# Deerma DX115C Handheld Vacuum Cleaner User Manual

MODEL: DX115C

## 1. Introduction

Thank you for purchasing the Deerma DX115C Handheld Vacuum Cleaner. This manual provides essential information for the safe and efficient use, assembly, operation, and maintenance of your vacuum cleaner. Please read these instructions thoroughly before first use and retain them for future reference.

## 2. Safety Instructions

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or injury, always follow basic safety precautions when using an electrical appliance:

- Ensure the power supply voltage matches the voltage specified on the vacuum cleaner.
- Do not use the vacuum cleaner outdoors or on wet surfaces.
- Do not allow the vacuum cleaner to be used as a toy. Close attention is necessary when used by or near children.
- Unplug from the electrical outlet when not in use and before cleaning or servicing.
- Do not handle the plug or vacuum cleaner with wet hands.
- Do not vacuum flammable or combustible liquids, such as gasoline, or use in areas where they may be present.
- Do not vacuum anything that is burning or smoking, such as cigarettes, matches, or hot ashes.
- Do not use without the dust cup and filter properly in place.
- Use only as described in this manual. Use only manufacturer's recommended attachments.
- If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer or its service agent to avoid a hazard.

### 3. Package Contents

Carefully unpack your Deerma DX115C and check that all items are present and in good condition. The package should include:

- Main Vacuum Unit
- Extension Tube (for stick mode)
- Floor Brush
- Crevice Tool
- Brush Nozzle
- Filter (pre-installed in dust cup)
- User Manual

## 4. Product Overview

The Deerma DX115C is a versatile vacuum cleaner designed for both handheld and stick operation. It features a powerful motor and a multi-layer filtration system.

### Key Parts:

- **Main Unit:** Contains the motor, dust cup, and filter.
- **Power Button:** Located on the main unit for easy operation.
- **Dust Cup:** Transparent container for collecting dust and debris.
- **Filter System:** Multi-layer filtration, including a washable filter.
- **Extension Tube:** Connects the main unit to the floor brush for stick vacuuming.
- **Floor Brush:** For cleaning hard floors and carpets.

- **Crevice Tool:** For narrow spaces and corners.
  - **Brush Nozzle:** For upholstery, curtains, and delicate surfaces.

## 5. Assembly and Setup

### 5.1 Handheld Mode Assembly

1. Ensure the dust cup and filter are securely attached to the main vacuum unit.
2. Select the desired attachment (crevice tool or brush nozzle) and firmly insert it into the suction opening of the main unit.

### 5.2 Stick Mode Assembly

1. Attach the extension tube to the main vacuum unit by aligning the connectors and pushing until it clicks into place.
2. Attach the floor brush to the other end of the extension tube, ensuring it is securely fastened.
3. Ensure the dust cup and filter are properly installed in the main unit.

## 6. Operating Instructions

### 6.1 Powering On/Off

Plug the power cord into a suitable electrical outlet (220V). Press the power button located on the main unit to turn the vacuum cleaner on. Press it again to turn it off.

### 6.2 Using in Handheld Mode

This mode is ideal for cleaning small spills, car interiors, upholstery, and hard-to-reach areas. Attach the crevice tool for tight spaces or the brush nozzle for delicate surfaces.

### 6.3 Using in Stick Mode

For larger floor areas, assemble the vacuum in stick mode with the extension tube and floor brush. This configuration is suitable for both hard floors and low-pile carpets.

## 7. Maintenance and Cleaning

Regular maintenance ensures optimal performance and extends the life of your vacuum cleaner.

### 7.1 Emptying the Dust Cup

1. Ensure the vacuum cleaner is unplugged from the power outlet.
2. Detach the dust cup from the main unit.
3. Open the dust cup and empty its contents into a waste bin.

### 7.2 Cleaning the Filter

The Deerma DX115C features a washable and reusable filter. Clean the filter regularly to maintain suction power.

1. With the dust cup detached, carefully remove the filter.
2. Rinse the filter under running water until clean. Do not use detergent.



3. Allow the filter to air dry completely for at least 24 hours before reinserting it into the dust cup. Do not use the vacuum with a wet filter.
4. Reassemble the filter and dust cup onto the main unit.

### 7.3 Cleaning Attachments

Wipe attachments with a damp cloth as needed. Ensure they are dry before storage.

## 8. Troubleshooting

If you encounter issues with your vacuum cleaner, refer to the following table:

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Vacuum does not turn on	Not plugged in; Power outlet fault; Power button not pressed	Check power cord connection; Test outlet with another device; Press power button firmly
Low suction power	Dust cup full; Filter clogged; Obstruction in nozzle/hose	Empty dust cup; Clean or replace filter; Remove obstruction
Unusual noise	Obstruction in fan/motor area; Loose parts	Unplug and check for obstructions; Ensure all parts are securely assembled
Overheating	Clogged filter or dust cup; Prolonged use	Clean dust cup and filter; Allow vacuum to cool down before resuming use
