2. SAFETY INFORMATION

4. SETUP

4.1 Physical Installation

Your Aiwa TV supports both table-top and wall-mount installations. Choose the method suitable for your environment.

Table Stand Installation

1. Carefully place the TV screen-down on a soft, flat surface to prevent damage.
2. Attach the provided table stands to the designated slots at the bottom of the TV using the included screws.
3. Ensure the stands are securely fastened.
4. Carefully lift the TV to its upright position on a stable surface.

Wall Mount Installation

If using the wall mount, follow the instructions provided with the wall mount kit. Professional installation is recommended for wall mounting.

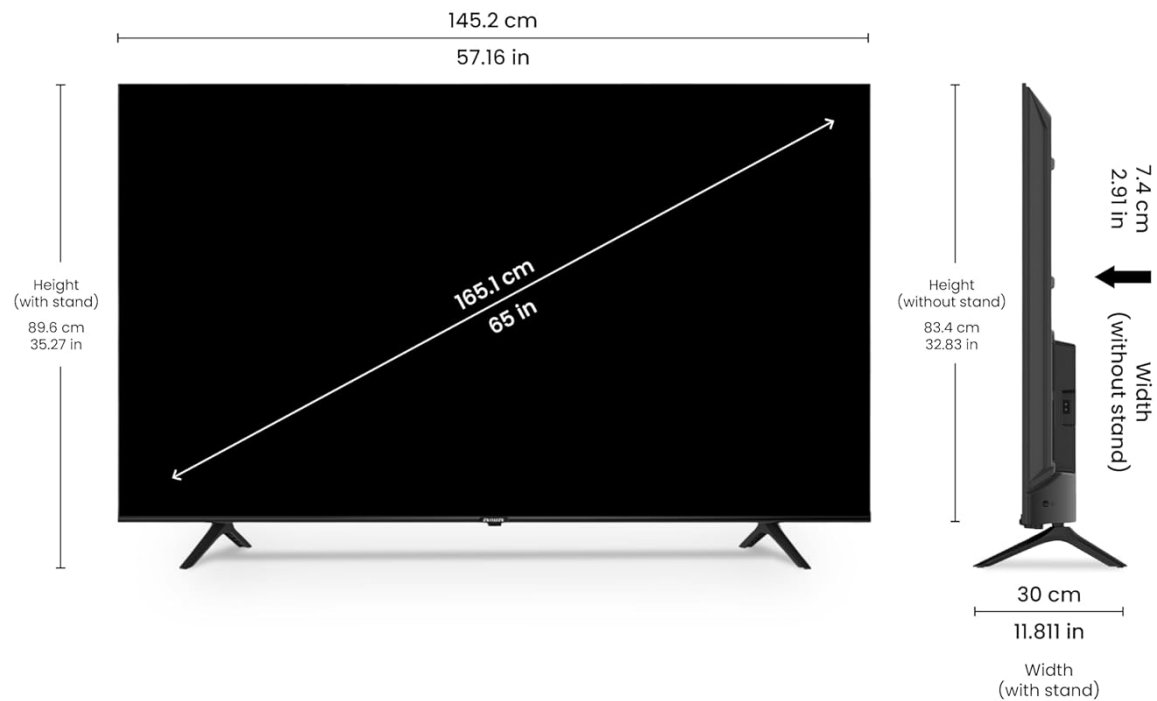


Figure 4.1: Dimensions of the Aiwa A65QUHDX3-GTV 65-inch QLED Smart TV.

- **HDMI Ports (x3):** Connect Blu-ray players, gaming consoles, set-top boxes, or other HDMI-enabled devices.
- **USB Ports (x2):** Connect USB storage devices for media playback or software updates.
- **LAN Port:** Connect an Ethernet cable for a wired internet connection.
- **Antenna In:** Connect an antenna or cable TV signal.
- **AV In:** Connect older devices using composite video and stereo audio cables.
- **Bluetooth:** Pair wireless headphones, soundbars, or other Bluetooth devices.
- **Wi-Fi:** Connect to your home wireless network for internet access.

4.3 Initial Power On and Setup Wizard

1. Connect the power cord to the TV and then to a power outlet.
2. Press the power button on the remote control or on the TV itself.
3. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the initial setup, including language selection, network connection, and Google account sign-in.

5. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 Remote Control

The included smart remote control allows for easy navigation and voice commands.

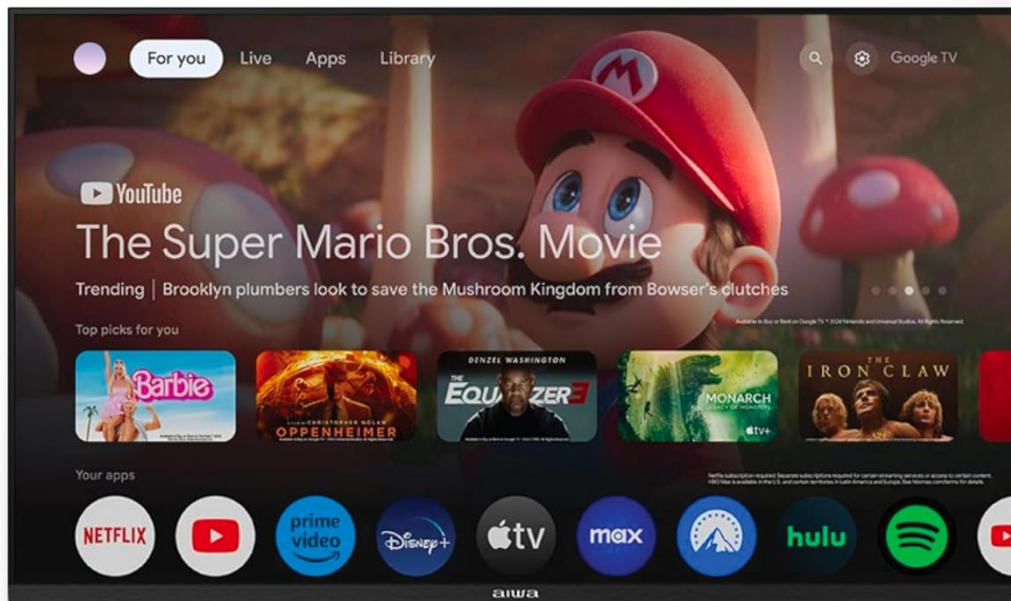


Figure 5.1: Smart Remote Control with dedicated quick access buttons for streaming services and voice control functionality.

- **Power Button:** Turns the TV on or off.
- **Navigation Pad:** Use the directional buttons to move through menus and the center button to select.
- **Back Button:** Returns to the previous screen.
- **Home Button:** Accesses the Google TV home screen.
- **Volume Up/Down:** Adjusts the audio volume.
- **Mute Button:** Mutes or unmutes the sound.
- **Voice Assistant Button:** Activates Google Assistant for voice commands.
- **Quick Access Buttons:** Dedicated buttons for Netflix, Prime Video, YouTube, and Disney+Hotstar.

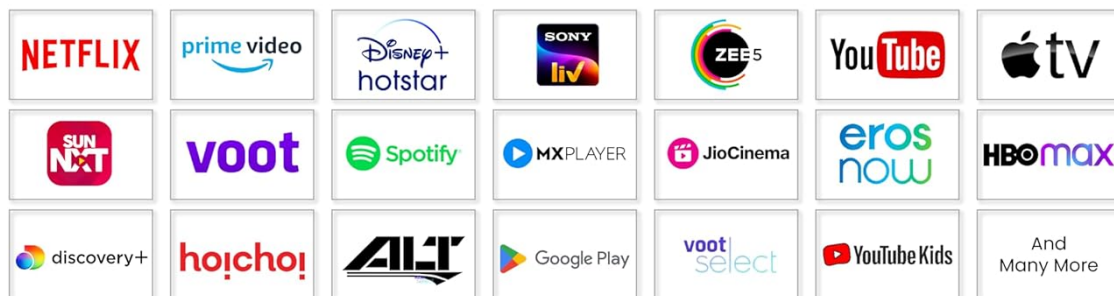


Figure 5.2: Google TV home screen displaying a wide range of applications and content.

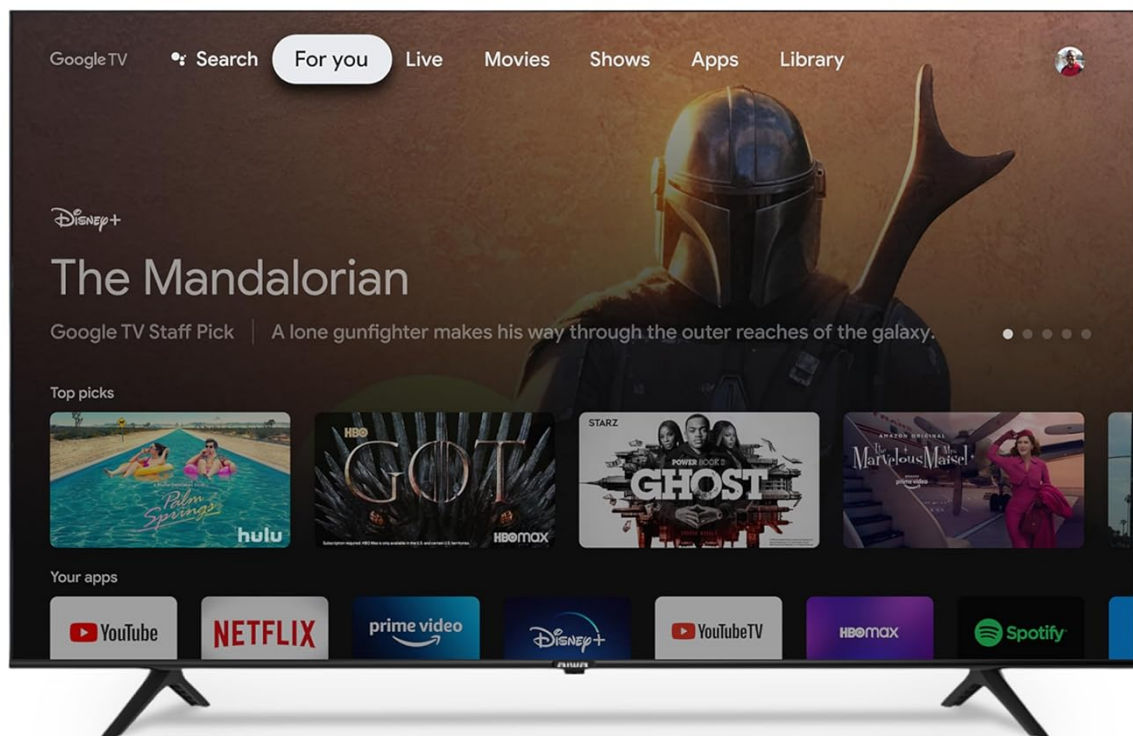


Figure 5.3: Google TV interface with personalized content suggestions.

Picture Modes

6. MAINTENANCE

6.1 Cleaning the TV

- Always unplug the TV before cleaning.
- Use a soft, dry cloth to wipe the screen and cabinet.
- For stubborn marks, lightly dampen the cloth with water or a mild, non-abrasive screen cleaner.
- Do not use alcohol, benzene, thinners, or other volatile substances.

6.2 Software Updates

Your Google TV may receive automatic software updates. Ensure your TV is connected to the internet to receive the latest features and security patches. You can also manually check for updates in the TV's settings menu.

7. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues with your TV, refer to the following common solutions:

Problem	Possible Solution
No power / TV does not turn on	Ensure the power cord is securely connected to both the TV and the power outlet. Check if the power outlet is working. Try pressing the power button on the TV itself.
No picture / Poor picture quality	Check cable connections (HDMI, Antenna). Ensure the correct input source is selected. Adjust picture settings (brightness, contrast, mode). For antenna, rescan channels.
No sound / Low sound	Check volume level and ensure TV is not muted. Verify audio cable connections if using external speakers. Check sound settings and sound mode.
Remote control not working	Replace batteries in the remote control. Ensure there are no obstructions between the remote and the TV's IR sensor. Re-pair the Bluetooth remote if applicable.
Smart TV features not working / Slow performance	Check internet connection (Wi-Fi or LAN). Restart the TV by unplugging it for a few minutes. Clear app cache or reinstall problematic apps. Ensure software is up to date.
Casting issues (Chromecast)	Ensure your casting device and TV are on the same Wi-Fi network. Restart both the TV and the casting device.
