1. Introduction

2. PRODUCT OVERVIEW

The CallToU Wireless Call System is a versatile communication solution. The receiver displays call numbers and provides voice announcements in Japanese or English. The call buttons are IP55 waterproof and designed for durability. The system offers a long communication range and is expandable to support up to 1000 call buttons, making it suitable for a wide array of applications.

Key Features:

- Easy Setup: Pre-paired units, no complex installation required.
- Voice Guidance: Supports Japanese and English voice announcements.
- Adjustable Volume: 8-level volume control and silent mode for various environments.
- Long Communication Range: Up to 300 meters outdoors (unobstructed) and 50-100 meters indoors.
- IP55 Waterproof: Call buttons are resistant to water splashes and dust.
- Expandable System: Receiver can pair with up to 1000 call buttons.
- Replaceable Batteries: Call buttons feature user-replaceable batteries for extended use.

3. SETUP

3.1 Unpacking and Inspection

Carefully unpack all components and verify that the following items are included:

- 1 x Receiver unit
- 1 x AC Power Adapter for Receiver
- 10 x Call Buttons
- 10 x Neck Straps for Call Buttons
- 10 x 12V Alkaline Batteries for Call Buttons (pre-installed or separate)
- Mounting Screws and Double-sided Tape for Call Buttons
- User Manual (this document)

Inspect all items for any signs of damage. If any components are missing or damaged, please contact customer support.

3.2 Receiver Installation

- 1. Place the receiver on a stable, flat surface or mount it on a wall using the provided screws. Ensure it is in a central location to maximize signal reception from call buttons.
- 2. Extend the antenna on the receiver for optimal signal range.
- 3. Connect the AC power adapter to the receiver's power port and plug it into a standard electrical outlet. The receiver will power on automatically.

3.3 Call Button Installation

The call buttons are pre-paired with the receiver. No additional pairing steps are typically required for initial use.

- Adhesive Mounting: Clean the desired surface (wall, table, etc.). Peel off the protective film from the double-sided tape on the back of the call button and firmly press it onto the surface.
- **Screw Mounting:** For a more secure installation, use the provided screws to attach the call button to a wall or other suitable surface.
- Portable Use: Attach the neck strap to the call button for users who need to carry it.

4. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

4.1 Making a Call

To make a call, simply press the large red 'CALL' button on the call transmitter. The button will send a signal to the receiver.

4.2 Receiving a Call

When a call button is pressed, the receiver will:

- Display the corresponding call number on its digital screen.
- Emit an audible alert (chime or voice announcement) indicating the call number.

4.3 Receiver Settings

The receiver has several buttons for configuration:

- FUN: Function button, typically used to enter or exit settings menus.
- **SET:** Setting button, used to confirm selections or enter specific setting modes.
- MOVE: Navigation button, used to move between options or digits.
- ENT: Enter button, used to confirm changes.

Refer to the detailed instructions below for specific settings:

- **Volume Adjustment:** Use the navigation buttons to cycle through 8 volume levels or select silent mode. Confirm with the SET/ENT button.
- Voice Announcement Language: Select between Japanese and English voice guidance.
- Call Number Display Duration: Adjust how long the call number remains on the screen.
- Pairing Additional Buttons: The receiver can pair with up to 1000 call buttons. Follow the specific pairing instructions in the full manual if adding new buttons.

5. MAINTENANCE

5.1 Cleaning

Wipe the receiver and call buttons with a soft, dry cloth. Do not use abrasive cleaners or solvents, as they may damage the surface.

5.2 Battery Replacement (Call Buttons)

The call buttons use 12V alkaline batteries. When the call button's signal strength weakens or it stops functioning, the battery may need replacement.

- 1. Carefully open the back cover of the call button.
- 2. Remove the old battery.
- 3. Insert a new 12V alkaline battery, ensuring correct polarity.
- 4. Close the back cover securely.

6. TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Receiver does not power on.	Power adapter not connected or faulty.	Ensure the AC adapter is securely plugged into the receiver and a working power outlet. Test the outlet with another device.
Call button does not trigger receiver.	 Call button battery is low or depleted. Call button is out of range. Obstructions blocking signal. Call button not paired (unlikely for initial setup). 	 Replace the call button battery. Move the call button closer to the receiver. Relocate the receiver or call button to minimize signal interference from thick walls or metal objects. If adding new buttons, refer to pairing instructions in the full manual.
Receiver volume is too low or silent.	Volume setting is low or silent mode is active.	Adjust the receiver volume using the control buttons. Ensure silent mode is deactivated if audible alerts are desired.
Voice announcement is in the wrong language.	Incorrect language setting.	Change the voice announcement language setting on the receiver.
