1. PRODUCT OVERVIEW

This retro-designed compact fridge offers a cool, colorful, and sophisticated look for any setting. The 3.1 cu. ft. freezer/refrigerator is an ideal fit for your home, dorm, or office, saving space while keeping your favorite foods and beverages within reach. The double-door design allows for easy access to salads, fruits, and snacks throughout your day, and the unit's spacious freezer capacity saves you money as you store frozen foods in bulk. Manual defrost maintains optimal temperature with the turn of a dial. Built-in door shelves and the beverage can dispenser make food storage simple, accommodating 2-liter bottles, six (6) 12 oz. drinks, and assorted condiments. Two adjustable, removable glass shelves allow for easy cleaning and viewing of your food items at-a-glance, and mechanical temperature control allows for easy selection of the unit's correct settings with the turn of a dial. This chicly designed compact fridge complements any setting.

2. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

Read all instructions before using this appliance to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, or injury.

- Ensure the appliance is properly grounded.
- Do not operate the appliance with a damaged cord or plug.
- · Keep ventilation openings clear of obstruction.
- Do not use mechanical devices or other means to accelerate the defrosting process, other than those recommended by the manufacturer.
- · Do not damage the refrigerant circuit.
- Do not use electrical appliances inside the food storage compartments, unless they are of the type recommended by the manufacturer.
- Unplug the refrigerator before cleaning or performing any maintenance.
- This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory
 or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision
 or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.
- Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.

4. Installation and Setup

4.1 Unpacking

- 1. Remove all packaging materials, including the foam base and adhesive tape.
- 2. Inspect the refrigerator for any damage. Report any damage to your retailer immediately.
- 3. Clean the interior and exterior of the refrigerator with a soft cloth and mild detergent before use.

4.2 Placement

- Place the refrigerator on a firm, level surface.
- Allow at least 5 inches (12.7 cm) of space between the back and sides of the refrigerator and any adjacent walls or cabinets for proper air circulation.
- Avoid placing the refrigerator in direct sunlight or near heat sources (e.g., stoves, heaters).
- Ensure the ambient temperature is between 50°F (10°C) and 90°F (32°C) for optimal performance.

4.3 Power Connection

Plug the refrigerator into a dedicated, grounded 120V AC outlet. Do not use extension cords or adapter plugs.

4.4 Initial Operation

After plugging in, allow the refrigerator to stand for at least 2-4 hours before loading with food. This allows the refrigerant to settle and ensures efficient cooling.

5. OPERATING YOUR REFRIGERATOR

5.1 Temperature Control

The refrigerator features a mechanical temperature control dial located inside the fresh food compartment. Turn the dial to adjust the cooling intensity. Higher numbers typically indicate colder temperatures. Start with a medium setting and adjust as needed based on your preferences and the ambient temperature.

5.2 Storage Recommendations

- Fresh Food Compartment: Ideal for fruits, vegetables, dairy products, and beverages. The adjustable glass shelves allow for flexible storage.
- Freezer Compartment: Suitable for storing frozen foods. Ensure items are properly sealed to prevent freezer burn.
- **Door Shelves:** Designed for bottles, cans, and smaller condiments. The beverage can dispenser holds standard 12 oz. cans.

6. CARE AND MAINTENANCE

6.1 Cleaning

- 1. Unplug the refrigerator from the power outlet.
- 2. Remove all food items and removable parts (shelves, crisper drawer).
- 3. Wash interior surfaces and removable parts with a solution of mild detergent and warm water. Rinse thoroughly and dry.

- 4. Clean the exterior with a soft cloth and mild detergent.
- 5. Periodically clean the condenser coils at the back of the unit with a soft brush or vacuum cleaner to maintain efficiency.

6.2 Manual Defrost

The freezer compartment requires manual defrosting when frost accumulation reaches approximately 1/4 inch (0.6 cm) thick.

- 1. Unplug the refrigerator.
- 2. Remove all food from the freezer and place it in a cooler.
- 3. Leave the freezer door open to allow frost to melt naturally. Place towels at the bottom to absorb water.
- 4. Do not use sharp objects or heating devices to remove frost, as this can damage the freezer.
- 5. Once defrosted, clean and dry the interior thoroughly before plugging the unit back in and returning food.

7. TROUBLESHOOTING GUIDE

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Refrigerator does not operate.	Not plugged in; circuit breaker tripped; temperature control set to 'OFF'.	Ensure plug is secure; reset circuit breaker; turn temperature control to desired setting.
Refrigerator is not cold enough.	Temperature control set too warm; door opened too frequently; poor ventilation; excessive food load.	Adjust temperature control to a colder setting; minimize door openings; ensure adequate clearance around unit; reduce food load temporarily.
Food in refrigerator is freezing.	Temperature control set too cold.	Adjust temperature control to a warmer setting.
Excessive frost buildup in freezer.	Freezer door not sealed properly; frequent door openings; high humidity.	Check door seal; minimize door openings; perform manual defrost.
Unusual noises.	Refrigerator not level; items rattling inside; normal compressor operation.	Adjust leveling feet; rearrange items; gurgling/humming sounds are normal.
