INTRODUCTION

Welcome to the user manual for your new Canon PowerShot G7 X Mark III Digital Camera. This manual provides essential information on setting up, operating, maintaining, and troubleshooting your camera to help you capture high-quality photos and videos. WHAT'S IN THE BOX

Upon opening your Canon PowerShot G7 X Mark III package, please verify that all the following items are included:

- Canon PowerShot G7 X Mark III Digital Camera (Black)
- NB-13L Lithium-Ion Battery Pack (3.6V, 1250mAh)
- Battery Charger
- Wrist Strap
- User Manual (this document)

SETUP

1. Charging the Battery

Before initial use, fully charge the supplied NB-13L battery. Insert the battery into the charger and plug the charger into a power outlet. The charging indicator light will show the charging status and turn off when charging is complete.

2. Inserting the Battery and Memory Card

1. Open the battery/card compartment cover on the bottom of the camera.
2. Insert the charged NB-13L battery into the compartment, ensuring the correct orientation.
3. Insert a compatible SD, SDHC, or SDXC memory card into the card slot until it clicks into place. Ensure the card is inserted with the correct orientation.
4. Close the compartment cover securely.

3. Initial Settings

When you turn on the camera for the first time, you will be prompted to set the date, time, and time zone. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete these settings. This ensures correct timestamping of your photos and videos.

OPERATING THE CAMERA

1. Power On/Off

Press the **POWER** button located on the top of the camera to turn it on or off. The lens will extend when powered on.

2. Selecting a Shooting Mode

Rotate the Mode Dial on the top of the camera to select your desired shooting mode. Common modes include:

- **Auto (A+)**: Fully automatic mode for simple point-and-shoot operation.
- **Program AE (P)**: Camera sets aperture and shutter speed, but you can adjust other settings.
- **Shutter-priority AE (Tv)**: You set the shutter speed, camera sets aperture.
- **Aperture-priority AE (Av)**: You set the aperture, camera sets shutter speed.
- **Manual (M)**: You control both aperture and shutter speed.
- **Movie (Movie Camera Icon)**: For recording videos.

3. Taking Photos

1. Frame your shot using the LCD screen.
2. Press the shutter button halfway down to focus. The camera will beep and focus points will illuminate when focus is achieved.
3. Press the shutter button fully down to take the picture.

4. Recording Videos

To record a video, ensure the Mode Dial is set to the Movie mode. Press the dedicated **MOVIE RECORD** button (usually marked with a red dot) to start and stop recording.

5. Playback

Press the **PLAYBACK** button (usually marked with a triangle icon) to view your photos and videos. Use the directional buttons to navigate through your media.

MAINTENANCE

1. Cleaning the Camera

- Use a soft, lint-free cloth to clean the camera body. For stubborn dirt, slightly dampen the cloth with water.
- For the lens, use a lens brush to remove dust, then gently wipe with a lens cleaning cloth and lens cleaning solution if necessary. **Do not touch the lens surface with your fingers.**

- Clean the LCD screen with a soft, dry cloth.

2. Battery Care

- Store batteries in a cool, dry place when not in use.
- Avoid fully discharging the battery frequently to prolong its lifespan.
- If storing for extended periods, charge the battery to about 50% capacity.

3. Storage

When not in use, store the camera in a dry, dust-free environment, preferably in a camera bag. Avoid extreme temperatures and high humidity.

TROUBLESHOOTING

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Camera won't turn on.	Battery is dead or incorrectly inserted.	Charge the battery fully. Reinsert the battery correctly.
Images are blurry.	Camera shake, incorrect focus, or dirty lens.	Hold the camera steady. Ensure proper focus. Clean the lens.
Battery drains quickly.	Frequent use of flash, Wi-Fi, or continuous shooting. Old battery.	Reduce use of power-intensive features. Consider replacing the battery if it's old.
Memory card error.	Card is full, corrupted, or incompatible.	Delete unnecessary files. Format the card (this will erase all data). Try a different card.
