- The unit features **overheat protection at 104°F (40°C)**. If the heater overheats, it will automatically shut off. Allow it to cool before restarting.
- Maintain clear space around the heater. Do not block air inlets or outlets.
- Operate on a stable, level surface to prevent tipping.
- This heater operates combustion-free, producing no fuel spills or odors.
- The product is **UL approved**, indicating compliance with safety standards.

PRODUCT OVERVIEW

SETUP

- Unpack:** Carefully remove the heater from its packaging. Retain packaging for future storage or transport.
- Placement:** Position the heater on a firm, level surface. Ensure there is adequate clearance (at least 3 feet or 0.9 meters) from walls, furniture, drapes, and other combustible materials. Do not place the heater directly under a power outlet.
- Power Connection:** Verify that your power supply matches the heater's requirements (240 Volts, 25 Amps). Plug the heater's power cord directly into a dedicated 240V outlet. Do not use extension cords or power strips.
- Initial Inspection:** Before first use, inspect the power cord and plug for any damage. Ensure the air inlet and outlet grilles are clear of obstructions.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

- Power On:** Once properly set up and plugged in, the heater is ready for operation.
- Adjust Thermostat:** Locate the ambient thermostat control. Rotate the dial to your desired temperature setting within the range of 32°F to 100°F (0°C to 38°C). The heater will activate to reach and maintain the set temperature.
- Overheat Protection:** If the internal temperature exceeds 104°F (40°C), the heater will automatically shut off. To reset, unplug the heater, allow it to cool for at least 30 minutes, then plug it back in. Address any potential causes of overheating, such as blocked air vents.
- Power Off:** To turn off the heater, rotate the thermostat dial to its lowest setting or unplug the unit from the power outlet.

MAINTENANCE

Regular maintenance ensures optimal performance and extends the life of your heater. Always unplug the heater before performing any maintenance.

- Cleaning:** Use a soft, damp cloth to wipe the exterior surfaces of the heater. Do not use abrasive cleaners or solvents. Ensure no moisture enters the internal components.
- Air Vents:** Periodically check and clean the air inlet and outlet grilles to ensure they are free from dust, lint, or other obstructions. A vacuum cleaner with a brush attachment can be used.
- Storage:** When not in use, store the heater in a cool, dry place. It is recommended to use the original

packaging for protection.

- **Cord Care:** Do not wrap the power cord tightly around the heater. Avoid kinking or damaging the cord.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Heater does not turn on	No power, tripped circuit breaker, loose connection	Check power outlet, reset circuit breaker, ensure plug is fully inserted.
Heater turns on but no heat	Thermostat set too low, overheat protection activated	Increase thermostat setting. If overheat protection activated, unplug, allow to cool, then restart.
Heater cycles on and off frequently	Thermostat setting too close to ambient temperature, poor air circulation	Adjust thermostat. Ensure air inlets/outlets are clear and heater is not in an enclosed space.
Unusual noise or odor	Dust accumulation, foreign object, internal issue	Unplug immediately. Clean air vents. If problem persists, discontinue use and contact customer support.
