1. INTRODUCTION

This manual provides detailed instructions for the installation, operation, and maintenance of your new 6-string individual tremolo bridge for electric guitars. - Springs and Screws (for bridge and spring claw)

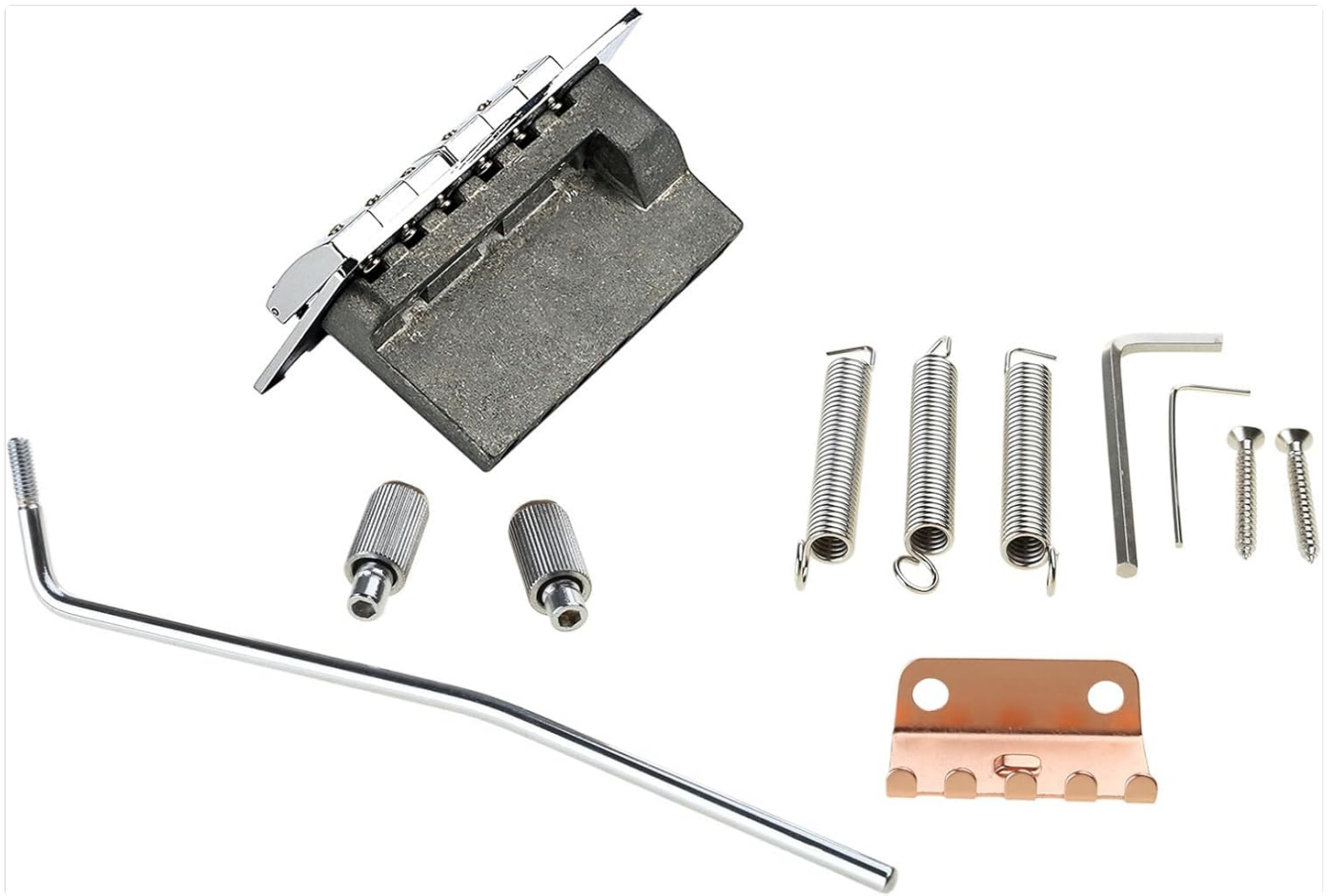


Figure 2.1: Overview of all components included in the package.

3. SETUP AND INSTALLATION

Proper installation is crucial for optimal performance. If you are unsure about any step, it is recommended to seek assistance from a qualified guitar technician.

3.1. Preparing Your Guitar

1. Carefully remove the old bridge and strings from your electric guitar.
2. Clean the bridge cavity and surrounding area to ensure a smooth installation surface.

3.2. Installing the Bridge Studs

1. Insert the two bridge studs into the designated holes on your guitar body. Ensure they are seated firmly and level.

3.3. Mounting the Tremolo Bridge

1. Carefully place the tremolo bridge onto the installed studs. The bridge features curved saddles and an exquisite finish for a perfect fit.
2. Attach the tremolo springs to the bridge block and the spring claw in the guitar's tremolo cavity.
3. Secure the spring claw with screws to adjust spring tension later.

3.4. Attaching the Tremolo Arm

1. Screw the tremolo arm into the designated hole on the tremolo bridge. Ensure it is securely fastened but still allows for smooth movement.

4. OPERATING THE TREMOLO BRIDGE

The tremolo bridge allows for pitch modulation, adding vibrato and dive-bomb effects to your playing.

4.1. Tuning and Intonation

1. After installing new strings, stretch them thoroughly and tune your guitar to the desired pitch.
2. Adjust the saddle height for optimal action and intonation using the provided wrench. Each saddle is individual, allowing for precise adjustments.

4.2. Using the Tremolo Arm

1. Gently push down on the tremolo arm to lower the pitch of the strings.
2. Pull up on the tremolo arm (if set up for floating tremolo) to raise the pitch.
3. Experiment with different pressures and movements to achieve various vibrato and pitch-shifting effects.

5. MAINTENANCE

Regular maintenance will ensure the longevity and optimal performance of your tremolo bridge.

- **Cleaning:** Wipe down the bridge regularly with a soft, dry cloth to remove dust, sweat, and grime. For stubborn dirt, a slightly damp cloth can be used, followed by immediate drying.

- **Lubrication:** Occasionally apply a small amount of specialized lubricant (e.g., graphite or silicone-based) to the pivot points and saddles to ensure smooth operation and reduce friction.
- **Inspection:** Periodically check all screws and components for tightness. Ensure the tremolo springs are not stretched or damaged.
- **String Changes:** When changing strings, it's a good opportunity to clean and inspect the bridge thoroughly.

6. TROUBLESHOOTING

Here are some common issues and their potential solutions:

Problem	Possible Cause	Solution
Poor Tuning Stability	Strings not stretched, nut friction, insufficient spring tension, worn saddles.	Stretch new strings, lubricate nut slots, adjust tremolo spring tension, inspect and replace worn saddles if necessary.
Tremolo Arm Too Loose/Tight	Arm collar not adjusted, threads worn.	Tighten or loosen the tremolo arm collar/bushing. If threads are worn, consider replacement.
Buzzing from Bridge	Loose saddle screws, improper saddle height, worn saddles.	Tighten all saddle screws, adjust saddle height, inspect saddles for wear.
Bridge Not Returning to Pitch	Insufficient spring tension, nut friction, bridge pivot points sticking.	Increase tremolo spring tension, lubricate nut and bridge pivot points.

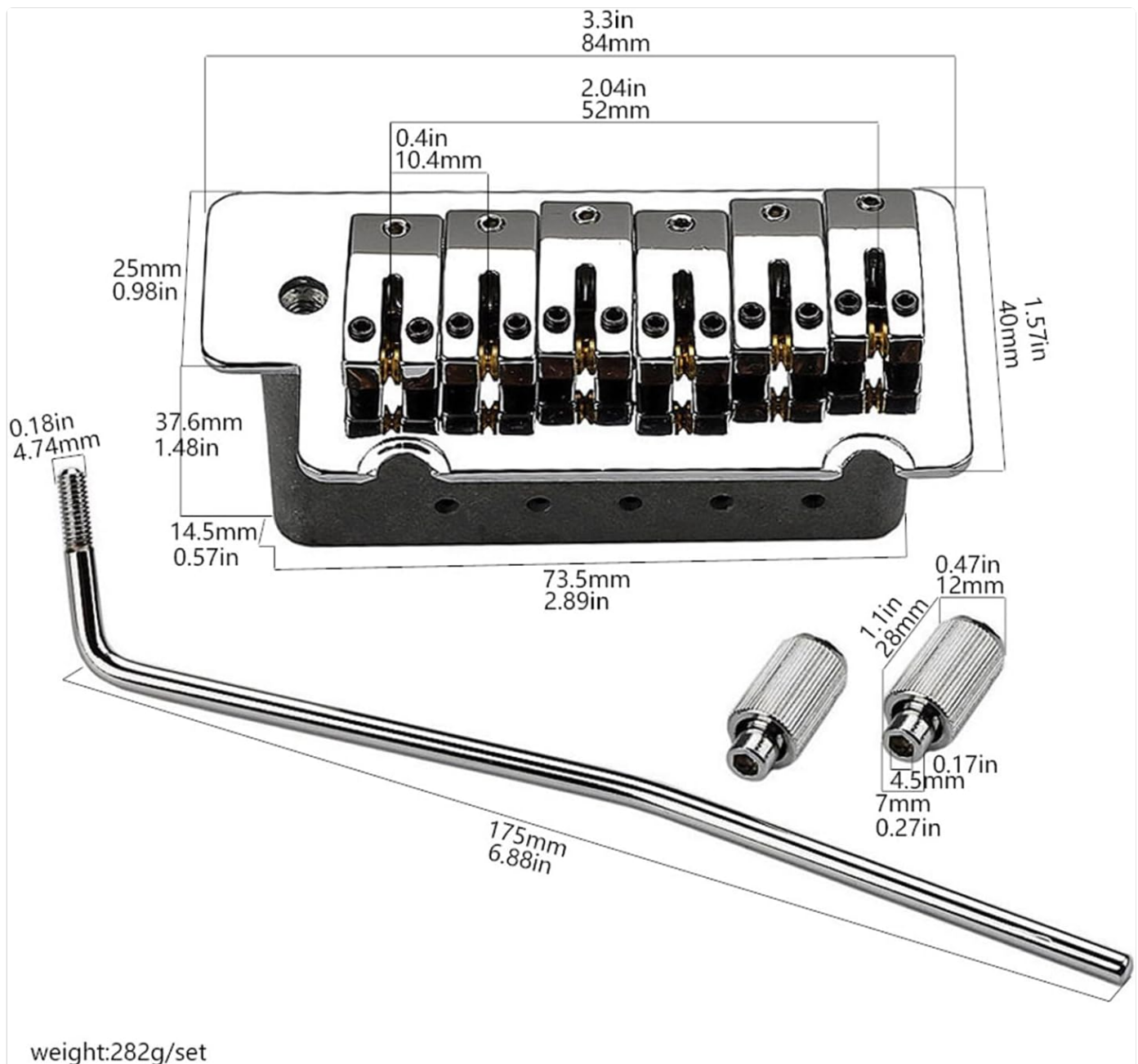


Figure 7.1: Detailed dimensions of the tremolo bridge.
