1. INTRODUCTION AND OVERVIEW

The PYY 4/4 Full Size Cello is a meticulously crafted acoustic instrument designed for students and adult beginners. It features a spruce top, maple back and sides, and a maple fingerboard, all contributing to a rich and balanced tone. The cello package includes essential accessories to facilitate immediate playability and learning.

2. PACKAGE CONTENTS

Your PYY Cello package includes everything necessary to begin playing:

- PYY 4/4 Full Size Cello
- Soft, padded carrying bag with adjustable strap
- Redwood bow with authentic Mongolian horsehair
- Cello stand
- Digital tuner
- Rosin
- Extra set of high-carbon steel strings

3. SETUP INSTRUCTIONS

3.1. Unpacking Your Cello

Carefully remove the cello and all accessories from the packaging. Inspect the instrument for any visible damage. Keep all packaging materials until you are satisfied with the product.

3.2. Installing the Bridge

The bridge is typically shipped uninstalled to prevent damage during transit. Follow these steps to correctly install it:

1. Gently loosen the strings to create enough slack.
2. Position the bridge upright between the f-holes, ensuring the feet align with the small notches on the cello body.
3. The side of the bridge with the PYY logo should face the tailpiece.
4. Carefully tighten the strings, ensuring the bridge remains upright and perpendicular to the cello's body.

3.3. Tuning Your Cello

Accurate tuning is crucial for optimal sound. Use the included digital tuner:

1. Clip the digital tuner onto the cello's headstock.
2. Turn on the tuner and select the 'Cello' mode.
3. Pluck each string individually and adjust the corresponding tuning peg (for coarse adjustments) or fine-tuner (for precise adjustments) until the tuner indicates the correct pitch. The standard cello tuning from lowest to highest string is C-G-D-A.
4. Repeat the process for all four strings until they are in tune. New strings may require frequent tuning initially.

3.4. Applying Rosin to the Bow

Rosin is essential for the bow to create sound by gripping the strings. Apply it as follows:

1. Tighten the bow hair by turning the screw at the frog until the hair is taut but not overly tight.
2. Rub the rosin block along the entire length of the bow hair, applying gentle pressure. A few passes (5-10) are usually sufficient for new rosin or a new bow.
3. Ensure an even coating. You should see a fine white powder on the bow hair.

4. OPERATING INSTRUCTIONS

4.1. Proper Cello Posture

Sit on a sturdy chair without arms. Place the cello between your knees, resting the lower bout against your chest. Adjust the endpin so that the C string peg is roughly level with your left ear. Ensure your back is straight and relaxed.

4.2. Bowing Technique

Hold the bow with a relaxed hand, fingers curved naturally. The thumb should be bent and rest on the frog. Draw the bow across the strings smoothly, maintaining consistent pressure and speed to produce a clear tone.

4.3. Finger Placement and Notes

Accurate finger placement on the fingerboard is key to playing in tune. The included finger guide can assist beginners in identifying note positions.

4.4. Playing Your Cello

Combine proper posture, bowing, and finger placement to produce musical notes. Start with open strings and simple scales. Consistent practice is essential for progress.

5. MAINTENANCE

5.1. Cleaning Your Cello

After each use, wipe down the cello body, strings, and fingerboard with a soft, dry cloth to remove rosin dust and fingerprints. Avoid using harsh chemicals or abrasive materials.

5.2. Bow Care

Loosen the bow hair after each practice session to prevent warping of the bow stick. Clean any excess rosin from the bow stick with a soft cloth.

5.3. String Replacement

Strings should be replaced periodically, or if they break or lose their tone quality. Replace one string at a time to maintain tension on the bridge and soundpost.

5.4. Storage

Always store your cello in its padded carrying bag or on a dedicated cello stand when not in use. Avoid extreme temperatures and humidity, which can damage the wood.

6. TROUBLESHOOTING

- **Buzzing Strings:** Check if the bridge is correctly positioned and upright. Ensure strings are properly seated in the bridge and nut grooves.
- **Difficulty Tuning:** New strings stretch and require frequent tuning. Ensure tuning pegs are pushed firmly into the pegbox while turning to prevent slipping.
- **Poor Sound Quality:** Verify that enough rosin has been applied to the bow. Check for proper bridge placement and ensure the soundpost inside the cello is upright.
- **Bridge Falling:** This often occurs if strings are too loose or if the bridge is not perpendicular to the

cello's body. Reinstall the bridge and tighten strings carefully.
