1. INTRODUCTION

This manual provides detailed instructions for the Monster Open Ear AC360 Wireless Bluetooth Rotary Earphones, Model E68. Please read this manual thoroughly before using the product to ensure proper operation and to maximize your listening experience. Keep this manual for future reference.

3. PRODUCT OVERVIEW

Familiarize yourself with the components of your Monster Open Ear AC360 earphones and charging case.

3.1 Earphone Components

- **Ear Hook:** Provides a secure and comfortable fit over the ear.
- **Speaker Unit:** Delivers audio without entering the ear canal.
- **Touch Control Area:** For managing playback, calls, and voice assistant.
- **Microphone:** For hands-free calls.

3.2 Charging Case Components

- **Charging Ports:** Internal contacts for earphones.
- **USB-C Port:** For charging the case.
- **LED Indicators:** Show charging status and battery level.
- **Magnetic Rotating Cover:** Unique design for securing earphones.

4. SETUP

4.1 Charging the Earphones and Case

- Initial Charge:** Before first use, fully charge the earphones and charging case. Place the earphones into the charging case.
- Charging the Case:** Connect the provided USB charging cable to the USB-C port on the charging case and to a power source (e.g., computer USB port, wall adapter). The LED indicators on the case will show the charging status.
- Charging the Earphones:** When placed in the charged case, the earphones will automatically begin charging. The case provides up to 24 hours of total battery life, with earphones offering up to 8 hours on a single charge. A 10-minute charge can provide approximately 1 hour of playtime.

4.2 Bluetooth Pairing

- Power On:** Open the charging case. The earphones will automatically power on and enter pairing mode. The indicator lights on the earphones will flash, indicating they are ready to pair.
- Activate Bluetooth:** On your device (smartphone, tablet, etc.), enable Bluetooth.
- Select Device:** In your device's Bluetooth settings, look for "Monster Open Ear AC360" in the list of available devices and select it to connect.

4. **Confirmation:** Once connected, the earphone indicator lights will stop flashing, and you may hear an audible confirmation.
5. **Reconnect:** After initial pairing, the earphones will automatically connect to the last paired device when removed from the case and within range.

5. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

5.1 Wearing the Earphones

The Monster Open Ear AC360 earphones are designed for comfort and stability with an open-ear fit.

1. Identify the Left (L) and Right (R) earphones.
2. Gently place the earphone over your ear, ensuring the ear hook rests securely behind your ear and the speaker unit is positioned near your ear canal without entering it.
3. Adjust for a comfortable and stable fit. The open-ear design allows you to remain aware of your surroundings.

5.2 Touch Controls

The earphones feature touch-sensitive controls on the outer surface of each earphone. Specific functions may vary slightly depending on your device and application.

Action	Function
Single Tap (Left/Right)	Play/Pause Music, Answer/End Call
Double Tap (Left)	Previous Track
Double Tap (Right)	Next Track
Triple Tap (Left/Right)	Activate Voice Assistant
Long Press (Left/Right)	Reject Call

6. MAINTENANCE

6.1 Cleaning

- Regularly clean the earphones and charging case with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth.
- Do not use abrasive cleaners, solvents, or aerosol sprays.
- Ensure charging contacts on both earphones and case are clean and free of debris to maintain proper charging.

6.2 Water Resistance (IPX5)

The Monster Open Ear AC360 earphones are rated IPX5 water-resistant, meaning they can withstand splashes of water and sweat. They are suitable for workouts and light rain exposure.

- Do not submerge the earphones in water.
- Do not expose them to running water (e.g., shower, faucet).
- Ensure earphones are dry before placing them back into the charging case to prevent damage.

6.3 Storage

When not in use, store the earphones in their charging case to protect them and keep them charged. Store in a cool, dry place away from extreme temperatures.

7. TROUBLESHOOTING

If you encounter issues with your Monster Open Ear AC360 earphones, refer to the following common problems and solutions:

- **Earphones not pairing:**

- Ensure earphones are fully charged.
- Turn off Bluetooth on your device and turn it back on.
- Forget "Monster Open Ear AC360" from your device's Bluetooth list and attempt to pair again.
- Place earphones back in the case, close the lid, wait a few seconds, then open to re-enter pairing mode.

- **No sound or low volume:**

- Check the volume level on both your device and the earphones.
- Ensure earphones are properly connected to your device.
- Clean any debris from the speaker units.

- **Charging issues:**

- Ensure the charging cable is securely connected to both the case and the power source.
- Verify that the charging contacts on the earphones and inside the case are clean and free of obstruction.
- Try a different USB charging cable or power adapter.

- **Earphones disconnect frequently:**

- Ensure you are within the effective Bluetooth range of your device (typically 10 meters/33 feet).
- Avoid strong electromagnetic interference.
- Reset the earphones (refer to manufacturer's website for specific reset instructions if needed).



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

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

INTRODUCTION	
A classification of diseases may be defined as a system of categories to which morbid entities are assigned according to established criteria. There are many possible axes of classification and the one selected will depend upon the use to be made of the statistics to be compiled. A statistical classification must encompass the entire range of morbid conditions within a manageable number of categories.	
The Tenth Revision of the International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems (ICD-10) was developed by the World Health Organization (WHO) in 1992. The International List of Causes of Death, a complete review of the historical background to the classification is given in Part 2a Instruction Manual (NCHS). While the title has been amended to reflect the new classification, the title of the classification is ICD-10. In order to maintain the classification beyond diseases and injuries, the familiar abbreviation "ICD" has been retained. In the updated classification, conditions have been grouped in a way that will facilitate the use of the classification for purposes other than the classification of diseases and injuries.	
Work on the Tenth Revision of the ICD started in September 1982 when a Preparatory Meeting on ICD-10 was convened in Geneva. The programme of work was guided by regular meetings of Heads of WHO Member States and by the International Conference of the International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems for Classification of Diseases. Policy guidance was provided by a number of special meetings convened by the International Conference on the International Classification of Disease - Tenth Revision, held in 1984 and 1987.	
In addition to the technical contributions provided by many special meetings and individual experts, a draft of the proposed classification was circulated to WHO Member States and Regional Offices as a result of the global circulation of draft proposals for revision in 1984 and 1986. From the comments received, it was clear that many users wished the ICD to accommodate new types of data other than the classification of diseases and injuries. In order to meet these needs, it was decided that a new classification should be developed. In order to accommodate the perceived needs of these users, the concept arose of a "family" of classifications. The classification of diseases and injuries would be the central element, but it would meet the requirement for diagnostic information for general purposes, while a variety of classifications would be used in conjunction with it and would deal either with different approaches to the classification of diseases and injuries or with other information (notably medical and surgical procedures and disablement).	
Following suggestions of the International Conference on the International Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems for Classification of Diseases, the WHO Member States and Regional Offices, as a result of the global circulation of draft proposals for revision in 1984 and 1986, alternative models were evaluated. It became clear, however, that the traditional single-variable-axis design of the classification and other aspects of its structure that gave emphasis to conditions that were diseases and injuries were not suitable for the new classification. It was also clear that many users would be unhappy with the model that had been proposed as a possible replacement.	
Consequently, an study of the Tenth Revision will show, the traditional ICD structure has been retained but an alphanumeric coding scheme replaces the previous numeric one. This provides a



INTRODUCTION

A classification of diseases may be defined as a system of categories to which medical entities are assigned according to established criteria. There are many possible ways of classification and the one selected will depend upon the use to be made of the classification. The classification of diseases must encompass the entire range of conditions within a reasonable number of categories.

The Tenth Revision of the International Statistical Classification of Diseases and Related Health Problems is the latest in a series of revisions of the classification of diseases and health problems. The historical background to the classification is given in Part 2a Instruction Manual (NCHS). While the title has been changed to 'ICD-10', the classification itself is the same as the previous revision. The classification of diseases now encompasses the entire range of conditions within a reasonable number of categories.

In addition to the technical contributions provided by many specialist groups and individual experts, a large number of comments and suggestions were received from WHO Member States and Regional Offices as a result of the global consultation process. The comments and suggestions were considered in detail by the International Conference which revised the ICD to encompass types of data other than 'diagnostic information' (in the broadest sense of the term). The ICD-10 is a classification of diseases and health problems, and it is not a classification of injuries. The ICD-10 is a classification of diseases and injuries, the familiar abbreviation 'ICD' has been retained. The ICD-10 will meet the needs of the medical and health services community, and it is a way that it will be to be more suited for general epidemiological purposes and the evaluation of health care.

With the Tenth Revision of the ICD started in September 1983 when a Preparatory Meeting on ICD-10 was convened. During the meeting, the International Conference on ICD-10 was convened to review the proposed structure of the International Classification of Diseases. Policy guidance was provided by a number of special meetings including those of the Expert Committee on ICD-10.

Following suggestions of the time of development of the Ninth Revision of the classification that a different basic structure might better serve the needs of many and varied users, several alternative models were evaluated. It became clear, however, that the ICD-10 was the best model for the classification of diseases and health problems. The ICD-10 approach emphasizes to conditions that were frequent, costly or otherwise of public health importance, but without the loss of time and effort in the classification of diseases and health problems. The ICD-10 will meet the needs of the medical and health services community in conjunction with it and will deal either with different approaches to the same information or with different information to the same approach.

Consequently, as study of the Tenth Revision will show, the traditional ICD structure has been retained but an alphanumeric coding scheme replaces the previous numeric one. This provides a larger coding frame and leaves room for future expansion and extension, with the intention being contained in homogeneous categories at the three-character level.
