INTRODUCTION

This manual provides essential information for the installation, operation, and maintenance of your WKNYSYK Choke Cable. Designed for specific ATV models, this component ensures proper engine cold-start functionality. Compatibility: This choke cable is compatible with various CF Moto 500 X5 models from 2010-2018, including CF500, CF500-2, CF500-2A, CF500-5, CF500-5A, CF500-5B, CF500-5C, CF500-A, CF500-B, CF500-C, CF500-D, CF500-E. It also fits Goes 520 and 520 Max, Gladiator RX510, RX530, Quadzilla Terrain 500, and Goes 525 Max.

PRODUCT OVERVIEW

The WKNYSYK choke cable is a replacement part designed to restore or maintain the choke function on compatible ATV models. It is constructed for stable performance and high reliability, ensuring a proper air-fuel mixture during cold starts.

INSTALLATION GUIDE

Installation of the choke cable requires basic mechanical knowledge. If you are unsure about any steps, it is recommended to seek professional assistance.

1. **Preparation:** Ensure the ATV engine is off and cool. Disconnect the battery's negative terminal for safety.
2. **Locate Existing Choke Cable:** Identify the current choke cable connection at both the carburetor and the choke lever on the handlebars.
3. **Remove Old Cable:** Carefully detach the old choke cable. This typically involves unscrewing retaining nuts at the

carburetor and disconnecting the cable end from the choke lever mechanism. Note the routing of the cable.

4. **Install New Cable:** Route the new WKNYSYK choke cable in the same path as the old one, ensuring it does not interfere with moving parts or get pinched.
5. **Connect to Carburetor:** Attach one end of the new cable to the carburetor's choke mechanism. Secure it firmly with any retaining nuts or clips.
6. **Connect to Choke Lever:** Attach the other end of the cable to the choke lever assembly on the handlebars. Ensure it moves freely and engages properly.
7. **Adjust Cable Tension:** Adjust the cable tension to ensure the choke mechanism fully engages and disengages without excessive play or binding. Refer to your ATV's service manual for specific adjustment procedures if available.
8. **Test Functionality:** Reconnect the battery. Test the choke lever to confirm smooth operation and proper engagement/disengagement of the choke. Start the engine to verify cold-start performance.

OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

The choke cable controls the choke mechanism, which is used to enrich the air-fuel mixture for easier starting of a cold engine. Once the engine starts and warms up, the choke should be disengaged.

- **Cold Start:** When starting a cold engine, fully engage the choke lever.
- **Engine Warm-up:** Once the engine starts, gradually disengage the choke as the engine warms up. Leaving the choke engaged on a warm engine can lead to rough running, increased fuel consumption, and spark plug fouling.
- **Warm Engine:** The choke is generally not required for starting a warm engine.

MAINTENANCE

Regular inspection and maintenance can extend the life of your choke cable and ensure reliable operation.

- **Routine Inspection:** Periodically inspect the cable for signs of wear, fraying, kinks, or damage to the outer casing.
- **Lubrication:** Apply a suitable cable lubricant to the inner wire at both ends (carburetor and lever) to ensure smooth operation and prevent corrosion.
- **Cleanliness:** Keep the cable and its connection points free from dirt, mud, and debris.
- **Adjustment Check:** Verify that the cable tension remains correctly adjusted, allowing full engagement and disengagement of the choke.

TROUBLESHOOTING

If you experience issues with your choke cable, consider the following common problems and solutions:

- **Choke Not Engaging/Disengaging Fully:**
 - Check cable tension and adjust as necessary.
 - Inspect for kinks or bends in the cable housing that might impede movement.
 - Ensure the cable ends are properly seated in their respective mechanisms.
- **Stiff or Sticky Choke Lever:**
 - Lubricate the inner cable.
 - Inspect for corrosion or debris within the cable housing or at the lever mechanism.

- If lubrication does not resolve the issue, the cable may be worn and require replacement.

• **Engine Hard to Start When Cold:**

- Verify the choke cable is fully engaging the choke mechanism on the carburetor.
- Check for other engine-related issues (e.g., fuel delivery, spark plugs).
