1. Introduction



2. What's in the Box

Upon unboxing your Apple 2024 iMac, verify that all the following components are present:

- iMac (24-inch)
- Power cord (2 meters) and 143W power adapter
- Magic Mouse
- USB-C Charge Cable
- Magic Keyboard with Touch ID

3. SETUP

3.1 Initial Placement

Place your iMac on a stable, flat surface. Ensure adequate ventilation around the device. The iMac's compact design allows it to fit comfortably in various environments.

3.2 Power Connection

- 1. Connect the power cord to the 143W power adapter.
- 2. Plug the power adapter into the power port located on the back of your iMac.
- 3. Plug the other end of the power cord into a wall outlet.

3.3 Connecting Peripherals

• Magic Keyboard and Magic Mouse: These devices are typically pre-paired. Simply turn them on using the switch on their underside. If they do not connect automatically, follow the on-screen instructions

during initial setup or refer to Apple's support documentation for manual pairing.

- **USB-C Charge Cable:** Use this cable to charge your Magic Keyboard and Magic Mouse when their battery levels are low.
- External Devices: The iMac features up to four Thunderbolt 4 ports for connecting external displays, storage devices, and other accessories. Use appropriate cables or adapters for your devices.

3.4 Initial Boot and macOS Setup

- 1. Press the power button located on the back of the iMac to turn it on.
- 2. Follow the on-screen instructions to complete the macOS setup process. This includes selecting your language, connecting to a Wi-Fi network, signing in with your Apple ID, and setting up Touch ID.



4.3 Display and Audio

The 24-inch 4.5K Retina display offers 500 nits of brightness and supports up to 1 billion colors, providing a visually immersive experience. The integrated six-speaker sound system with Spatial Audio and three studio-quality microphones ensure clear audio for communication and media consumption. The 12MP Center Stage camera keeps you perfectly framed during video calls.

4.4 Connectivity and Integration

The iMac supports Wi-Fi 6E and Bluetooth 5.3 for fast and reliable wireless connections. It seamlessly integrates with other Apple devices, allowing features like iPhone Mirroring, universal clipboard, and direct FaceTime calls and Messages from your Mac.




Image 4.3: Two individuals, one standing and one seated, interacting with an iMac displaying an e-commerce interface, demonstrating collaborative use in a modern environment.

5. MAINTENANCE

5.1 Cleaning Your iMac

- Screen: Use a soft, lint-free cloth slightly dampened with water to clean the display. Avoid using window cleaners, household cleaners, aerosol sprays, solvents, alcohol, ammonia, or abrasives.
- Enclosure: Wipe the exterior surfaces with a soft, lint-free cloth.
- **Keyboard and Mouse:** Use a soft, lint-free cloth. For stubborn dirt, a slightly dampened cloth can be used, ensuring no moisture enters openings.

5.2 Software Updates

Regularly update macOS and installed applications to ensure optimal performance, security, and access to the latest features. You can check for updates via System Settings > General > Software Update.

5.3 Environmental Considerations

Operate your iMac in a well-ventilated area and within the recommended temperature range (50° to 95° F or 10° to 35° C). Avoid exposing it to direct sunlight, excessive dust, or moisture.

6. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues with your iMac, try the following basic troubleshooting steps:

- **No Power:** Ensure the power cord is securely connected to the iMac, power adapter, and wall outlet. Try a different outlet.
- **Display Issues:** If the screen is black or unresponsive, try restarting the iMac. Check display settings in System Settings if external displays are not working.
- **Peripheral Connectivity:** If your Magic Keyboard or Mouse is not responding, ensure they are charged and turned on. Re-pair them via Bluetooth settings if necessary.
- Slow Performance: Close unnecessary applications. Check for available macOS updates. Restarting your iMac can often resolve temporary performance issues.
- **Software Problems:** If an application is unresponsive, force quit it (Option + Command + Esc). If macOS is unresponsive, restart your iMac.


