The transmitter and receiver are used together, no wiring, no installation is simple and flexible, this product is mainly suitable for orchard farm alarm, family residence, company, hospital, hotel, factory doors and Windows.

Product features

- · Touch signals automatically
- The remote control distance can reach 300 meters in an open barrier-free environment: the remote control signal is stable and does not interfere with each other.
- Waterproof rating IPX4

Operating Instructions

- 1. Start by putting the receiver into code matching mode.
- 2. Touch the front to complete matching with the receiver
- 3. Attach the transmitter to the doors and Windows, and the receiver will ring automatically every time the magnetic strip is opened.

Replace battery

- 1. Snap off the bottom shell
- 2. Open 1 screw with a screwdriver
- 3. Remove the battery from the transmitter PCB board and dispose of it properly; Install a new CR2450 battery into the battery slot, noting that the positive and negative terminals cannot be inverted.

- operating frequency 433.92MH/±280KHz
