Set and Forget

- The thermostat maintains a constant temperature in your room.
- Follow the table below to set your preferred room temperature:


Setting	Temperature
Frost protection *	Min. setting
Hall	1
Bedroom	2
Living room	3
Bathroom	4
Max. setting	5

Note: Do not cover the thermostat as it needs to register the room temperature. Use a thermostat with a remote sensor if it is covered by thick curtains or furniture.

- By replacing your radiator thermostat (older than 15 years) with A-labelled Danfoss thermostats.

SET AND FORGET

The thermostat maintains a constant temperature in your room. Set your preferred room temperature according to the table below, and that's it. The thermostat will open and close depending on the heat demand, thereby utilizing the free heat from sunlight, appliances, and people.



Free heat saves energy

Sunlight, kitchen appliances and electric light give ff free heat. The thermostat registers such free heat by automatically closing down. When there no lon-ger is enough free heat available, the thermostat au-tomatically opens again.



Please do not cover the thermostat!

The thermostat must be able to register the tempera-ture of the room. If it is covered by e.g. thick curtains or furniture, use a thermostat with remote sensor.



Frost protection

- If you leave your home for a longer period, you can safely turn the thermostat to *.
- At this setting, the thermostat will keep the room temperature at about 7-8 °C.



Night setback

To save energy, simply lower the room temperature at night or at times when nobody is at home.



Cleaning

The thermostat can be cleaned with mild detergents such as dishwashing liquid. Do not use scourers, alcohol, solvents, or bleaching agents as they can damage the radiator thermostat.

FAQs

Q: How do I activate frost protection on the thermostat?

A: If you leave your home for an extended period, you can turn the thermostat to the minimum setting for frost protection.

Q: Can I use the thermostat with remote sensors?

A: Yes, if the thermostat is covered by thick curtains or furniture, consider using a thermostat with remote sensors for accurate temperature readings.
