## Glossary

- **SACN:** Streaming Architecture for Control Networks, a network protocol.
- **Art-Net:** Artistic License network protocol. This is the Artistic License DMX over ethernet protocol.
- **Channel:** On the front panel of the Storm24, the term Channel is used synonymously with a DMX over Ethernet Stream or Universe. It may at other times mean a single DMX address or slot within a Stream or Universe.
- **Dimmer:** One discretely controlled device or parameter of a device out of 512 possible in the DMX512 protocol. Also referred to as "Address", and in confusingly inopportune moments, "DMX Channel" or "Output

Channel”

- **DHCP:** Dynamic Host Configuration Protocol.
- **ESP:** Enttec Show Protocol. Enttec DMX over Ethernet protocol.
- **IP:** Internet Protocol.
- **KiNET:** Proprietary DMX over Ethernet type of protocol developed by Philips Color Kinetics for their LEDs
- **LCD:** Liquid Crystal Display.
- **PC:** Personal Computer.
- **Stream:** A OMX-over-Ethernet Universe coming into or leaving the Storm
- **Universe:** 512 addresses or slots’ worth of control information as conveyed by DMX512 protocol. A lighting system may have more than 512 discrete things to control, so multiple universes may be required. When this is the case, the Universe number will be expressed in 0-255 form for ESP or 0-15 subnet and 0-15 universe# for Art-Net.

## Introduction

Thank you for buying Storm24. At ENTTEC we are proud of our products and we hope you will enjoy them as much as we enjoy making them. This manual is a Quick Start Guide, for installation purposes mainly. There are many ways to use the Storm24 and they are covered in greater detail elsewhere. Once you have it up and running, for further information please consult the Enttec website for videos explaining some of the configuration possibilities, as well as the context-sensitive help on the web page produced by the Storm24 itself.

### On the front panel, you will find

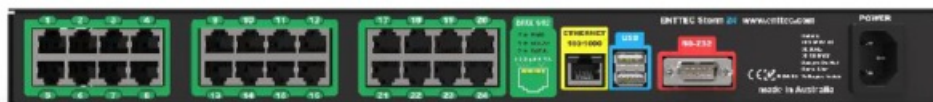
- LCD screen
- 4 buttons (MENU, UP, DOWN and ENTER)



### At the back, which is to say inside the rack if you install it that way, you will find

- IEC connector, you can insert any AC voltage source between 100 and 260 V and 50 to 60Hz
- 24 DMX (RJ-45) Ports
- RJ45 connector for a 10Base-T Ethernet connection
- RS232 port (un-used)
- 2 x USB ports (un-used)

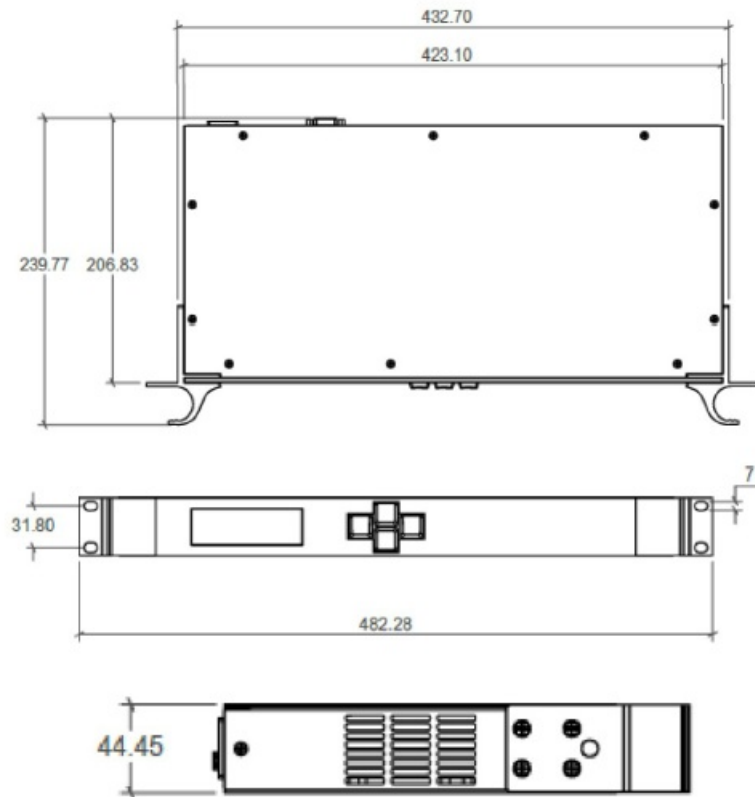
The unit has no power switch and can be left on continuously.



## Physical Features

- 24 DMX (RJ45) ports
- Gigabit Ethernet Connection
- LCD display provide status information on system and data flow

## Software Features

- DMX refresh rate configurable for each port (1Hz -> 44Hz)
- Break time configurable for each DMX port (88us to 1 ms)
- Mark After Break configurable for each DMX port
- All configurations are made through web browser.
- Graphical User Interface for creating and editing ports is flow-chart oriented and documents at a flow as you configure it.
- Number of channels configurable for each port (1 to 512)
- Supports numerous protocols for DMX over Ethernet:
  - ESP
  - Art-Net
  - StreamingACN
  - KiNet

## Stream Auditor

- **Stream Auditor:** A status monitoring screen that includes data throughput statistics, DMX values in real time, and other information for troubleshooting, available through web page

## Limitations

As the Storm24 is reliant on Ethernet, if you are using an existing computer network and sharing the traffic between your lighting control system and other functions, or if you are using multiple Storms, stream auditor monitoring update rate might experience drop or delays.

## Basic Concepts

- ENTTEC Storm24 is a standard Art-Net node. Because of this, you can use the device with applications, consoles, desks, or controllers that are compatible with Art-Net to distribute Art-Net data via Ethernet network.
- With the default profile, each DMX Port is mapped to it's respective Art-Net Universe, allowing you to directly plug-in Storm24 without any changes or configuration necessary.

## Connector pin out

### DMX pinout (RJ-45)

- **Pin1:** Data +
- **Pin2:** Data –
- **Pin7:** Ground

### RS232

**Note:** RS232 is not supported by Storm24.

## Getting Started

To begin your installation please follow these steps.

1. Unpack the unit from the box. Inspect the Storm24 for any damage that might have occurred in shipping and verify that it looks to be in good condition before plugging it in to power.
2. The Storm24 occupies a single unit (1U) in a 19- inch rack. You may attach it to the rack either at this time or later after configuring it, if desired.
3. Attach a power cord with mains voltage to the IEC input on the back.
4. Using an Ethernet Cat5, Cat5E or Cat6 cable, connect the Storm24 to an Ethernet Network.
5. When the unit turns on, you will be able to see its initial IP address on the LCD panel which looks like w.x.y.z, where each letter is a number between 0 and 255. Note that IP address down for later use.

## Profiles

Profiles are essential to the operational philosophy of the Storm24. With a profile selected, the device knows how to utilize the many resources it can make use of to perform lighting control tasks. Each Profile contains configuration information for some or all of the following:

- **DMX Ports:** These are the physical DMX OUTPUT ports only: 1 to 24.
- **Ethernet Streams:** These are the DMX over Ethernet universes. (Art-Net, ESP, KiNET, ACN)
- **Routing Diagram:** The routing diagram is the visual representation of the Profile itself and it tells the Storm24

how frames are moved or routed inside the routing engine.

## Factory Profiles

The Storm24 has a set of factory profiles, to start you off. You're likely to see 2 or more of the following:

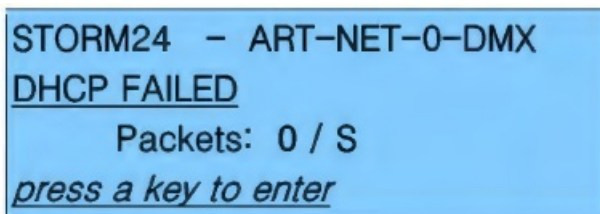
- **Artnet -> OMX:** This profile will take 24 Art-Net universes and convert them to 24 OMX signals on ports 1 to 24.
- **Ethernet to OMX:** This profile will take 24 OMX over Ethernet signal using the ESP protocol and convert them to 24 OMX signal on ports 1 to 24. These profiles are just an example of what can be done with Storm24, you can modify the factory profiles to accommodate your need or create your own profile from scratch.

If you don't see any of the above, please contact [support@enttec.com](mailto:support@enttec.com) and we can send them to you. After that, you're on your own to make and edit profiles to suit your application! You may select between existing profiles via the menu, but to edit them and make new ones, you'll need to access Storm24's web page. Read more about each of these ways to interact with Storm24 in the following sections of the manual.

## The LCD Menu

The LCD Menu is navigated through the four-panel buttons on the front of the Storm 24. The Menu button acts as the "Back" button, which takes you to the previous Menu/screen.

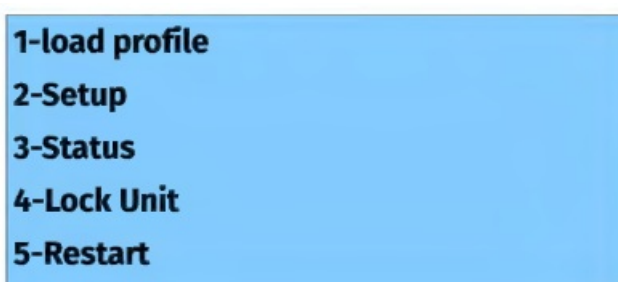
The Enter button goes into the selected option on the screen and activates the option. The Top & Bottom buttons are used to navigate/scroll through the options on any screen. The currently selected option is highlighted with a white background on the screen.



**Line3:** displays the amount of packets currently passing through the Storm. This number of packets per second can be used as an indicator of the activity of OMX on your network. Pressing any of the panel buttons/keys will activate the next screen on the LCD.


## The Selection Menu

While on the Selection Menu, you can select the option by pressing the Enter button, when that option is highlighted.




## Load Profile

Lists all available profiles on the Storm24, list can be scrolled using up & down keys. Scrolling indicator is visible when the list allows scrolling. Pressing Enter at the selected profile will activate the profile.

## Setup



1-Change IP  
2-Factory Reset

The setup screen allows changing the IP address of the unit via “Change IP” or doing Factory Reset.

### Change IP


This screen further gives two options DHCP or Static IP. When Static IP is selected, the screen allows you to change the IP address using the top and bottom button to scroll the digits and the menu & enter buttons to select the segment. Once you are on the last segment of the IP address, pressing the Enter button, will activate the IP address. It will take a few seconds for the change to go through, please wait 30 seconds, before attempting to try again.

### Factory Reset


Activating Factory Reset, leads to a simple prompt confirming your action. Once confirmed, the Factory Reset will take a few seconds to run. It will end up deleting all your profiles, as well as any saved settings. Please use this only when needed, or as directed by the ENTTEC support team.

## Status

- Status Screen, allows the following two options



1-System  
2-Network

Both the Status screens are read-only and provide information about the system and Networking. These require no user-input and serve as a way of checking the performance of Storm 24.

## Restart


The option to lock your device by disabling the web interface has been added to provide a level of security to your installation and is available on RevB models. By locking your device, the web server becomes inactive meaning that your configuration cannot be modified. To lock and unlock your device follow these simple steps on the devices LCD menu.

1. press enter on the units LCD menu
2. Navigate to option 4-Lock Unit and press Enter
3. Select Yes to lock or No to unlock.
4. Wait 10 seconds for this to take effect.
5. Done!

ENTTEC strongly recommend you secure your network using best practice methodologies with relevant precautions in place. Do not connect devices carrying DMX or ArtNet data to the outside world unless absolutely necessary and with relevant precautions in place.


**Note:** Factory resetting a device will not unlock the device. This must be done using the LCD menu.

- Restart Screen, when activated, prompts for the user to confirm the selection.

Once confirmed, Storm24 will stop all stop the engine and restart the system. While rebooting the LCD screen will change between a couple of screens, and the LCD Main Menu will be visible, once the system is fully ready.

## Web Interface

The Storm24 is configured, controlled and programmed through a web browser interface running on a computer system located on the same Local Area Network. Any modern web browser, such as Chrome, Firefox, Internet Explorer, Safari or Opera, running under any operating system, including Windows XP or Vista, Mac OS X, or Linux can be used. Throughout the Web Interface, helpful hints are displayed when a user hovers the mouse over the "Help" icon.





## Profiles

From this screen you can manage your profiles: As you will notice in the “Remarks” column, the factory default profiles are ‘Read -Only’. If you wish to modify one of them, you will first need to copy the profile and re-name it. Once the profile has been copied you can modify it to fit your needs.



## Profile Editor

Create a new profile or edit an existing one using the profile editor. This opens in a new page in your web browser. Select a module on the left and the right panel will provide help about that panel. Connect a module to another using wire from one point to another.
