, insert it into the MicroSD card slot.
5. Replace the battery cover, ensuring it clicks securely into place to maintain IP54 rating.

4.2. Battery Installation and Charging

The device comes with a removable 3800mAh Li-polymer battery.

1. After installing SIM/MicroSD cards, insert the battery into the battery compartment, aligning the contacts.
2. Replace the battery cover.
3. Connect the USB cable to the device's charging port and the other end to the power adapter. Plug the adapter into a power outlet.
4. Alternatively, place the device into the charging dock (if purchased) to charge.
5. Allow the device to fully charge before first use. The charging indicator will show the charging status.

4.3. Initial Power On

Press and hold the Power button on the right side of the device until the UNIWA logo appears. Follow the on-screen prompts to complete the initial setup, including language selection, Wi-Fi connection, and Google account setup.

5. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1. Basic Navigation

- **Touchscreen:** Tap, swipe, pinch-to-zoom as you would on any Android smartphone.
- **Volume Buttons:** Adjust media volume during playback or call volume during a call.
- **Power Button:** Short press to lock/unlock the screen. Long press to power off or restart the device.

5.2. Making Calls

Use the standard Phone application to dial numbers or select contacts for voice calls over the cellular network.

5.3. Using PoC (Push-to-Talk over Cellular)

The UNIWA F100 is designed for PoC communication, often utilizing applications like Zello.

1. Ensure you have a PoC application (e.g., Zello) installed and configured with your account and channels.
2. Select the desired channel or contact within the PoC application.
3. Press and hold the dedicated PTT button on the left side of the device to transmit your voice. Release to listen.
4. The $\phi 36$ loudspeaker ensures clear audio even in noisy environments.

5.4. Camera Usage

The device features an 8MP rear camera and a 5MP front camera.

- Open the Camera application from the home screen or app drawer.
- Tap the shutter button to take photos or switch to video mode to record.
- Use the settings within the app to adjust camera parameters.

5.5. NFC Functionality

The UNIWA F100 supports Near Field Communication (NFC) for quick pairing with other NFC-enabled devices or for mobile payments.

- Enable NFC in the device settings (Settings > Connected devices > Connection preferences > NFC).
- Tap the back of your device near another NFC-enabled device or tag to initiate a connection or transaction.

5.6. SOS Function

The dedicated SOS button on the top of the device can be configured for emergency situations.

- Go to Settings to configure emergency contacts and messages for the SOS function.
- In an emergency, press the SOS button to activate the pre-set emergency actions (e.g., sending an SOS message with location, dialing an emergency contact).

6. MAINTENANCE

6.1. Cleaning Your Device

To keep your device in optimal condition, clean it regularly.

- Use a soft, lint-free cloth to wipe the screen and body.
- For stubborn dirt, slightly dampen the cloth with water or a screen cleaner.
- Avoid using harsh chemicals, abrasive cleaners, or aerosols.
- Ensure all port covers are securely closed before cleaning with any moisture.

6.2. Battery Care

Proper battery care extends its lifespan and ensures optimal performance.

- Avoid extreme temperatures (hot or cold) as they can degrade battery performance.
- Do not leave the device charging for excessively long periods after it's fully charged.
- If the device will not be used for an extended period, charge it to about 50% before storing.

6.3. Water and Dust Resistance (IP54)

The UNIWA F100 is rated IP54, meaning it is protected against dust ingress and splashing water from any direction.

- This rating does not mean the device is fully waterproof or submersible.
- Ensure all port covers (USB, headphone jack if present) and the battery cover are securely closed to maintain the IP54 rating.
- Avoid exposing the device to high-pressure water jets or prolonged submersion.
- If the device gets wet, dry it thoroughly before charging or opening any covers.

7. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues with your UNIWA F100, try the following solutions before seeking professional assistance.

Problem	Possible Solution
Device does not power on.	Ensure the battery is correctly installed and charged. Connect to charger and try again.
Cannot make or receive calls.	Check SIM card installation. Verify network signal strength. Ensure airplane mode is off.
PoC (Zello) not working.	Check internet connection (Wi-Fi or mobile data). Ensure the PoC app is logged in and configured correctly.
Battery drains quickly.	Reduce screen brightness. Close unused apps. Disable Wi-Fi/Bluetooth when not in use. Check for background app activity.
Device is slow or unresponsive.	Restart the device. Clear cache of frequently used apps. Consider a factory reset (backup data first).

Install SIM card

Open the back cover from the bottom right corner of the phone (see figure1) and insert your SIM card (see figure 2).

Install the battery

Before starting up, please tear off the insulating sticker on the battery contacts, then install the battery and cover the back cover, please see the figure below.

Turn on/off the phone

Long press for 5 seconds, the phone will turn on/off.

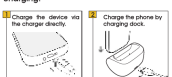
Unlock keypad

Unlock button is on the right side of the phone, you can slide it up to unlock keypad. If the unlock button is already at unlocked state, you can slide it again to unlock.

Charging

When the battery is low, please charge the phone in time. There are 2 ways for charging:

When charging, the indicator on the dock will get red, if the phone is not placed properly with the dock, the indicator will display green. Please reposition the phone until it is well placed.

Save contact

For frequent contacts, you can save their phone number in the contact list by step:



Make call

Enter the phone number on keypad, and then press to dial.

You can press to turn on "handsfree" mode. See figure on the right:

Answer call

When coming call, press key to answer or press to hang up.

If there is a missed call or unread text message, the indicator on the phone will light up, you can see call history through "Call log" menu.

Send and receive SMS

You can press button to write SMS under "Message" menu. When you receive SMS, please view it in the "Inbox". Under "Message" menu, you can set "Broadcast message" and "Voice mail server". See figure below.

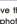

You can use  to move the cursor and press  key to enter photo mode. And then press  key to take photo. Using the same steps, you can use DV, Video, Audio functions.

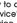
Regarding FM radio, when you enter the menu, need use "auto search and save" in the Options menu to find out nearby radio stations. See figure below:

Time& date, language settings, shortcut settings, auto power on/off, restore factory settings".

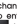
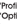
In "Phone settings" menu, you can restore the phone to factory settings. **Please backup your data before restore factory setting, the data will be lost after restore factory. The default restore factory password is "0000"**

Call settings

Call divert, Call waiting, Call barred, Hide ID, others. See figure on the right:



Profiles

Normal, Silent, Meeting, Indoor, Outdoor. If you want to change "Profile" setting, press  key to enter "Options" menu, and then press  key to select "Customize". You will see "Rename, Ring settings, Adjust volume, Ring type, Other alert ring". See figure below:



You can also press the volume +/- keys on the left side of the phone to adjust volume.

Display

Animation effect, Wallpaper settings, Screen saver settings, Contrast, keypad backlight time, Auto keypad lock.

Security

PIN Modify PIN2, Phone locked, Modify the cellphone passwords, Privacy, Fixed Dialing number, blacklist.

In order to avoid forgetting password and lock the phone screen, we do not recommend user to set password. Please set and keep password carefully if you use this function.

Connections

Network account, Data service, Data Roaming, Network selection, Network type, VoLTE.

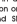
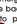
Speed Dial

For some frequent contacts, "Speed dial" can dial them quickly. Key 2~9 can be set as speed dial keys. See figure below:



After the frequent contact is set, press the corresponding key for 5 seconds, the phone will call the corresponding person automatically.

SOS Settings

When user is in an emergency, helpline can press  button on the back of the phone to call and send SMS to pre-set emergency contacts by pressing  button for 5 seconds. You can pre-set 5 contacts and 1 SOS message. See figure below:



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Torch light

You can slide up/down key on left side of the phone to turn on/off torch light.

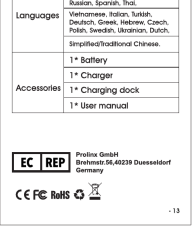
