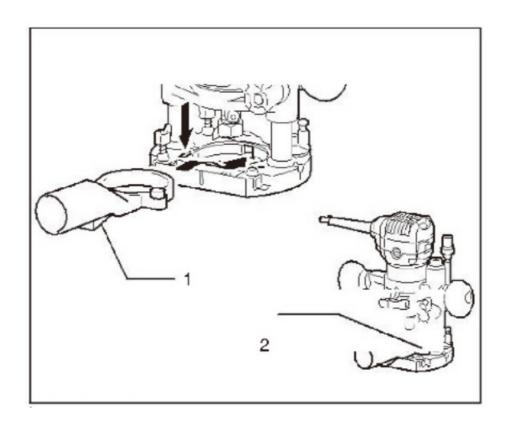

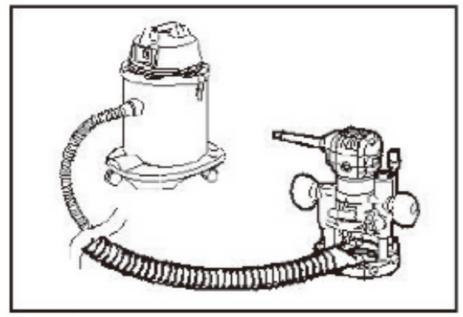
#### **MAINTENANCE**



- 1. Dust nozzle
- 2. Thumb screw 04l83

Use the dust nozzle for dust extraction Install the dust nozzle on the tool base using the thumb screw so that protrusion on the dust nozzle fit to the notch in the tool base.

Then connect a vacuum cleaner to the dust nozzle.

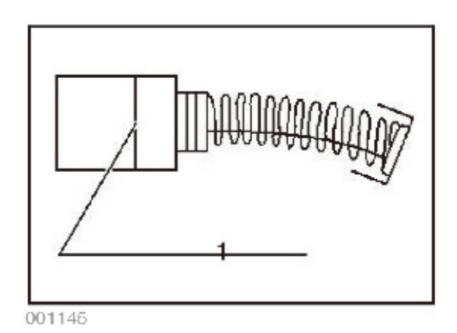

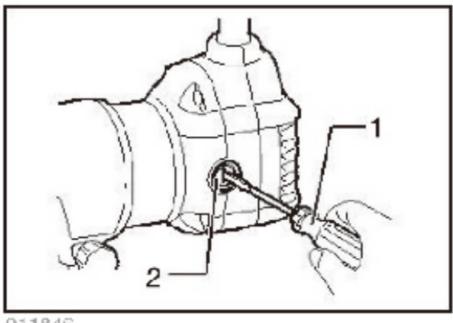
Always be sure that the tool is switched ott and unplugged betore attempting to perform inspection or maintenance.

Never use gasoline.. benzine. thinner alcohol or the like. Discoloration, deformation or cracks may result. Replacing carbon brushes



#### 1. Limit mark

Hemove and check the carbon brushes regularlye place when they wear down to the limit mark. Keep the carbon brushes clean and foe to slip in the holders. Both carbon brushes should be replaced at the same time. Use only identical carbon brushes.

#### **General Power Tool**

#### **Safety Warnings**

WARNING Read all safety warnings and all instructions. Failure to follow the warnings and instructions may result in electric shock, fire and/or senous Injury.

Save all warnings and instructions for future reference.

The term 'power tool' in the warnings refers to your mains-operated (corded) power tool or battery-operated (cordless) power tool.

#### Work area safety

- 1. Keep work area clean and well lit. Cluttered ot dark areas invite accidents.
- 2. Do not operate power tools in explosive atmospheres, such as in the presence of flammable liquids, gases or dust. Power tools create sparks which may ignite the dust or tames
- 3. Keep children and bystanders away while operating a power tool. Deist Jactations can cause you to lose control Electrical safety

- 4. Power tool plugs must match the outlet. Never modify the plug in any way. Do not use any adapter plugs with earthed (grounded) power tools. Unmodified plugs and matching outlets will reduce risk of electric shock.
- 5. Avoid body contact with earthed or grounded surfaces such as pipes, radiators, ranges and refrigerators. There is an increased risk of electric shoe + your boy is eathe or grounded
- 6. Do not expose power tools to rain or wet conditions. Water entering a power tool will increase the risk of electnic shock
- 7. Do not abuse the cord. Never use the cord for carrying., pulling or unplugging the power tool. Keep cord away from heat, oil, sharp edges or moving parts. Damaged or entangled cords increase the risk of electric shock
- 8. When operating a power tool outdoors, use an extension cord suitable for outdoor use. Use of a cord suitable for outdoor use reduces the risk of electric shock
- 9. If operating a power tool in a damp location is unavoidable, use a residual current device (RCD) protected supply. Use of an RCD reduces the risk of electric shock
- Use of power supply via a RCO with a rated residual current of 30mA or less is always recommended.
   Personal safety
- 11. Stay alert, watch what you are doing and use common sense when operating a power tool. Do not use a power tool while you are tired or under the influence of drugs, alcohol or medication. A moment of inattention while operating power tools may result in serious personal injury.
- 12. Use personal protective equipment. Always wear eye protection. Protective equipment such as dust mask, non-skid safety shoes hard hat, ot hearing protection used for appropriate conditions will reduce personal injuries.
- 13. Prevent unintentional starting. Ensure the switch is in the off-position before connecting to power source and/or battery pack, picking up or carrying the tool. Carrying power tools with your finger on the switch or energizing power tools that have the switch on invites accidents.
- 14. Remove any adjusting key or wrench before turning the power tool on. A wrench or a key left attached to a rotating part of the power tool may result in personal injury
- 15. Do not overreach. Keep proper footing and balance at all times. Ihis enables better control of the power tool in unexpected situations.
- 16. Dress properly. Do not wear loose clothing or jewellery. Keep your hair, clothing, and gloves away from moving parts. Loose clothes, jewellery or long hair can be caught in moving parts
- 17. If devices are provided for the connection of dust extraction and collection facilities, ensure these ate connected and properly used. Use of dust collection can reduce dust-related hazards

#### Power tool use and care

- 18. Do not force the power tool. Use the correct power tool for your application. The correct power tool will do the job better and safer at the rate for which it was designed.
- 19. Do not use the power tool if the switch does not turn it on and off. Any power tool that cannot be controlled with the switch is dangerous and must be repaired.
- 20. Disconnect the plug from the power source and/or the battery pack from the power tool before making any adjustments, changing accessories, or storing power tools. Such preventive safety measures reduce the risk of starting the power tool accidentally
- 21. Store idle power tools out of the reach of children and do not allow persons unfamiliar with the power tool or these instructions to operate the power tool. Power tools are dangerous in the hands of untrained users.
- 22. Maintain power tools. Check for misalignment or binding of moving parts, breakage of parts and any other condition that may affect the power tool's operation. If damaged, have the power loll repaired before use. Many

- accidents are caused by poorly maintained power tools.
- 23. Keep cutting tools sharp and clean. Properly maintained cutting tools with sharp cutting e0ges are less likely to bind and are easier to control.
- 24. Use the power tool, accessories and tool bits etc. in accordance with these instructions, taking into account the working conditions and the work to be performed. Use of the power tool for operations different torr those intended could result in a hazardous situation. Service
- 25. Have your power tool serviced by a qualified repair person using only identical replacement parts. This will ensure that the safety of the power tool is maintained.
- 26. Follow instruction for lubricating and changing accessories.
- 27. Keep handles dry, clean and free from oil and grease.

- 1. Hold power tool by insulated gripping surfaces, because the cutter may contact Its own cord. Cutting a we wire may rake exposed metal pars of the power tool live" an shock the operator
- 2. Use clamps or another practical way to secure and support the workpiece to a stable platform.+Holding the work by your hand or against the body leaves it unstable and may lead to loss of control.
- 3. Wear hearing protection during extended period of operation.
- 4. Handle the bits very carefully.
- 5. Check the bit carefully for cracks or damage before operation. Replace cracked or damaged bit immediately.
- 6. Avoid cutting nails. Inspect for and remove all nails from the workpiece before operation.
- 7. Hold the tool firmly.
- 8. Keep hands away from rotating parts.
- 9. Make sure the bit is not contacting the workpiece before the switch is turned on.
- 10. Before using the tool on an actual workpiece, let it run for a while. Watch for vibration or wobbling that could indicate improperly installed bit. If Be careful of the bit rotating direction and the feed direction.
- 11. Do not leave the lool running. Operate the tool only when hand-held.
- 12. Always switch off and wait for the bit to come to a complete stop before removing the tool from workpiece.
- 13. Do not touch the bit immediately after operation; it may be extremely hot and could burn your skin.
- 14. Do not smear the tool base carelessly with thinner, gasoline, oil or the like. They may cause cracks in the tool base.
- 15. Use bits of the correct shank diameter suitable for the speed of the tool.
- 16. Some material contains chemicals which may be toxic. Take caution to prevent dust inhalation and skin contact. Follow material supplier safety data.
- 17. Always use the correct dust mask/respirator for the material and application you are working with.

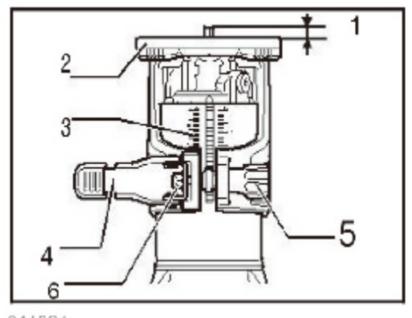

#### **Adjusting bit protrusion**



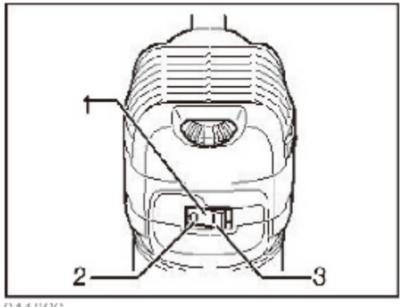

To adjust the bit protrusion, loosen the locking lever and move the tool base up or down as desired by turning the adjusting screw. After adjusting, tighten the locking lever firmly to secure the tool bas0

#### NOTE:

When the tool is not secured even if the locking lever is tightened, tighten the hex nut and then tighten the locking lever.

# **⚠** CAUTION:

Before plugging in the tool, always check to see that the tool is switched off.

To start the tool, press the ON (I) side of the switch

To stop the tool, press the OFF (O) side of the switch.

#### **Electronic function**

The tool equipped with electronic function are easy to operate because of the following tealures.

#### **Constant speed control**

Electronic speed control for obtaining constant speed.

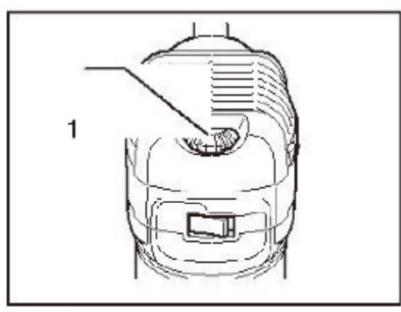
Possible to get fine finish, because the rotating speed is kept constant even under load condition.

#### Soft start

Soft-start feature minimizes start-up shock, and makes the tool start smoothly

#### Speed adjusting dial

The tool speed can be changed by turning the speed adjusting dial to a given number setting from 1 to 6. Higher speed is obtained when the dial is turned in the direction of number 6. And lower speed is obtained when it is turned in the direction of number 1. This allows the ideal speed to be selected for optimum material processing, ie. the speed can be correctly adjusted to suit the material and bit diameter. 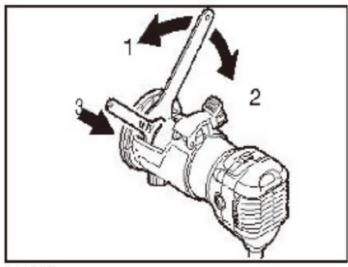
If the tool is operated continuous/y at low speeds for a long time, the motor will get overloaded, resulting in tool malfunction

The speed adjusting dial can be turned only as far as 6 and back to 1. Do not force it past 6 or 1, or the speed adjusting function may no longer work.

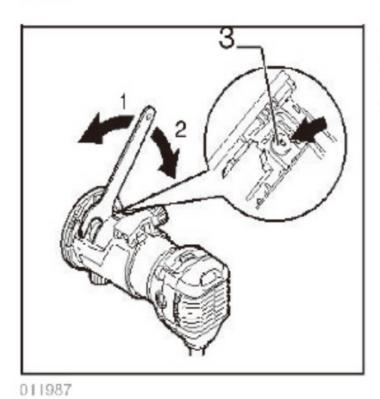

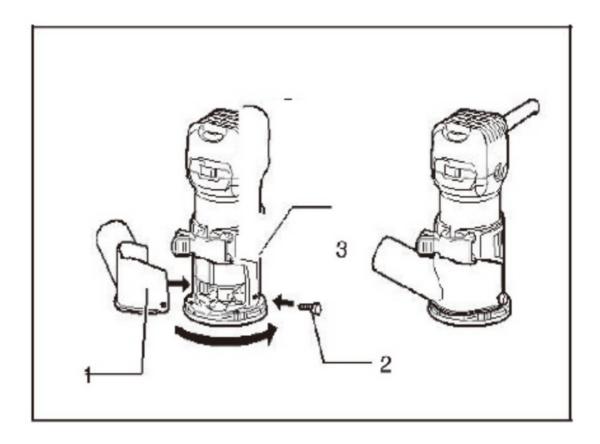
- Do not tighten the collet nut without inserting a bit or the collet cone will break.
- Use only the wrenches provided with the lool. Insert the bit all the way into the collet cone and tighten the collet nut securely with the two wrenches or by pressing the shaft lock and using the provided wrench.

To remove the bit, follow the installation procedure in reverse

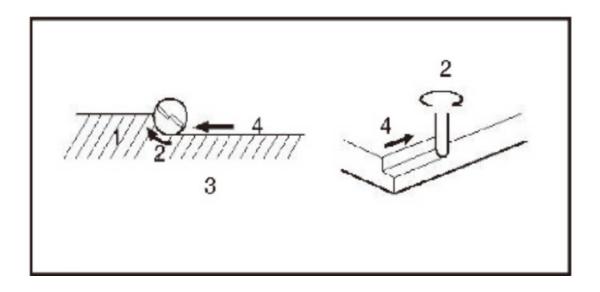

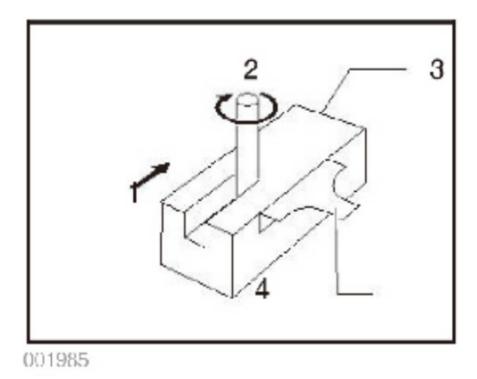
Before using the tool with the trimmer base, always install the dust nozzle on the trimmer base. Set the tool base on the workpiece to be cut without the bit making any contact. Then turn the tool on and wait until the bit attains full speed. Move the tool forward over the workpiece surface, Keeping the tool base flush and advancing smoothly until the cutting is complete When doing edge cutting, the workpiece surface should be on the left side of the bit in the feed direction

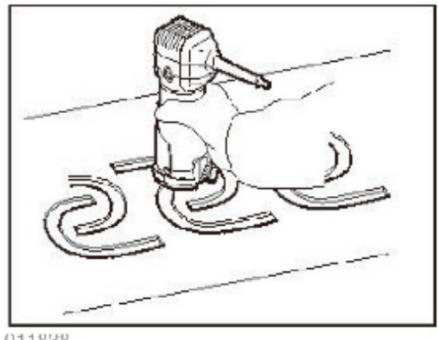
Moving the tool forward too fast may cause a poor quality of cut, or damage to the bit or motor Moving the tool forward too slowly may burn an mar the cut The proper toed rate wil depend on the bit size, the kirdct workpiece and depth of cut Betore beginning the cut on the actual workpiece, it is advisable to make a sample cut on a piece of scrap lumber This will stow exactly how the cut will look as well as enable you to check dimensions When using the trimmer shoe, the straight guide or the trimmer guide, be sure to keep it on the right side in the feed direction. This will help lo keep it flush with the side of the workpiece

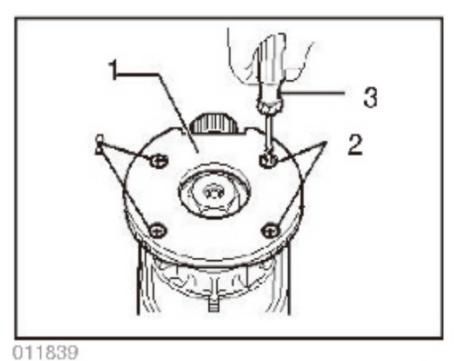

Since excessive cutting may cause overload of the motor or difficulty in controlling the tool, the depth of cut should not be more than 3 mm at a pass when cutting grooves When you wish to cu rooves more than 3 mm deep. make sever passes with progressively deeper bit settings Templet guide (optional accessory)



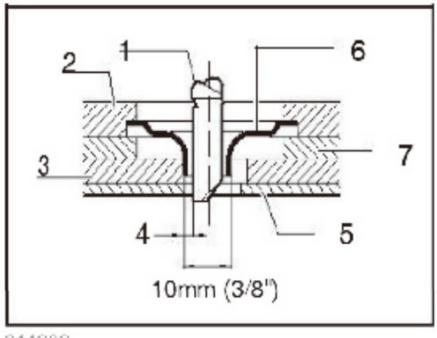

The lamplit guide provides a sleeve through which the bit passes, allowing use of the trimmer with templet patterns. Loosen the screws and remove the base protector Place the templet guide on the base and replace the base protector. Then secure the base protector by tightening thief screws.

Attach the straight guide with the clamp screw (A) Loosen the wing nut on the straight guide and adjust the distance between the bit and the straight guide. At the desired distance, lighten the wing nut securely.

When cutting. move the tool with the straight guide flush with the side of the workpiece. It the distance (A) between the side of the workpiece and the cutting position is too wide for the straight guide, or the side at the workpiece is not straight, the straight guide cannot be used In this case, firmly camp a straight board to the workpiece arc use t as a guide against the trimmer base Feed the tool in the directior of the arrow

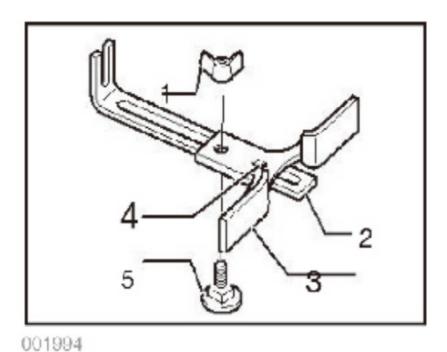

Circular work may be accomplished if you assemble the straight guide and guide plate as shown in the figures. Min. and max. radius of circles to be cut (distance between the center of circle and the center of bit) ate as follows:

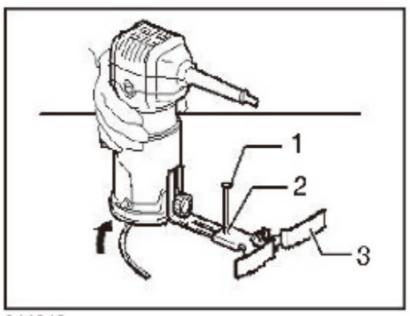
Min70 mm Max.: 221 mm For cutting circles between 70 mm and 121 mm in radius. For cutting circles between 121 mm and 221 mm in radius.

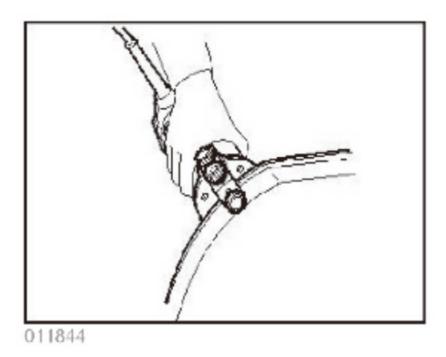

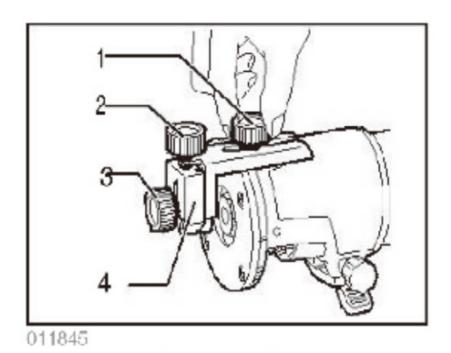

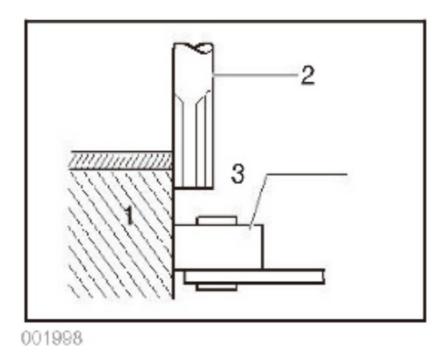


Trimming, curved cuts in veneers tor furniture and the like can be done easily with the trimmer guide. The guide roller rides the curve and assures a fine cut



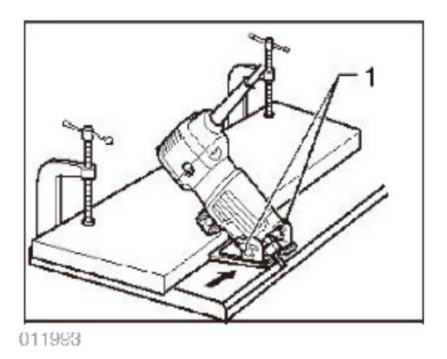

Install the trimmer guide on the tool base with the clamp screw (A). Loosen the clamp screw (B) and adjust the distance between the bit and the trimmer guide by turning the adjusting screw (1 mm per turn). All the desired distance, tighten the clamp screw (B) to secure the trimmer guide in place

When cutting, move the tool with the guide roller riding the side of the workpiece. Tilt base (optional accessory) fit base (optional accessory) is convenient tor chamfering.



#### 1. Clamping screws

lace the tool onto the tilt base and close the locking lever at the desired protrusion of the bit For desired angle.

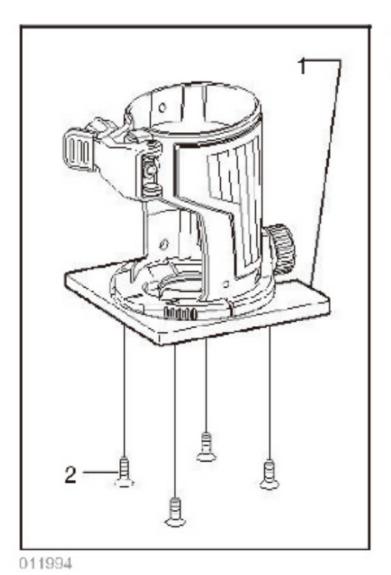
tighten the clamping screws on its sides.

Firmly clamp a straight board to the workpiece and use it as a guide against the tilt base. Feed the tool in the direction of the arrow.

Base protector removed from the tilt base (optional accessory)

Mounting the base protector which has been removed from the tilt base on the trimmer base allows the change of the trimmer base from the round base to a square base.

For another application, remove the base protector from the tilt base by loosening and removing four screws



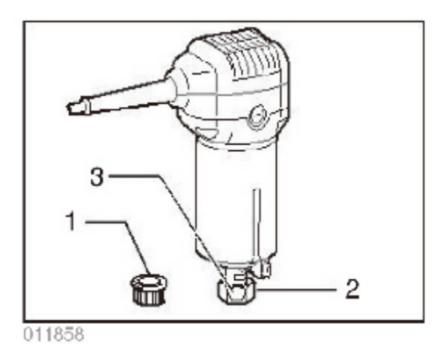

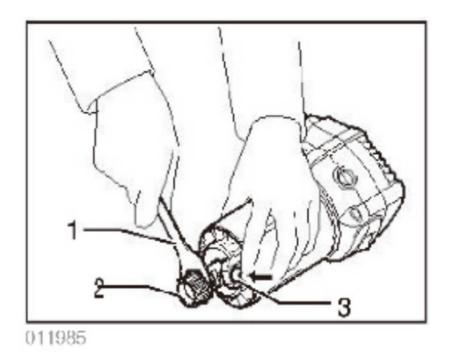


(1) Orfset base {optional accessory) is convenient for work in a tight area such as a corner



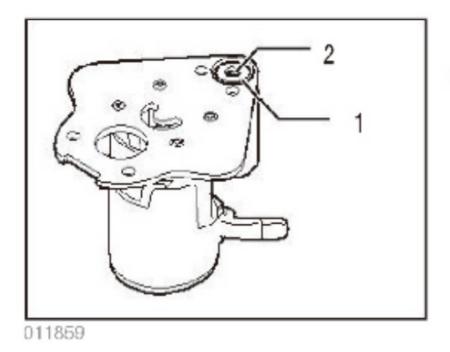

Put an end of tho bolt over tho pulley using a screwdriver and make sure that its entire belt width fits over the pulley completely.



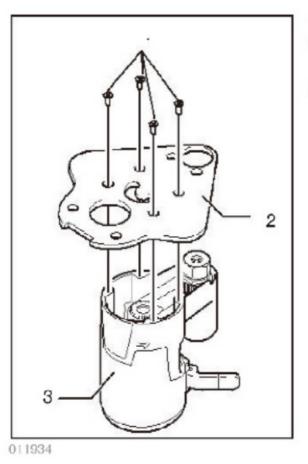

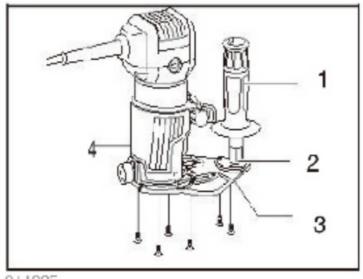

Insert the hex wrench into the hole in the offset base With the hex wrench held in that position, insert the bit into the collet cone on the shaft of the offset base from the opposite side and tighten the collet nut firmly wilh a wrench lo remove the bit at replacement, follow the installation procedure in reverse (2) Offset base (optional accessory) can also be used with a trimmer base and a grip attachment (optional accessory) for more stability.

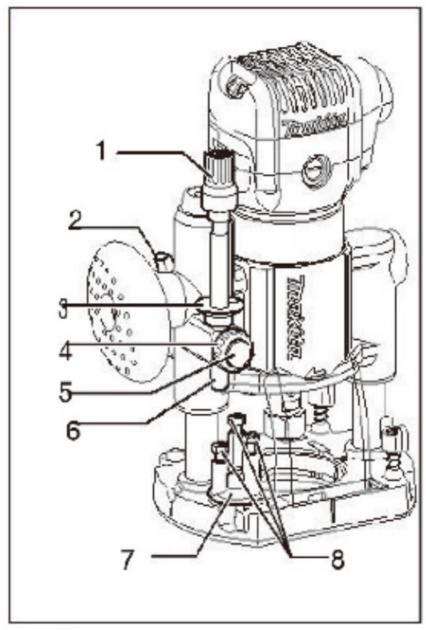

Place the tool on a flat surface. Loosen the lock lever and lower the tool body until the bit just touches the flat surface. Tighten the lock lever to lock the tool body. Turn the stopper pole setting nut counterclockwise Lower the stopper pole until it makes contact with the adjusting bolt. Align the depth pointer with the 0' graduation. The depth of cut is indicated on the scale by the depth pointer. While pressing the fast-teed button, raise the stopper pole until the desired depth of cut is obtained Minute depth adjustments can be obtained by turning the adjusting knob (1 mm per turn). truing the stopper pole setting nit dowse, you can « fasten the stopper pole firmly.

Now, your predetermined depth of cut can be obtained by loosening the lock lever and then lowering the tool body until the stopper pole makes contact with the adjusting hex bolt of the stopper block.

Always firm/y hold the tool by both grip during operation Set the tool base on the workpiece to be cut without the bit ma.ng any contact Then turn the tool on and wait until the bit attains full speed Lower the tool body and move the tool

forward over the workpiece surface, keeping the tool base flush and advancing smoothly until the cutting is complete When doing edge cutting, the workpiece surface should be on the left side of the bit in the feed direction

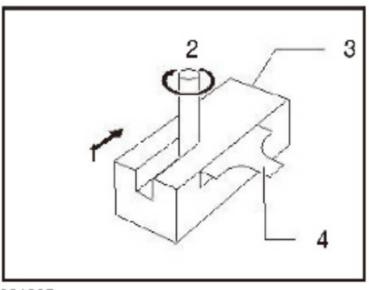

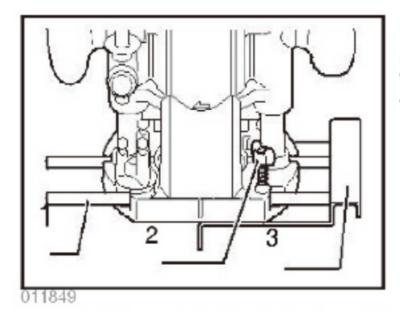

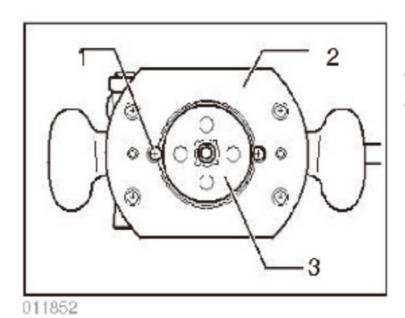

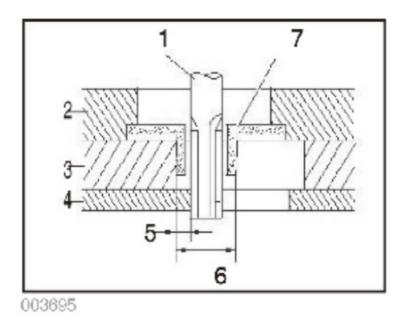
