1. INTRODUCTION

Thank you for choosing the Zanussi ZMC25D59EB Microwave Convection Oven. This manual provides essential information for the safe and efficient operation, installation, and maintenance of your appliance. Please read these instructions thoroughly before using the microwave oven and retain them for future reference.

2. IMPORTANT SAFETY INSTRUCTIONS

To reduce the risk of fire, electric shock, injury to persons, or exposure to excessive microwave energy when using your appliance, follow basic precautions, including the following:

- Read all instructions before using the appliance.
- Do not attempt to operate this oven with the door open as this can result in harmful exposure to microwave energy.
- Do not heat liquids or other foods in sealed containers as they are liable to explode.
- Only allow children to use the oven without supervision when adequate instructions have been given so that the child is able to use the oven in a safe way and understands the hazards of improper use.
- If the door or door seals are damaged, the oven must not be operated until it has been repaired by a competent person.
- The appliance must be earthed. Connect only to a properly earthed outlet.
- Do not use corrosive chemicals or vapors in this appliance.
- Do not use this appliance for commercial purposes. It is intended for household use only.
- Always ensure the turntable and turntable support are correctly positioned before operation.

3. PRODUCT OVERVIEW

Familiarize yourself with the components of your Zanussi microwave convection oven.

3.1 Appliance Components

1. Door with handle
2. Digital Display
3. Control Panel

7. Grill Rack (for grill/convection use only)

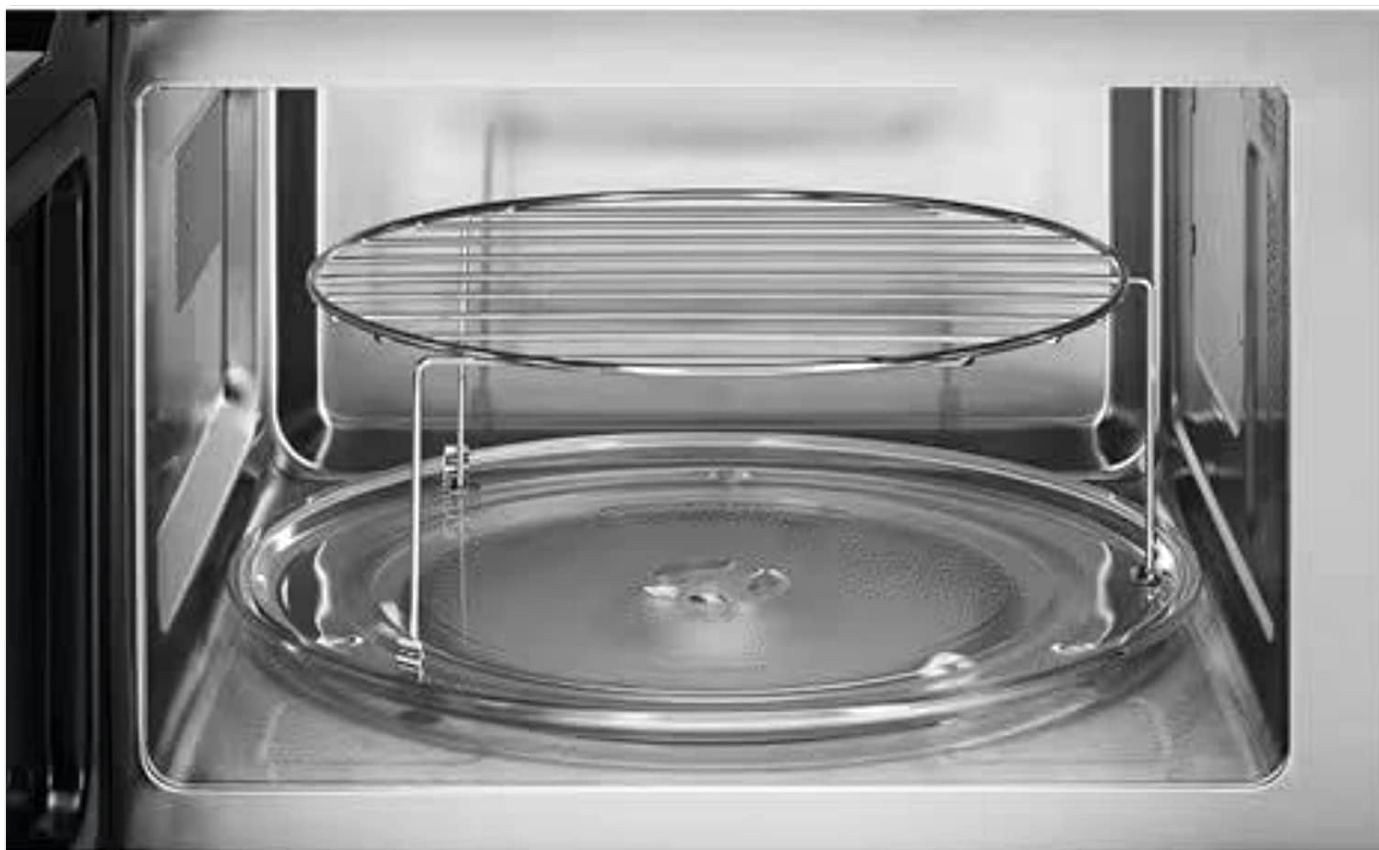


Figure 2: Interior view of the microwave oven, showing the glass turntable and the metal grill rack positioned above it. The interior is made of stainless steel.

3.2 Control Panel

The control panel features a digital display, a central control knob, and various function buttons:

- **Digital Display:** Shows time, cooking settings, and indicators.
- **Control Knob:** Used to adjust time, weight, and select menu options.
- **Microwave Button:** Selects microwave cooking mode.
- **Convection/Grill/Combi Button:** Selects convection, grill, or combination cooking modes.
- **Defrost Button:** Activates defrost by time or weight.
- **Auto Cook/Temp Button:** Accesses pre-programmed cooking menus or sets temperature for convection.
- **Start Button:** Begins cooking or confirms settings.
- **Stop/Clear Button:** Stops cooking, clears settings, or cancels a program.
- **Child Lock Indicator:** Illuminates when child lock is active.

4. SETUP AND INSTALLATION

4.1 Unpacking

Carefully remove the microwave oven and all packing materials from the carton. Check the oven for any damage, such as dents or a misaligned door. Do not operate the oven if it is damaged. Contact customer service.

4.2 Placement

- Place the oven on a flat, stable surface that can support its weight and the heaviest food item likely to be cooked in the oven.
- Ensure adequate ventilation. Leave a minimum of 20 cm (8 inches) of space above the oven, 10 cm (4 inches) at the rear, and 5 cm (2 inches) on each side.
- Do not block air vents.

- Keep the oven away from heat sources and strong magnetic fields.

4.3 Electrical Connection

Ensure the voltage specified on the rating label matches your household power supply. The appliance operates on 220V. Plug the oven into a properly installed and earthed wall socket. Do not use extension cords or adapters.

4.4 Initial Setup

- Install the turntable ring and glass tray inside the oven cavity. Ensure the glass tray is securely seated on the turntable support.
- Set the clock: When the oven is plugged in, the display will show "0:00". Rotate the control knob to set the hour, then press the "Start" button. Rotate the control knob again to set the minutes, then press "Start" to confirm.

5. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 Microwave Cooking

1. Place food in a microwave-safe container on the glass turntable.
2. Close the oven door.
3. Press the "Microwave" button repeatedly to select the desired power level (e.g., P100 for 100% power, P80 for 80%).
4. Rotate the control knob to set the cooking time.
5. Press the "Start" button to begin cooking.

5.2 Grill Cooking

Use the metal grill rack provided for grill cooking. Ensure food is placed on the grill rack.

1. Place food on the grill rack.
2. Press the "Convection/Grill/Combi" button until "Grill" or "G" appears on the display.
3. Rotate the control knob to set the cooking time.
4. Press the "Start" button to begin.

5.3 Convection Cooking

Preheating is often required for convection cooking.

1. Press the "Convection/Grill/Combi" button until "Convection" or "C" appears.
2. Press "Auto Cook/Temp" to set the desired temperature using the control knob.
3. Press "Start" to begin preheating. The oven will beep when preheating is complete.
4. Place food inside, close the door, rotate the control knob to set cooking time, and press "Start".

5.4 Combination Cooking (Combi)

This mode combines microwave and grill/convection for faster cooking and browning.

1. Press the "Convection/Grill/Combi" button to select the desired Combi mode (e.g., Combi 1, Combi 2).
2. Rotate the control knob to set the cooking time.
3. Press the "Start" button to begin.

5.5 Auto Cook Function

The oven has pre-programmed settings for various foods.

1. Press the "Auto Cook/Temp" button.

- 2. Rotate the control knob to select the desired auto cook menu (e.g., Pizza, Potato, Meat).
- 3. Press "Auto Cook/Temp" again to confirm the selection.
- 4. Rotate the control knob to select the weight or quantity of the food.
- 5. Press the "Start" button to begin cooking.

5.6 Defrost Function

Defrost food by time or weight.

- **Defrost by Weight:**
 - a. Press the "Defrost" button once.
 - b. Rotate the control knob to select the food weight.
 - c. Press "Start" to begin.
- **Defrost by Time:**
 - a. Press the "Defrost" button twice.
 - b. Rotate the control knob to set the defrosting time.
 - c. Press "Start" to begin.

5.7 Child Lock

To prevent unintended operation, especially by children:

- **Activate:** Press and hold the "Stop/Clear" button for 3 seconds. A lock indicator will appear on the display.
- **Deactivate:** Press and hold the "Stop/Clear" button for 3 seconds again. The lock indicator will disappear.

6. CLEANING AND MAINTENANCE

Regular cleaning and proper maintenance will ensure the longevity and optimal performance of your microwave oven.

- **Exterior:** Wipe the exterior with a damp cloth and mild detergent. Avoid abrasive cleaners.
- **Interior:** Clean the interior cavity after each use. For stubborn food splatters, place a bowl of water with lemon slices inside and microwave for 5-10 minutes. This will loosen food particles, making them easier to wipe away.
- **Door Seals:** Keep the door seals clean to ensure a proper seal.
- **Turntable and Support:** The glass turntable and turntable support can be washed in warm soapy water or in a dishwasher. Ensure they are completely dry before placing them back in the oven.
- **Grill Rack:** Wash the metal grill rack in warm soapy water.
- Always unplug the oven before cleaning.

7. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues with your microwave oven, refer to the following table for common problems and solutions.

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Oven does not start.	Power cord not plugged in; Door not closed properly; Fuse blown or circuit breaker tripped; Child lock activated.	Ensure power cord is securely plugged in; Close door firmly; Check household fuse/circuit breaker; Deactivate child lock (refer to section 5.7).

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Food not heating.	Incorrect power level or cooking time set; Door not closed properly.	Adjust power level and cooking time; Ensure door is fully closed.
Turntable not rotating.	Turntable not correctly placed; Turntable support dirty or damaged.	Reposition turntable and support; Clean turntable support and rollers.
Light not working.	Bulb needs replacement.	Contact qualified service personnel for bulb replacement. Do not attempt to replace it yourself.





