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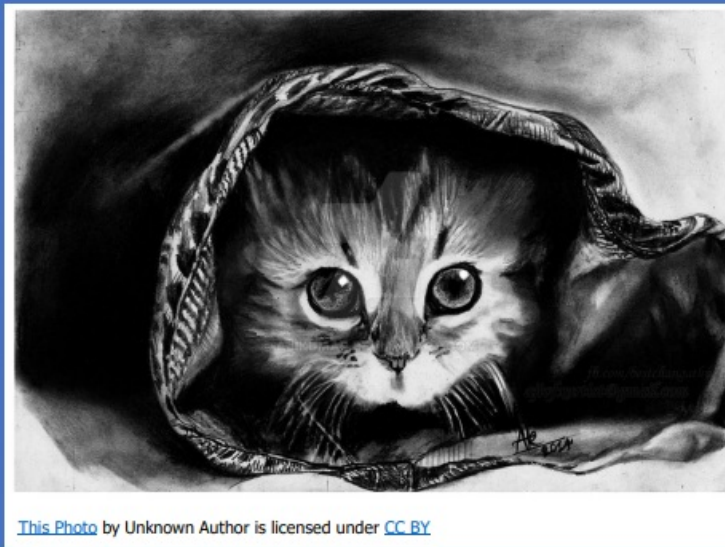

6. Follow safety instructions when handling tools and materials
7. Seek feedback on drawings from relevant people and refine drawings

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
