INTRODUCTION

Thank you for purchasing the Utopia Home 1800W Steam Iron. This manual provides essential information for the safe and efficient operation, maintenance, and care of your appliance. Please read these instructions thoroughly before first use and retain them for future reference.

IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

When using electrical appliances, basic safety precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, and personal injury. Read all instructions before using this iron.

- Use the iron only for its intended purpose.
- To protect against the risk of electric shock, do not immerse the iron in water or other liquids.
- Always turn the iron OFF before plugging or unplugging from the outlet. Never yank cord to disconnect from outlet; instead, grasp plug and pull to disconnect.
- Do not allow cord to touch hot surfaces. Let the iron cool completely before putting away. Loop cord loosely around the iron when storing.
- The iron should always be turned to OFF before plugging or unplugging from the outlet.
- Do not operate the iron with a damaged cord or if the iron has been dropped or damaged. To avoid the risk of electric shock, do not disassemble the iron.
- Close supervision is necessary for any appliance being used by or near children. Do not leave the iron unattended while connected or on an ironing board.
- Burns can occur from touching hot metal parts, hot water, or steam. Use caution when you turn a steam iron upside down – there may be hot water in the reservoir.
- This appliance is for household use only.

- **Automatic Shut-off Feature:** For enhanced safety, the iron automatically turns off in three different positions: when left unattended for 30 seconds on its side, lying flat on the soleplate, or after 8 minutes of inactivity in an upright position.

SETUP

Before First Use

- Remove any labels or protective film from the soleplate.
- It is recommended to test the iron on an old piece of fabric before using it on garments to ensure no residue is left from manufacturing.
- You may notice a slight odor or some smoke during the first few minutes of use. This is normal and will disappear quickly.
- Note: Each iron is water-tested during manufacturing to ensure quality. You may find residual water droplets inside the water tank; this is normal and does not indicate a used item.

NOTE: NOT A USED ITEM

All Utopia Home Steam Irons are Tested by Water.

We test each of our steam iron by water to ensure the quality and safety of the product.
Please do not worry if you find water droplets inside.

Filling the Water Tank

1. Ensure the iron is unplugged from the power outlet and the steam knob is set to the "DRY" position (minimum steam).
2. Open the water filling cover.
3. Using a measuring cup, carefully pour tap water into the water tank up to the "MAX" fill line. Do not overfill. For areas with hard water, distilled or demineralized water is recommended to prevent mineral buildup.
4. Close the water filling cover securely.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

Temperature and Fabric Selection

- Always check the garment's care label for ironing instructions.
- Turn the temperature adjust knob to the desired setting based on the fabric type (e.g., Nylon, Silk, Wool, Cotton, Linen).
- Plug the iron into a suitable power outlet (1800W). The indicator light will illuminate, indicating the

iron is heating.

- Wait until the indicator light turns off, signaling that the selected temperature has been reached.

Steam Ironing

- Ensure the water tank is filled.
- Set the temperature adjust knob to the "STEAM" range (usually Wool, Cotton, Linen settings). Steam will not be produced at lower temperatures to prevent water leakage.
- Once the iron reaches the set temperature (indicator light off), adjust the steam knob to the desired steam level.
- Begin ironing. The iron's non-stick soleplate will glide smoothly over fabrics.

Dry Ironing

- Ensure the water tank is empty or the steam knob is set to the "DRY" position.
- Set the temperature adjust knob to the desired setting.
- Wait for the indicator light to turn off.
- Iron the garment without steam.

Vertical Steaming

The iron can be used vertically to remove wrinkles from hanging garments, curtains, or drapes.

- Fill the water tank.
- Set the temperature to a high setting (e.g., Linen or Cotton) and allow the iron to heat up fully.
- Hold the iron in a vertical position, a few inches away from the fabric.
- Press the burst steam button repeatedly to release powerful bursts of steam onto the fabric.

Spray Function

- Press the spray button to release a fine mist of water onto the fabric, which helps to dampen stubborn wrinkles.

Burst of Steam

- For extra stubborn wrinkles, press the burst steam button. This releases a powerful shot of steam.
- Allow a few seconds between bursts for the steam to regenerate.

MAINTENANCE

Self-Clean Function

The self-clean function helps to remove mineral deposits and impurities from the steam chamber.

1. Fill the water tank to the "MAX" line.
2. Plug in the iron and set the temperature control to the maximum setting.
3. Once the iron reaches maximum temperature (indicator light off), unplug the iron.
4. Hold the iron horizontally over a sink.
5. Press and hold the self-clean button (often integrated with the steam knob or a separate button). Hot water and steam will be expelled from the soleplate, flushing out mineral deposits.
6. Gently rock the iron back and forth until the water tank is empty.
7. Plug the iron back in and allow it to heat up to dry the soleplate. Unplug and store once cool.
8. Perform this function monthly or as needed, especially if you use tap water.

Cleaning the Soleplate

- After each use, ensure the iron is unplugged and completely cool.

- Wipe the soleplate with a damp cloth and a non-abrasive cleaner if necessary. Do not use metallic scouring pads or harsh abrasives.

Storage

- Ensure the iron is unplugged and completely cool before storing.
- Empty any remaining water from the tank.
- Store the iron upright on its heel rest to prevent damage to the soleplate.
- Wrap the 8-foot swivel cord loosely around the base of the iron.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Iron does not heat up.	Not plugged in; power outlet fault; automatic shut-off activated; temperature dial set to OFF.	Check power connection; try another outlet; move the iron to reactivate; turn temperature dial to a fabric setting.
No steam or insufficient steam.	Water tank empty; temperature too low; steam knob set to DRY; mineral buildup.	Fill water tank; set temperature to steam range (Wool, Cotton, Linen); adjust steam knob; perform self-clean function.
Water leaks from soleplate.	Temperature too low for steam; water tank overfilled; steam knob not fully closed for dry ironing.	Increase temperature to steam range; do not overfill past MAX line; ensure steam knob is on DRY for dry ironing.
White flakes or residue on clothes.	Mineral buildup in the iron.	Perform self-clean function. Use distilled water in hard water areas.
Iron smells or smokes on first use.	Normal burning off of manufacturing residues.	This is normal and will subside after a few minutes of initial use. Ensure good ventilation.
